Certification Regarding Eligibility
To Apply for Worker Adjustment Assistance

In accordance with Section 223 of the Trade Act of 1974, as amended ("Act"), 19 U.S.C. § 2273, the Department of Labor herein presents the results of an investigation regarding certification of eligibility to apply for worker adjustment assistance.

The group eligibility requirements for workers of a firm under Section 222(a) of the Act, 19 U.S.C. § 2272(a), are satisfied if the following criteria are met:

- (1) a significant number or proportion of the workers in such workers' firm have become totally or partially separated, or are threatened to become totally or partially separated;
- (2)(B)(i)(I) there has been a shift by the workers' firm to a foreign country in the production of articles or supply of services like or directly competitive with those produced/supplied by the workers' firm; OR
(II) there has been an acquisition from a foreign country by the workers' firm of articles/services that are like or directly competitive with those produced/supplied by the workers' firm; AND

(ii) the shift/acquisition must have contributed importantly to the workers' separation or threat of separation.

The investigation was initiated in response to a petition filed on February 5, 2020 by a state workforce office on behalf of workers of Dometic Corporation, Americas Division, a subsidiary of Dometic Holding AB, LaGrange, Indiana ("Dometic Corporation"). The workers' firm is engaged in activities related to the production of patio awnings, slide toppers, and supporting hardware. The subject worker group includes on-site leased workers from Pro Resources, Peoplelink Staffing, and Elwood Staffing.

During the course of the investigation, information was collected from the workers' firm and the petitioner.

Section 222(a)(1) has been met because a significant number or proportion of the workers in such workers' firm have become totally or partially separated, or are threatened to become totally or partially separated.

Section 222(a)(2)(B) has been met because the workers' firm shifted production to a foreign country articles like or directly competitive with articles produced by the workers which contributed importantly to worker group separations at Dometic Corporation.

Conclusion

After careful review of the facts obtained in the investigation, I determine that workers of Dometic Corporation, Americas Division, a subsidiary of Dometic Holding AB, including on-site leased workers from Pro Resources, Peoplelink Staffing, and Elwood Staffing, LaGrange, Indiana, who are engaged in activities related to the production of patio awnings, slide toppers, and supporting hardware meet the worker group certification criteria under Section 222(a) of the Act, 19 U.S.C. § 2272(a). In accordance with Section 223 of the Act, 19 U.S.C. § 2273, I make the following certification:

"All workers of Dometic Corporation, Americas Division, a subsidiary of Dometic Holding AB, including on-site leased workers from Pro Resources, Peoplelink Staffing, and Elwood Staffing, LaGrange, Indiana, who became totally or partially separated from employment on or after February 4, 2019, through two years from the date of certification, and all workers in the group threatened with total or partial separation from employment on the date of certification through two years from the date of certification, are eligible to apply for adjustment assistance under Chapter 2 of Title II of the Trade Act of 1974, as amended."
