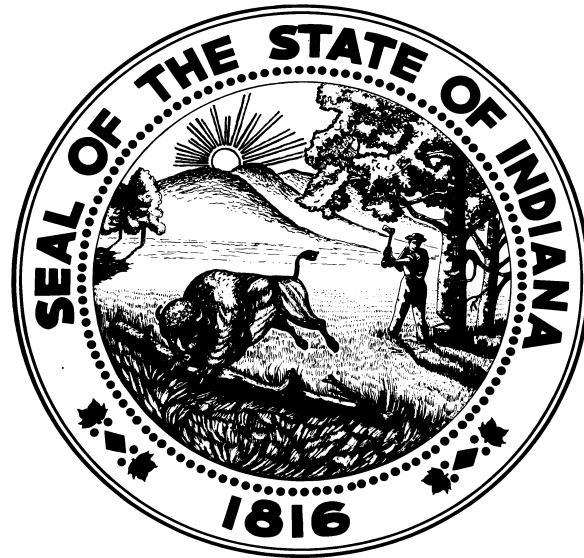

Subject: Report on Expenditures Per Capita

The attached Report on Expenditures Per Capita (“Report”) is filed in accordance with IC 6-1.1-33.5-7. The Report, prepared by the Data Analysis Division of the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance (“Department”), presents a compilation of each local government’s expenditures per capita based on 2020 and 2021 data provided by each local government’s annual financial report. Data were compiled according to the type of local government: counties, townships, cities/towns, school corporations, libraries, special districts, conservancy districts, and soil and water conservation districts.

Indiana Code calls for a report that includes each local government’s total amount of expenditures per capita based on the most recent federal decennial census for which comprehensive data has been reported. The Indiana State Board of Accounts provided expenditure information for all non-school local governments, while the Indiana Department of Education provided expenditure information for schools. The Department has determined the highest, lowest, median, and average expenditures per capita for each local government.

Overview of the Report on Expenditures Per Capita

This Report on Expenditures Per Capita (“Report”) provides an annual compilation of the total expenditures per capita of each local government defined as a political subdivision under IC 6-1.1-1-12 and IC 36-1-2-13. Expenditure information reported here reflects calendar year expenditures for each local government as reported by the local government. The expenditures are the actual disbursements made by the local government and may be different from both the tax revenue received and the total budget appropriations authorized. A local government’s per capita expenditure is the sum of all its expenditures for a given year net of transfers, interfund loans, agency fund disbursements, and purchases of investments, as identifiable in the Annual Financial Report, divided by the local government’s population.

Each non-school local government is required to file an Annual Financial Report with the Indiana State Board of Accounts (“SBOA”). Except for data on school expenditures, all expenditure data are drawn from the 2020 and 2021 Annual Financial Reports filed by each local government with the SBOA. The Indiana Department of Education (“DOE”) provided all school expenditure information. The school expenditure information does not reflect data from any school corporations that did not submit their report in neither 2020 nor 2021.

Annual Financial Reports for 2021 are required by law to be submitted not later than March 1, 2022, for all units other than school districts. As of March 22, 2022, not all local governments had filed their 2021 Annual Financial Reports. The notation “Data Not Provided” in the 2021 expenditure per capita column indicates that the local government has not yet reported its data for 2021. The percentage of local governments that reported expenditure data for 2021 as of March 22, 2022 is as follows:

- Counties (98.9%)
- Townships (98.1%)
- Cities/Towns (95.1%)
- School data submitted to DOE (99.0%)
- Libraries (100%)
- Special Districts (Solid Waste) (86.1%)
- Special Districts (Other than Solid Waste) (85.5%)
- Conservancy Districts (89.4%)
- Soil and Water Conservation Districts (96.7%)

As a comparison, the 2020 per capita expenditure data reflected in the April 23, 2021 published report is supplied in this Report.

Reading the Report

Expenditure data in the Report are organized by local government type. Besides counties, all local governments are further categorized according to the county in which they provide service. Some local governments may provide services in more than one county; these local governments are listed once under the county that is considered as the “major county” for that particular unit of local government. Per the definition established by SBOA for annual financial reporting, a “major county” is the county where the unit’s main office is located.

For most local governments, expenditure data are reported per capita. If available, the population of the service area, not just the major county, was used to calculate the per capita expenditure amount. As census data are not available for some Special Districts, the local government’s total expenditure is reported instead. For 2021 expenditure levels, each unit is ranked from highest to lowest and the unit’s rank is listed next to the per capita data.

Several descriptive statistics are presented for each local government type:

- The Average is the total expenditure per capita for each local government type divided by the number of local governments.
- The Median is the middle expenditure per capita for each government type after the numbers have been numerically ordered.
- The Lowest is the smallest local government expenditure per capita for each local government type.
- The Highest is the greatest local government expenditure per capita for each local government type.
- The Units Reporting is the total number of units with Annual Financial Report submissions to the State Board of Accounts.

