NOTICE OF 30-DAY PERIOD FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

Preliminary Findings Regarding a Significant Revision to a Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit (FESOP)

for Keystone Automotive Industries, Inc dba Saturn Wheel in Huntington County

Significant Permit Revision No.: 069-47363-00100

The Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) has received an application from Keystone Automotive Industries, Inc dba Saturn Wheel, located at 706 Railroad Street, Warren, Indiana 46792, for a significant revision of its FESOP issued on March 30, 2022. If approved by IDEM's Office of Air Quality (OAQ), this proposed revision would allow Keystone Automotive Industries, Inc dba Saturn Wheel to make certain changes at its existing source. Keystone Automotive Industries, Inc dba Saturn Wheel has applied for the following:

- (1) Construction and operation of the new emission units (SCPB1 SCPB4, PS1 and PS2).
- (2) Modification to update maximum capacities and coating materials for existing emission units (LB1 and LB2) and update the state rule applicability under 326 IAC, Article 8 for these units.
- (3) Addition of the emission units, constructed under the provisions of 326 IAC 2-1.1-3 (Exemptions).
- (4) Update maximum capacities of the existing shot blasters (VB1, VB2 and VB3). PTE has decreased and there is no change to the existing PSD and FESOP minor source limits, testing and monitoring requirements, as a result of this change.
- (5) Removal of several existing emission units.
- (6) Change the company name.
- (7) Update control device for the existing shot blasters SB1 and SB2. There is no increase in PTE, as a result of this change.

The applicant intends to construct and operate new equipment that will emit air pollutants; therefore, the permit contains new or different permit conditions. In addition, some conditions from previously issued permits/approvals have been corrected, changed, or removed. These corrections, changes, and removals may include Title I changes (e.g., changes that add or modify synthetic minor emission limits). The potential to emit regulated air pollutants will continue to be limited to less than the Title V and PSD major threshold levels. IDEM has reviewed this application and has developed preliminary findings, consisting of a draft permit and several supporting documents, which would allow the applicant to make this change.

IDEM is aware that emission units (SCPB1 - SCPB4, PS1 and PS2) have been constructed and operated and existing units (LB1 and LB2) have been modified prior to receipt of the proper permit. IDEM is reviewing this matter and will take appropriate action. This draft permit contains provisions to bring unpermitted equipment into compliance with construction and operation permit rules.

How can you participate in this process?

This notice is posted on IDEM's website (<u>https://www.in.gov/idem/public-notices/</u>). The date that this notice is posted on IDEM's website marks the beginning of a 30-day public comment period. If the 30th day of the comment period falls on a day when IDEM offices are closed for business, all comments must be postmarked or delivered in person on the next business day that IDEM is open.

You may request that IDEM hold a public hearing about this draft permit. If adverse comments concerning the **air pollution impact** of this draft permit are received, with a request for a public hearing, IDEM will decide whether or not to hold a public hearing. IDEM could also decide to hold a public meeting instead of, or in addition to, a public hearing. If IDEM decides to conduct a public hearing and/or public meeting, IDEM will post a separate announcement of the date, time, and location of that public hearing and/or public meeting on IDEM's website (<u>https://www.in.gov/idem/public-notices/</u>). At a hearing, you would have an opportunity to submit written comments and make verbal comments. At a meeting, you would have an opportunity to submit written comments, ask questions, and discuss any air pollution concerns with IDEM staff.

All comments will be considered by IDEM when we make a decision to issue or deny the permit. Comments that are most likely to affect final permit decisions are those based on the rules and laws governing this permitting process (326 IAC 2), air quality issues, and technical issues. IDEM does not have legal authority to regulate zoning, odor, or noise. For such issues, please contact your local officials.

What will happen after IDEM makes a decision?

Following the end of the public comment period, IDEM will issue a Notice of Decision stating whether the permit has been issued or denied. If the permit is issued, it may be different than the draft permit because of comments that were received during the public comment period. If comments are received during the public notice period, the final decision will include a document that summarizes the comments and IDEM's response to those comments. If you have submitted comments or have asked to be added to the mailing list, you will receive a Notice of the Decision. The notice will provide details on how you may appeal IDEM's decision, if you disagree with that decision. The final decision will also be available on the Internet at the address indicated above and will also be sent to the local library indicated above, and the IDEM public file room on the 12th floor of the Indiana Government Center North, 100 N. Senate Avenue, Indianapolis, Indiana 46204-2251.
