Dear Ms. Hendrickson:

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration have completed its review of the Indiana Department of Transportation's (INDOT's) FY 2016-2019 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) and the respective 14 Metropolitan Planning Organizations' (MPOs') Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) that we received June 5, 2015 and was supplemented on July 1, 2015. We hereby give our approval.

We would like to recognize INDOT for its significant efforts to resolve the corrective action that was issued with our approval of the previous FY 2014-2017 STIP regarding the roles and responsibilities within the planning process and to update the planning agreements. Your staff and the Indiana MPOs collaborated to produce the Planning Roles, Responsibilities and Cooperative Operation Manual (PRRCOM) which identifies the planning contacts within INDOT and specifies the responsibilities for specific state and MPO planning functions, as well as, establishes processes for various core planning documents. The PRRCOM was finalized last September 2014 and has been used to guide the development of the FY 2016 planning products, such as Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) and the Unified Planning Work Programs (UPWPs) and Statement of Works (SOWs).

New planning agreements between INDOT, the MPOs and the Transit Operators have been established. As noted by you, there is one exception for the Northwestern Indiana Regional Planning Commission, as their structure has been dictated by state statute. We plan to address this issue in Northwestern Indiana Regional Planning Commission's future certification review.

We are pleased these planning issues have been conducted in a cooperative spirit and we consider the issues related to be addressed. In addition, we recognize INDOT's desire to take the lead on the planning reviews with the MPOs under the 200,000 population. We strongly believe this oversight action will help to serve as the basis for INDOT's endorsement of the selfcertification of the metropolitan planning process.

Regarding the FY 2016-2019 STIP, INDOT continues to utilize the Public Private Partnership (P3) mechanism to fund four major projects, the Ohio River Bridges, I-69 Section 5, I-69 Section 6, and the Illiana. The STIP is consistent with the most recent available finance plans. As

finance plan documents are updated in the coming months, we appreciate that INDOT has committed to updating the STIP to be consistent with the updated finance plans.

In order to maximize safety on Indiana's highways and roads, INDOT is strongly encouraged to improve its obligation rates for the use of Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP). We encourage INDOT to communicate guidance and options to MPOs and local agencies resulting in obligating effective safety projects. Eligible projects can include: backplates with retroreflective borders on signals, pedestrian countdown heads (especially in downtown high-pedestrian areas); pedestrian crosswalk warning signs and flashing beacons and special pavement markings and refuge areas; yellow signal timing and interconnect for safety projects; one signal head per travel lane; guardrail at new locations; and/or the upgrade of pre-NCHRP-350 (National Cooperative Highway Research Report 350) guardrail end terminals. MPOs are encourage to program up to 15% of their allotted HSIP funds for planning purposes for activities like Road Safety Audits. These HSIP planning activities must be identified in the MPOs' UPWPs/SOWs, as well as included in the MPOs' TIPs and the STIP. (The MPOs may use Planning funds (PL) to conduct safety studies as well).

INDOT, through the Asset Management process, has identified safety projects, most of which are eligible for HSIP. It is expected that these projects will be programmed and built as identified in order to create a safer state highway system and assist Indiana in achieving their safety goals.

We anticipate final rules implementing performance measures stipulated in *Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century* (MAP-21) legislation to be issued the coming months. MAP-21 identifies seven national goals for Safety, Infrastructure Conditions, Congestion Reduction, System Reliability, Freight Movement and Economic Vitality, Environmental Sustainability and Reducing Project Delivery Delays. INDOT and the MPOs will work to cooperatively set performance measures and targets in the planning process.

FHWA and FTA have determined the TIPs are based on a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive planning process by INDOT and the 14 MPOs, and the transit operators in accordance to 23 CFR 450. The TIPs for the Northwestern Indiana Regional Planning Commission, the Evansville Metropolitan Planning Organization, and the Indianapolis Metropolitan Planning Organization are subject to the provisions of the Transportation Conformity Rule (40 CFR Parts 51 and 93) have been found to conform. We have attached our approval letters in the enclosure. In addition this planning finding is based upon the extent that all the projects in the FY 2016-2019 STIP are the result of planning processes in accordance with provisions in the U.S.C. 23 and U.S.C. 49. Further analysis and areas for attention are identified in the enclosure.

We look forward to working with you on implementing the FY 2016-2019 STIP. Air quality conformity is acceptable, and funding targets used for financial constraint were reviewed and accepted, as well. Public involvement opportunities include both traditional "open meeting" format at several locations around the State and the opportunity to comment electronically, via INDOT's web-site.

AREAS OF COMMENDATION:

INDOT and the MPOs are to be commended to for getting on the TIPs and the STIP to be on the same cycle, FY 2016-2019. FHWA and FTA has been emphasizing this goal and welcome this accomplishment. One exception is the Kentuckiana Regional Planning and Development Agency's TIP is on Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's cycle and the FHWA Kentucky Division and FTA Region 4 have the lead with this MPO.

FHWA and FTA are pleased the corrective actions for the planning issues have been addressed in a cooperative spirit by INDOT and the MPOs. We are lifting the corrective action issued with the prior STIPs. In addition, we are pleased with INDOT's desire to take the lead on the planning reviews with the MPOs under the 200,000 population. We strongly believe this action will serve as the basis for INDOT's self-certification of the planning process. FHWA and FTA will continue to lead the certification reviews for MPOs greater than 200,000 population as required by 23 CFR 450.334.

We commend INDOT for including an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) summary. INDOT formed an ADA Community Advisory Working Group which has been hosting meetings around the State of Indiana since 2013. It has been successful in gathering comments from persons with disabilities and providing input to INDOT's self-evaluation of ADA compliance and it's Transition Plan. We appreciate INDOT's efforts to develop projects that improve access to public services for everyone. INDOT has submitted its draft ADA Transition Plan at this time which is under review.

AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT:

For several years, we have monitored the percentage of projects advanced to construction as originally published in the STIP. This metric illustrates how well the STIP delivers projects to construction. This measure has declined in the past two years and we encourage INDOT and the MPOs to improve on it in the future. We recognize the efforts through PRRCOM may improve this metric in the future.

Also mentioned in our Draft STIP submittal letter, regarding the corrective action that was issued with the approval of the FY 2014-2017 STIP, we believe all issues and concerns have been addressed.

The new, INDOT Planning Roles, Responsibilities & Cooperative Operation Manual (PRRCOM) were adopted on October 10, 2014 by Chris Kiefer, INDOT Chief of Staff. The purpose of the PRRCOM is to summarize the planning requirements and describe how INDOT coordinates with the 14 Indiana Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) and the 13 Indiana Rural Planning Organizations (RPOs) to implement the 3-C (continuing, cooperative and comprehensive) planning process and to carry out the MAP-21 planning requirements. A PDF file of this document is submitted along with this letter.

New State/MPO/Transit Planning Agreements have been updated by nearly all the MPOs to include INDOT as a voting member on their Policy Boards. One exception is NIRPC MPO. They are governed by enabling legislation IC 36-7-7.6 which only permits elected officials to serve as voting members on NIRPC's board. INDOT is however represented on the NIRPC board by Representative Soliday who was appointed by the Governor to vote on INDOT's behalf. A PDF with the signed documents is submitted to you along with this letter
