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Outcome Data

The Mental Health Statistics Improvement Program (MHSIP) survey is a nationally used survey and measures satisfaction of adults receiving services. This survey was handed out to all individuals receiving services during at least a one-week period between August 30th and September 24th in 2021 for paper surveys and August 30th and October 8th for online surveys. Hamilton Center's surveys were lost in the mail for this survey period and no data was able to be collected.

The Youth Services Survey for Families (YSS-F) is a nationally used survey and measures satisfaction of parents of youth receiving services. This survey was handed out to all individuals receiving services during at least a one-week period between August 30th and September 24th in 2021 for paper surveys and August 30th and October 8th for online surveys.
