

Use of First-Line Psychosocial Care for Children/Adolescents on Antipsychotics up to Age 17

The arrow to the right of the result indicates if the MCE had a meaningful improvement or reduction in its rate from the prior year (+/- 2 percentage points).

If there is no arrow, then the change from the prior year was not meaningful.

There are no arrows for CareSource since the MCE's contract began in CY 2017 and this is their first HEDIS reporting year.

Each MCE is coded based on how its results compared to Medicaid health plans nationally.
