#### 4. Update on Legislative changes

- a. Alyssa Schroeder gave a thorough overview of legislative changes (most coming because of passage of HB 1492) to include:
  - i. Transfer of \$400,000 from the Criminal Justice Institute Safe Havens Program to the Secured School Safety Grant
  - ii. Approval of \$25 million being allocated over the next two years for the Secured School Safety Grant.
  - iii. Changing of language from threat assessment to site vulnerability assessment
  - iv. Secured School Safety Grant additional eligible items.
  - v. Additional reporting requirements relative to School Resource Officers
  - vi. Requires charter schools to have a School Safety Specialist, school safety plan and safe school committee by July 1, 2024
  - vii. Requires all counties to have a Safe Schools Commission by December 31, 2023
  - viii. HB 1177 defines the firearms training requirements for school personnel whose training is funded through the Secured School Safety Grant
  
- b. Members asked follow up questions to include:
  - i. Stephen Balko asked if schools must submit a separate application for the firearms training. Response: They do not but have the opportunity to do so
  - ii. Devon McDonald asked if IDHS or the Secured School Safety Board are required to review the firearms training curriculum. Response: No, but the school does have to attest in their application that the training meets the requirements
  - iii. Philip Gordon asked if we knew how many schools might apply for the firearms training. Response: Not sure but currently not many schools allow staff to carry firearms on school property.
  - iv. Stephen Balko asked if SB 369 allows for AEDs to be paid for out of the Secured School Safety Grant. Response: Yes, AEDs are an allowable item.
  
- c. Rusty Goodpaster informed the Board of some additional eligible items that were added to the Advance from the Common School Fund to include:
  - i. Helping teachers, school staff and school employees acquire specialized firearms instruction.
  - ii. Defraying the cost of related expenses for school personnel who wish to enroll in the course of firearms training described in IC 10-21-3
  - iii. Provide funding in the event of a school shooting to cover the costs of counseling for students, teachers, school staff and school employees.

#### 5. Secured School Safety Grant timeline:

Kim Snyder reported applications may not open until July due to the application updates needed. This could cause delays in the rest of the Grant timeline as well.

#### 6. Final Comments/Closing Remarks – Chairman Thacker thanked everyone for their time and attention.

#### 7. Adjournment – Chairman Thacker adjourned the meeting at 10:18 a.m.
