

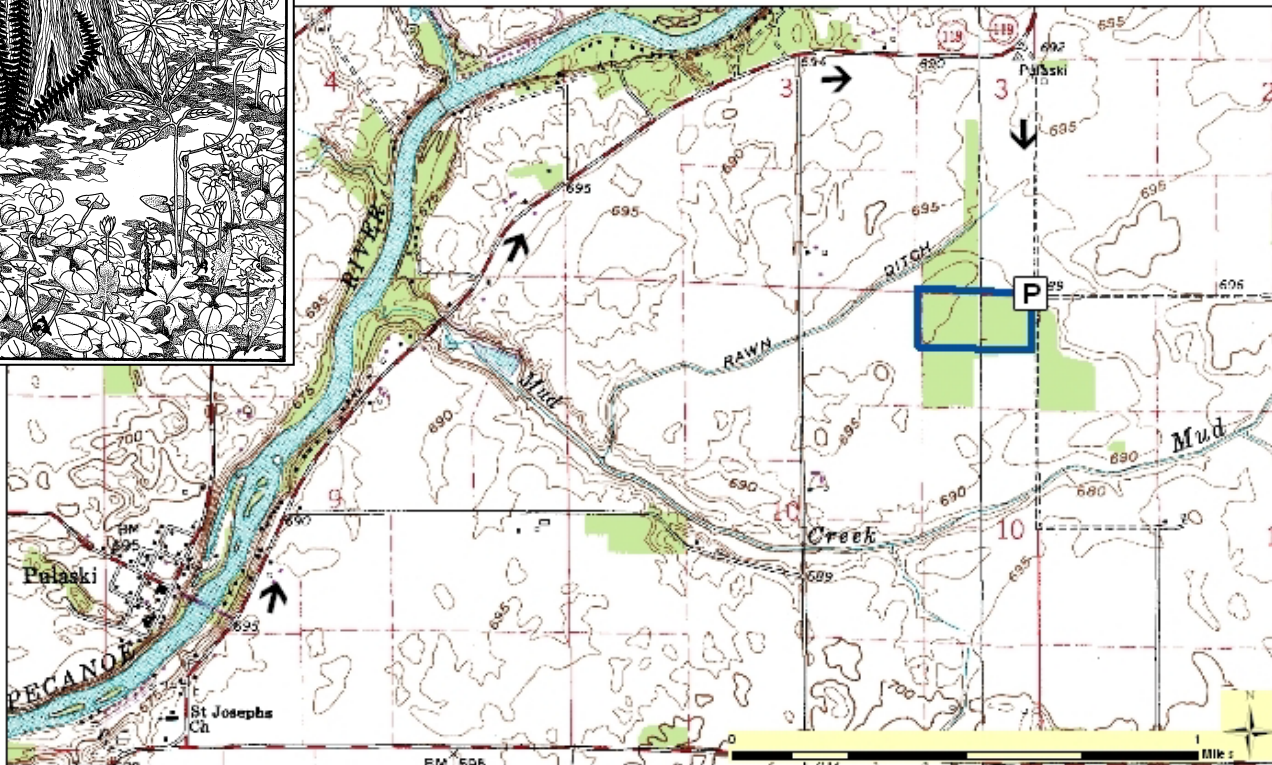
Berns-Meyer Nature Preserve

County: Pulaski Size: 20 acres
Ownership: Nature Preserves - IDNR



Location and Access

Parking and trail. From the Tippecanoe River Bridge at Pulaski take SR 119 northeast about 2.3 miles to CR 100W. Turn right and proceed to the 'T' junction of CR 100W and CR 500S. There is a parking lot in the northeast corner of the preserve and a system of marked trails. Trails are flat and easy walking. Trails can have wet and muddy spots anytime there is excessive rain or snow, tread is natural surface. Trail length is about 0.75 miles.



Description: The preserve contains two major tree cover types whose occurrence is related to soil type and soil moisture. Most of the area is mixed mesophytic woodland with red oak, white oak, tulip tree, sugar maple, basswood, and shagbark hickory as important species. In the poorly drained areas black ash, red maple, pin oak and swamp white oak become important. The preserve is rich in spring wildflowers including marsh marigold and the unusual-looking green dragon.
