## Condition Name:

**Arboviral Disease or Infection, Imported**

## Condition Name in NBS:

- **Chikungunya Virus Disease**
- **Dengue Virus, Dengue Severe, Dengue-like illness**
- **Zika Virus Disease, Congenital/Non-Congenital**

## Reporting Timeframe:

**Within One Working Day**

## TO REPORT:

- For NBS users: Report conditions via Morbidity Report in **NBS**
- Non-NBS users: Report with **this** form

## Associated Reportable Laboratory Results

- Isolation of virus from, or demonstration of specific viral antigen or nucleic acid in, tissue, blood, CSF, or other body fluid, EIA, virus-specific quantitative antibody titers. Virus-specific IgM antibodies in CSF or serum.
- If positive, forward specimen to IDOH Labs for further testing. \*If positive, forward to IDOH Labs for further testing.

## Condition Specific Reporting Details

- Clinical, Epidemiologic, Lab Report, and Treatment information sections within the NBS Morbidity Report.

## Additional Documentation to Include

- Applicable medical records including outpatient office visits, specialty consults, and emergency department/hospital discharge summaries, recent travel history.
- Negative results for other arboviral IgM antibodies or documentation of recent vaccination against a flavivirus (e.g., WNV, YFV, JEV).
- Name and contact information of follow up provider should be listed in the Administrative Comments section of the morbidity report.
