- (Youth completes and submits Youth Report to the Court if unable to attend)
- · Document efforts to reach Permanency

Age,

- · Hold CFTM to finalize plans to transition out of care
- · Assist in completion of VSA
- Contact MEU to ensure continuation of medicaid coverage
- Continue CFTM every 6 months if case remains open
- · Youth can officially enter collaborative care and CC placements
- Youth receives the Indiana Bill of Rights for Youth in Foster Care
