I came to know Doug through his work with the Indiana Chapter of Association of Air Medical Services (INAAMS). It is no doubt that countless lives have been saved and countless lives have been made better inside the ambulance/aircraft due to his skill and dedication. The same can be said for outside of the aircraft, not only at Lutheran, but at other programs within Indiana and beyond, due to his commitment to safety and his outstanding work with the INAAMS group. I will share Doug's story of his EMS career, and his retirement, as told by Doug himself...

Over the years I have worked with so many outstanding individuals that were not only my co-workers but my friends and family. One of the most important things that I have learned is that It takes a village, otherwise known as the entire team, to be successful in this job. I have been so blessed to have such great team members. Everyone always did their absolute best to help save every patient we treated. Dispatchers, Police, Fire, First Responders, wrecker crews, and lay people all going out at all hours of the day or night, no matter the type of weather, to help someone they did not know but were in trouble and needed help.

So many people have helped me over the years with training and education that I cannot thank enough. Rex, Kim, Mike, Jim to name a few of our First Pilots who started this program taught me valuable lessons in safety and Air Medical Transport. I hope I was able to pass that information along. Sharing knowledge and learning from others is the key to this business. In doing so, work colleagues will become work friends. I can affirm to that fact as LuAnn started out as my partner at work and later became my partner, "wife," for life.

May 31, 2020 will be my last day as a Flight Paramedic. It only seems fitting to end my wonderful medical career in the same month as I started.

It will be exceedingly difficult to walk away from this way of life and saying goodbye to all my work friends. Only health care workers can understand the relationships that are created as we stand next to each other taking care of extremely sick

patients.

I am looking forward to my new way of life. I am most looking forward to family holidays, birthdays, special events, and getting to eat meals at regular times. I also plan to spend my time golfing, shooting sports, traveling, and taking vacations. I will be ecstatic to be able to drink my morning coffee outside instead of on my way to work. Instead of wondering what the weather will be like for flying, I will only question, "Will the rain interfere with my pool time?"

May 31, 2020, I retire and will pass the torch on to those behind me. Lutheran Air has been my love and my home. Stay vigilant, keep learning, and stay above the bar because Lutheran Air is a great program and family to work with. This is not just a job. Love what you do, and you will never work another day.

INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

Ms. Katie Hokanson reported that the decision was made to move the Medical Director's conference will be a virtual platform this year instead of in person. Ms. Hokanson reported that at the end of May Methodist Northlake in Gary voluntarily decided not to continue being a trauma center, so it is no longer a level III trauma center. Also Terra Haute Regional will be dropping from a level II to a level III trauma center as of August 1st. There will be letters sent to all of the EMS providers to let them know about the change. Commissioner Bowman asked if we had a reason why they downgraded. Ms. Hokanson stated that it was based on the cost.

EMS FOR CHILDREN

Ms. Margo Knepfelkamp stated that they are still working on the PECC training. The data clean up from the survey is under way. They are still working on the Hands Heavy conference more details to come. Ms. Knepfelkamp also stated that the progress report is underway.

INDIANA FIRE CHIEF'S ASSOCIATION

Mr. Doug Randall reported that the IERC conference has been postponed. They have secured the same keynote speakers for next year. Mr. Randall also announced the Indiana Fire Chief's Association is in support of the mechanical CPR devices for the EMR level.

EMS EDUCATION WORKING GROUP

COVID -19 BRIEFING

Dr. Michael Kaufmann discussed the IDHS COVID-19 manual. He encourages people to download it for a resource. Data is being collected. They are looking at an easier way to report it as a Covid case. They are working on a county by county dashboard. Dr. Kaufmann thanked everyone for their work and for reporting their data. EMS data is a key factor in tracking COVID. Dr. Kaufmann encourages everyone to continue to follow CDC guidelines regarding PPE.

STAFF REPORTS

- a. Data Registry – Ms. Robin Stump reported that we are at 95% reporting. Ms. Stump also reported that there is now a worksheet in Imagetrend for BLS non-transport services.

STATE EMS DIRECTORS REPORT –

Director Kinney talked briefly about the goals he has set for staff and himself. One of the goals he has set for himself is to develop LMS training for people in new official roles. Tony will be out auditing one class per month as well as being more active in Training Institution audits. Field staff will be out in the field more. Direct Kinney reminded everyone that IERC has been cancelled. He also reported that he is working on a grant that will help build LMS content that will be available through Acadis. Anyone that has suggestions for the LMS content or has a training they would like to donate please let us know. We have been given a sub-grant for \$100,000 he is working on finalizing the plan and budget for the sub-grant. Director Kinney discussed the change of BLS non transporting agencies reporting directly into ImageTrend to the worksheet for documenting runs in ImageTrend. There will be an Acadis outage on Sunday July 12 from 8am – 12 noon.

STATE MEDICAL DIRECTORS REPORT - Dr. Michael Kaufmann briefly talked about house bill 1209. Dr. Kaufmann talked about the white paper for an interfacility system that he and some of his colleagues are working on. Dr. Kaufmann reported the IHI continues to move forward.


CHAIRMAN'S REPORT AND DIRECTION- Chairman Turpen announced that several conferences have been cancelled. The EAGLES conference is currently scheduled for January in Huston Texas. EAGLES is a very good evidence-based medicine conference. Now is the time to examine your own systems and response protocols and how they work with all the changes that have been made recently. Please be sure to check on your people not just physically but on their metal well-being.

July 2020 EMS Training Report

NREMT pass rates are enclosed in this report. These statistics are for courses ending between June 20, 2019 and June 20, 2020. Paramedic pass rates are for two years since most course last between 18 and 24 months. The EMT courses are broken down into three separate categories. The top category represents those training institutions whose graduates' average at least 70% after the first attempt which is the standard set by the Commission: 21 programs. The programs in the next category (60% - 70%) are near meeting the standard set by the Commission: 14 programs. Those in the bottom category are below standard: 38 programs.

Our numbers of individuals testing has decreased greatly, but those numbers are expected to pick up since the number of practical examinations are up substantially for the month of July. Many programs had elected not to continue training, but others still completed training new EMS personnel. The NREMT has continued to offer the cognitive examination at all levels although Pearson Vue testing availability continues to be limited. The NREMT developed a program where individuals can take the EMT and AEMT examinations online.
