 - a. Activity Update:

New staff interns Sam Alderfer and Ariana Smith were introduced. They are IUPUI students in marketing and public relations.

- County Visits: In the last six weeks, staff visited coordinators in 33 counties for a total of 73 Since June 1. The goal is to personally visit all 92 counties by the end of October.
- County Coordinators: Marion and Allen counties still need coordinators identified.
- IBC Endorsements: Since our most recent deadline, September 30, we have received seven new applications for endorsement. Our goal is 200 legacy projects by 2016. With October 3 proposed endorsements, the total number of approved projects will be 103.
- Marketing Update:
 - Talking points distributed to Commission members
 Since August 22, 2014 meeting, 17 Media Impressions
 - IBC News October issue distribution: 3,767 and excerpts to 29,000 state employees
 - o 65 new Twitter followers
 - o 286 Instagram posts, 149 followers
- Fundraising Goals: \$5 million, 9 Signature projects approved

III. <u>Committee Reports</u>

a. Endorsement – Ellen Rosenthal

"The Endorsement Committee is working beautifully, like a well-oiled machine," she noted. She thanked Committee members Chris Jensen, Pam Bennett, Colleen Smyth and Deborah Wezensky for their hard work and dedication. She shared the following highlights:

- 119 Application for Endorsement received since October 1, 2013
- 103 Applications submitted to the full Commission for endorsement as of today
 - 31 applications received during third quarter of 2014, three not approved for endorsement: one pending proof of non-profit status; one does not meet legacy project endorsement criteria; and one not approved due to lack of progress and partnership.

Chair Rosenthal submitted 28 applications for the Commission's endorsement. Sarah Evans Barker made a motion to approve the Committee's recommendations on applications presented for endorsement and those denied. Lee Hamilton seconded the motion. The motion carried with no dissent.

- b. Bicentennial Nature Trust Mark Becker reported on the August 1st Round:
 - 12 applications received, 11 approved (committee members Becky Skillman, Randall Shepard, Tony George, Senator Jim Merritt and advisor, Mary McConnell):
 - o 2 Land Trusts
 - o 2 DNR Nature Preserves
 - o 7 DNR Fish and Wildlife
 - One new county represented: Vermillion
 - Match ratio within this round: \$1:\$1.42

- Approved two new "BNT Signature Project Areas". The goal is to accelerate acquisitions
 in a targeted area where building upon the existing matrix of conservation properties
 can make a significant impact. The two areas are:
 - Cedar Creek Conservation Area -- DeKalb and Allen Counties
 - o Beanblossom Creek Conservation Area -- Monroe County
- 104 projects approved to date:
 - 49 different counties
 - o \$18.5 million BNT, \$25.4 million match
 - o \$1:\$1.37 overall match rate
 - 45 closed or completed
 - o 5,092 acres (eight square miles) of conservation properties added
 - Uncommitted trust balance: \$11.5 million
- c. Book Sarah Evans Barker

The book committee (Jim Madison, Mickey Maurer, Sarah Evans Barker) has been stymied due to lack of funding for a bicentennial book. Staff are following established IDOA procurement rules. RFPs will go out per Indiana state procurement policy to potential book vendors to submit proposals.

IV. <u>New Business</u>

a. Indiana State Museum – Tom King, CEO

An update was provided on State Museum endeavors including:

- Centers of excellence: paleontology, Lincoln collection, Indiana art, Indiana agriculture and manufacturing and quilts
- A multi-phase museum renovation is under way. The first phase will be complete in time for Indiana's 2016 bicentennial, although renovation work will continue through 2019
- Some state historic sites are also under renovation in preparation for Indiana's bicentennial, particularly Corydon state capitol and the Levi Coffin House
- The "Amazing Maize" exhibit will be at the Indiana State Fair
- Bicentennial-related exhibitions include three submitted for Endorsement as Bicentennial Legacy Projects:
 - o "Stars" a quilt exhibition features historic and modern quilts opens June 2015
 - "Indiana in 200 Objects" a major exhibit illuminating Indiana's natural and cultural history
 - "200 Years of Indiana Art: A Cultural Legacy" an exhibition featuring works by Indiana artists from the territorial days to the present.
- b. Indiana Historical Bureau Pam Bennett, Director

- IHB has a Bicentennial Legacy Project promoting signage to highlight communities and organizations with Bicentennial Legacy Projects as part of the 2016 celebration.
- Events are being planned to complement the tour by Lincoln's funeral train in 2015 in collaboration with statewide partners, including:
 - An exhibit at the statehouse with a replica Lincoln casket courtesy of Batesville
 Casket Co. and guards in period costume, April 6–10
 - A ceremony on April 30 including a program from the Ulysses S. Grant National Historic Site, St. Louis, Missouri
 - A Lincoln funeral train blog.

V. Old Business

- Capital Projects Update Jessica Robertson, IDOA
 Bicentennial Plaza on the statehouse campus:
 - MKSK, the plaza project's landscape architecture, urban design, and planning firm is refining plaza concepts based on Commission feedback. These concepts will be presented at a future Commission meeting
 - Survey work has begun as part of necessary construction work

Education and Welcome Center:

- IDOA has partnered with Conner Prairie to help determine how to keep visiting children engaged
- Concepts are still being developed for the exhibit, to be housed in the Indiana State
 Library
- Additional restrooms will be installed in the ISL as part of the project. That renovation is in its initial phase

Archives Solution:

Options for a long-term solution are still being researched.

- b. 2016 Celebrations Update Perry Hammock Suggested celebrations:
 - Kick-off function on statehood day in 2015 perhaps in the statehouse
 - October 2016 Hoosier homecoming "you all come" open to all, outdoor
 - December 10, 2016 gala -- Our most formal function. Will be held at the Indiana State Fairgrounds Coliseum. Indiana Public Broadcasting has expressed an interest in broadcasting the function.
 - December 11, 2016 -- Inspirational celebration closes out the bicentennial year.