For government types for which population data are not available, these statistics are displayed, but are based on total expenditures for each local government rather than expenditures per capita.

Report Methodology

Expenditure data for 2021, for all units except schools, were drawn from a database within the Gateway for Local Governments. This database included fund-level disbursements for each local government as well as detailed classification of expenditures by type. These expenditures have not been audited. Updates made after March 22, 2022, are not included in the Report. Live updates of the data are available under the Annual Financial Report option at https://gateway.ifionline.org/report_builder.

The Department subtracts certain disbursements to estimate a net expenditure. To calculate net expenditures, certain disbursement types were removed as they are not expenditures.

The Department worked with the SBOA to achieve an accurate calculation of net expenditures. For the calculations, distributions for the following distribution codes were subtracted:

D701	Payments To or On Behalf of Beneficiaries
D702	Payment of Taxes and Other Payroll Withholdings
D703	Distributions to Other Governmental Entities
D704	Transfers Out
D705	Loaned to Another Fund
D706	Interfund Loan Repayments
D900	Purchase of Investments

Expenditure and Average Daily Membership (“ADM”) data for schools were provided by the DOE in a spreadsheet listing each school corporation’s total expenditures, net of interfund loans, transfers, and purchases of investments, for calendar years 2020 and 2021. School expenditure data is current as of April 8, 2022. Data is excluded for schools that had not submitted 2021 figures.

All census data – *except for data pertaining to library districts* - were drawn from the 2020 United States Census with the assistance of the Indiana Business Research Center (IBRC). The IBRC is currently working with the Indiana State Library on compiling 2020 United States Census counts broken down by the individual library districts in Indiana; however, at the time this report was published, the 2020 data were not yet available. Therefore, the census data for library districts are representative of data from the 2010 decennial census instead.

Counties

County government in Indiana is responsible for performing many duties, including law enforcement (which includes sheriff and jail services), elections, civil and criminal courts, and health services. Officials in county government also administer the property tax system. Services provided by counties generally do not differ across the state; therefore, disparities in spending levels may be caused by differing levels of current capital investment and differing levels of efficiency.

Indiana has 92 counties. Based on the 2020 Census, the counties range in population from 5,940 (Ohio County) to 977,203 (Marion County).

Townships

Township government in Indiana provides monetary and in-kind assistance to citizens in need (“township assistance”) as well as fire protection and the performance of other duties for areas without other forms of municipal government.

There are currently 1,004 townships in Indiana, with populations ranging from 52 to 156,686. This wide variation in population, along with other demographic factors, results in townships offering varying combinations and levels of services. For example, smaller rural townships often rely on volunteer fire departments, while more urban townships may provide a full-time fire department or contract with a municipal fire department. Township assistance will vary in regard to economic conditions and differing local standards for qualification.

The advent of fire protection districts and territories has allowed many townships, cities, and towns to work together to provide this service. The complexity of funding these districts makes it difficult to compare township expenditures purely on a per capita basis. A township may have lower expenditures than average because its expenditures on fire protection are reported by the consolidated fire protection district or territory. Conversely, a township that purchases a capital asset such as a fire truck may have higher expenditures than average, even though the fire truck is used to provide service throughout the fire protection territory. Townships may also contribute to funding services such as Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and parks that are utilized by taxpayers both inside and outside township boundaries.

Cities and Towns

Cities and towns in Indiana provide police, fire protection, and developmental planning. There are currently 567 cities and towns in Indiana, excluding Indianapolis, which is considered to be a special district due to its consolidated structure. Population counts for Indiana cities and towns range from 12 (New Amsterdam Civil Town) to 263,886 (Fort Wayne Civil City).

Many factors, including efficiency of operations, may impact expenditure levels for cities and towns. Firstly, numerous cities and towns receive large amounts of revenue from specialized sources that may allow for greater expenditures. Secondly, as with townships, cities and towns may be in fire protection districts or territories, further increasing the complexity of comparing expenditures to level of service.

In addition, some cities and towns provide enterprise services, such as electrical, water, sewer, and solid waste removal. Cities and towns that provide these services may have greater per capita expenditures than cities and towns that do not. To facilitate review, expenditures for cities and towns are broken out by total non-enterprise net expenditures and total net expenditures, which is the sum of non-enterprise and enterprise expenditures.

The table immediately below shows the 2020 and 2021 summary statistics for total expenditures for the cities and towns. The comprehensive list of reporting municipal units and their respective values can be found on the following pages. For further detail on any unit shown below, please refer to the annual financial report submitted by that unit for the applicable year (i.e., 2020 or 2021).

City and town expenditures are grouped by county. Each city or town is listed only once. Cities or towns that serve populations in more than one county are listed under the “major county” for that particular city or town. Cities/Towns identified with the highest and lowest expenditures in the following table are based on total expenditures per capita.

