







### Food Stamps Issued




### Food Stamps Households and Recipients

### Monthly Management Report Definitions of Elements

### **TANF**

The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program provides cash payments to eligible families with children.

### TANF Regular Number of Families

Total number of households or family units participating in TANF- Regular and TANF-I (Incapacitated Parent). It does not include TANF - UP (Unemployed Parent).

### Recipient

A person receiving TANF benefits. There may be more than one recipient in a TANF case.

"Adult" recipient is a person 21 years or older or a person 18 or over with at least one child.

"Child" recipient is an unmarried person under 18 deprived of parental support and living with a specified relative.

#### **Payments**

Total cash assistance dollars paid to TANF recipients during the month.

### Average payment per Case

Total TANF payments divided by the number of TANF cases receiving a grant. A "case" is a household or family unit participating in TANF- Regular and TANF-I (Incapacitated Parent). It does not include TANF - UP (Unemployed Parent).

### Average payment per Recipient

Total TANF payments divided by the number of TANF recipients receiving a grant.

### Cases with benefits reduced to zero

TANF families whose cash assistance has been reduced to zero due to income or penalty.

### **TANF UP (Unemployed Parent Program)**

#### **Number of Families**

Total number of households or family units participating in TANF UP.

#### Recipient

A person receiving TANF benefits. There may be more than one recipient in a TANF case.

"Adult" recipient is a person 21 years or older or a person 18 or over with at least one child.

"Child" recipient is an unmarried person under 18 deprived of parental support and living with a specified relative.

### **Payments**

Total cash assistance dollars paid to TANF recipients during the month.

### Average payment per Case

Total TANF payments divided by the number of TANF cases receiving a grant. A "case" is a household or family unit participating in TANF UP.

### Average payment per Recipient

Total TANF payments divided by the number of TANF recipients receiving a grant.

### Cases with benefits reduced to zero

TANF families whose cash assistance has been reduced to zero due to income or penalty.

### Food Stamps (FS)

Indiana's Food Stamp Program helps eligible low income families supplement their food purchasing dollars with food stamp coupons.

### **Total Stamps Issued**

Dollar value of total food stamps issued during the month.

### Total Households

The number of households participating in the FS program.

### **Total Persons**

The number of persons participating in the FS program.

#### Average Stamps per Household

The total value of food stamps divided by the number of households.

#### Average Stamps per Person

The total value of food stamps divided by the total number of recipients.

### Positive Error Rate

Dollars paid in error divided by total dollars.

### **Negative Error Rate**

Number of erroneously closed or denied cases divided by total number of cases in sample.

### Unregre ssed

Error rate reported by the state before the federal agency has accepted and finalized the results. This rate is subject to revision.

### **Employment and Training**

IMPACT assists TANF/Food Stamp families to become self-sufficient by helping to provide education, training, and job opportunities and overcoming personal barriers to employment.

#### Total IMPACT Cases

The total number of active cases with IMPACT activities during the month.

#### **IMPACT-TANF**

The number of active TANF cases with IMPACT activities during the month.

### **IMPACT-Food Stamp**

The number of active Food Stamp cases with IMPACT activities during the month.

### **Total Adults Employed**

The total number of IMPACT adults employed during the month.

### **TANF Adults Employed**

The total number of TANF-IMPACT participants that were reported employed during the month.

### Food Stamp Adults Employed

The total number of FS-IMPACT participants that were reported employed during the month.

### Total Adults ineligible due to employment

The total number of IMPACT adults cases closed during the month because of income from employment.

### Monthly Management Report Definitions of Elements

### **Child Care**

Indiana's child care program provides child caring services reimbursement to eligible families participating in IMPACT, transitioning out of the TANF program, or are low income families at risk of becoming eligible for TANF.

### **Total Subsidized Child Care Payments**

The total value of Child Care Development Fund (CCDF) Child Care Voucher Payments and CCDF Child Care Contract Payments. **Licensed Capacity of Child Care Homes** The number and licensed capacity of licensed day care homes.

**Licensed Capacity of Child Care Centers** 

The number and licensed capacity of licensed day care centers.

### **Registered Ministries**

The number of registered ministries with child caring facilities. The capacity of registered ministries is not regulated.

**CCDF - Prodnew**

**FSSA Data Warehouse** 

A data coordinating entity established to

prepare federal TANF reports.

**ICES** 

Indiana Client Eligibility System is a federally certified online, integrated, eligibility system that supports the administration of TANF, Food Stamps, IMPACT, and Medicaid Eligibility.
