FINAL ORDER

1. C [REDACTED] E [REDACTED] ("Petitioner") requested administrative review of the Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles' ("BMV") decision to deny his request to reactivate his old driver's license number because Petitioner claimed it should not have been cancelled.
2. The matter was referred to Administrative Law Judge Elizabeth Gamboa ("ALJ") for review under Indiana Code § 4-21.5-3-7(a). A telephonic hearing was scheduled to be held on January 4, 2022, at 11:00 am. The conference line was open for fifteen (15) minutes; however, Petitioner did not join the call.
3. On January 6, 2022, the ALJ issued a Proposed Order of Dismissal because the Petitioner did not join in on the telephone hearing.
4. On January 14, 2022, the ALJ entered a Final Order of Dismissal, after Petitioner did not respond the Proposed Order of Dismissal for seven days.
5. On January 31, 2022, Petitioner submitted a Request for Reconsideration of the ALJ's final Order. Petitioner stated in their request that due to a coronavirus breakout at his home, he was sick and confused. Petitioner stated that he thought that the date of the hearing was January 14, 2022.
6. Pursuant to I.C. 4-21.5-3-29(b), I hereby AFFRIM the ALJ's January 14, 2022, Final Order of Dismissal.
7. Petitioner is hereby notified that this is a Final Order. Petitioner may seek judicial review of this Final Order pursuant to I.C. 4-21.5-5.