Schools

School corporations in Indiana provide primary and secondary education to students. There are 291 school corporations in Indiana that report to the Department, with populations ranging from 1,325 (Medora Community School Corporation) to 319,011 (Indianapolis Public School Corporation). Many school corporations provide transportation to and from school facilities and finance school buildings in addition to the core responsibility of education.

In addition to variations in efficiency, differences in school corporation expenditures are likely related to differences in spending on capital projects (such as buildings), transportation, and school programs (such as special needs education). The variation in capital project spending is now more influenced by voter preference than in previous years because of the availability of referenda for large capital projects and operating purposes. The cost of transporting students varies based on the geographic area of the school corporation.

The table immediately below shows the 2020 and 2021 summary statistics for the school corporations. The comprehensive list of reporting school corporation units and their respective values can be found on the following pages. For further detail on any unit shown below, please refer to the Indiana Department of Education (DOE) for the expenditure and ADM information provided to DOE.

Pursuant to IC 36-12-1-8(b), “public libraries provide free library services in order to meet the educational, informational, and recreational interests and needs of the public.” Accordingly, libraries in Indiana provide books, magazines, newspapers, and other reference material to library patrons on a short-term basis. In addition, almost all libraries provide public computers and Internet access.

There are currently 239 library systems in Indiana, serving populations ranging from 181 (York Township Public Library, Benton County) to 877,389 (Indianapolis-Marion County Public Library). Library systems may be created by various types of local governments (e.g., cities or counties) and have boards appointed by the government that created them

The table immediately below shows the 2020 and 2021 summary statistics for the libraries. The comprehensive list of reporting library units and their respective values can be found on the following pages. For further detail on any unit shown below, please refer to the annual financial report submitted by that unit for the applicable year (i.e., 2020 or 2021).

Special Districts

Governmental services that are not provided by counties, townships, cities and towns, schools, or libraries are often provided by local government types referred to as special districts. The main types of special districts in Indiana are:

- Solid Waste
- Airport Authority
- Fire Protection Districts
- Transportation Corporations
- Sewer Districts

Every county is either part of a multi-county solid waste district, or has its own solid waste district. Therefore, determining the per capita expenditure for these districts is straightforward, and expenditure levels are presented on a per capita basis.

Determining the population served for the other types of special districts is not possible given existing data. The total gross expenditure for these districts is provided instead.

For special districts, the caveats regarding differences among expenditure levels are even more significant. Because the expenditures are not normalized on a per capita basis, greater variation is to be expected. Comparisons of expenditure levels among different types of non-solid waste special districts are likely not meaningful to most users. Even comparisons among similar types are difficult due to the unique legal and financial conditions under which each district operates.

The tables immediately below show the 2020 and 2021 summary statistics for the special districts. Solid waste districts have been broken out from other types of special service districts. The comprehensive list of reporting special district units and their respective values can be found on the following pages. For further detail on any unit shown below, please refer to the annual financial report submitted by that unit for the applicable year (i.e., 2020 or 2021).

Special district expenditures are grouped by county. Each special district is listed only once. Special districts that serve populations in more than one county are listed under the “major county” for that particular district.

Conservancy Districts

Conservancy districts in Indiana are established for many purposes: flood prevention and control, drainage improvement, irrigation management, and wildlife and forest development. These districts are unique because they are established through the local court and are not handled the same way as other local governments. Conservancy districts are not subject to maximum levy limitations, and the tax rate applied to a conservancy district is calculated separately from the tax district rate.

Conservancy districts have well-established boundaries; however, the United States Census Bureau does not track population within these boundaries. For this reason, the data provided here are total gross expenditures rather than expenditures per capita.

The table immediately below shows the 2020 and 2021 summary statistics for the conservancy districts. The comprehensive list of reporting conservancy district units and their respective values can be found on the following pages. For further detail on any unit shown below, please refer to the annual financial report submitted by that unit for the applicable year (i.e., 2020 or 2021).

Conservancy district expenditures are grouped by county. Each conservancy district is listed only once. Conservancy districts that serve populations in more than one county are listed under the “major county” for that particular district.

Soil & Water Conservation Districts

Soil and water conservation districts are established under IC 14-32-5 and exist to prevent soil erosion and water runoff. Districts may carry out this purpose through a number of measures, including engineering operations, methods of cultivation, the growing of vegetation, and changes in use of land.

Each district is governed by a board of five supervisors that serve in staggered three-year terms. Three supervisors are elected at an annual meeting of landowners and two are appointed by the State Soil Conservation Board.

The table immediately below shows the 2020 and 2021 summary statistics for the soil and water conservation districts. The comprehensive list of reporting soil and water conservation units and their respective values can be found on the following pages. For further detail on any unit shown below, please refer to the annual financial report submitted by that unit for the applicable year (i.e., 2020 or 2021).
