Data request:

Tammy Nelson, MPH, CHP Epidemiology Manager, Overdose Data to Action Grant Coordinator, Health & Hospital Corp., Marion Co Health Dept appeared on behalf of this request.

Since 2010 Indiana has almost doubled in overdose deaths. One (1) in five (5) is an opioid overdose.

The following changes were made after the Board expressed their concerns at the August meeting:

- No information that could identify a patient, prescriber or pharmacy will be provided to MCPHD
- Record linkage for the person-level study will be conducted by Indiana's Management Performance Hub and all records will be de-identified prior to transfer to MCPHD
- The only prescriber/pharmacy information to be provided to MCPHD is profession (ex: MD, DDS) specialty and census tract.
 - MCPHD will target interventions (academic detailing and opioid action kits) to census tracts containing providers who prescribe at a significant higher MME than other providers in their same profession and specialty.
- Because only census tracts will be identified, all prescribers in identified census tracts will be provided with intervention activities.
- A census tact is defined as: Small, relatively permanent statistical subdivisions of a County with a population size between 1,200 and 8,000 people (optimum size of 4,000) depending on population density.

The following information was presented to the Board at their July 2020 meeting:

Accredo (Express Scripts) currently has a variance of 856 IAC 1-36-7 that ends in July 6, 2020 that allows technicians to work from home.

They are requesting a new variance of 846 IAC 1-35-1 for remote pharmacy technician supervision. The pharmacist is responsible for the work performed by the pharmacy technician under the pharmacist supervision, either through direct supervision or through a secured technologic means approved by the Board.

They have had a very successful three (3) years of technicians working from home. They have not had any concerns with technicians working from home. They have less distractions and lower absenteeism.

They currently have 130 Pharmacists and 150 Technicians working from home.

Variance requests must be on the Board's agenda three times before the Board can vote on the issue. This will be the third time this variance request has been presented to the Board.
