The Children's Initiative now includes 249 youth and education focused projects across the state.

Kids Dance Outreach will be performing at Hoosier Homecoming. Children have served as Torch Bearers across the state.



We are participating in the Student Passport program at the International Festival in November.

Approximately 1,600 children will participate in the Statehood Day celebration on December 9.

Children will be present at the ribbon cutting ceremony for the Education Center. Eli Lilly Global Day of Service helped 19,000 students at more than 50 Indianapolis Public School.

Torch Relay Update

Becky Skillman commented on how great the Torch Relay was going and her involvement in Lawrence County's celebration.

The turnout at the kickoff event in Corydon was successful with local media, school children and Judy O'Bannon as the first torchbearer.

Lee Hamilton expressed his heartwarming thanks those making this event special, especially for the honored torchbearers.

Mark Newman thanked the Commission for inviting him to present. The Torch Relay has traveled 1,900 miles so far and by the end of today reached 2,000.

People can follow the torch through social media including the website and mobile app. The Torch Relay has made an impact on the state and helped Indiana with destination qualities. There has been \$9-\$11 generated in tax revenue for every \$1 spent on celebrating Indiana.

Ellen Rosenthal made a motion to approve the Committee's recommendation to endorse all 55 applications. Mary McConnell second. Motion adopted.
