- 15 – Everyday items discarded by households, businesses and organizations (commonly known as garbage or solid waste).

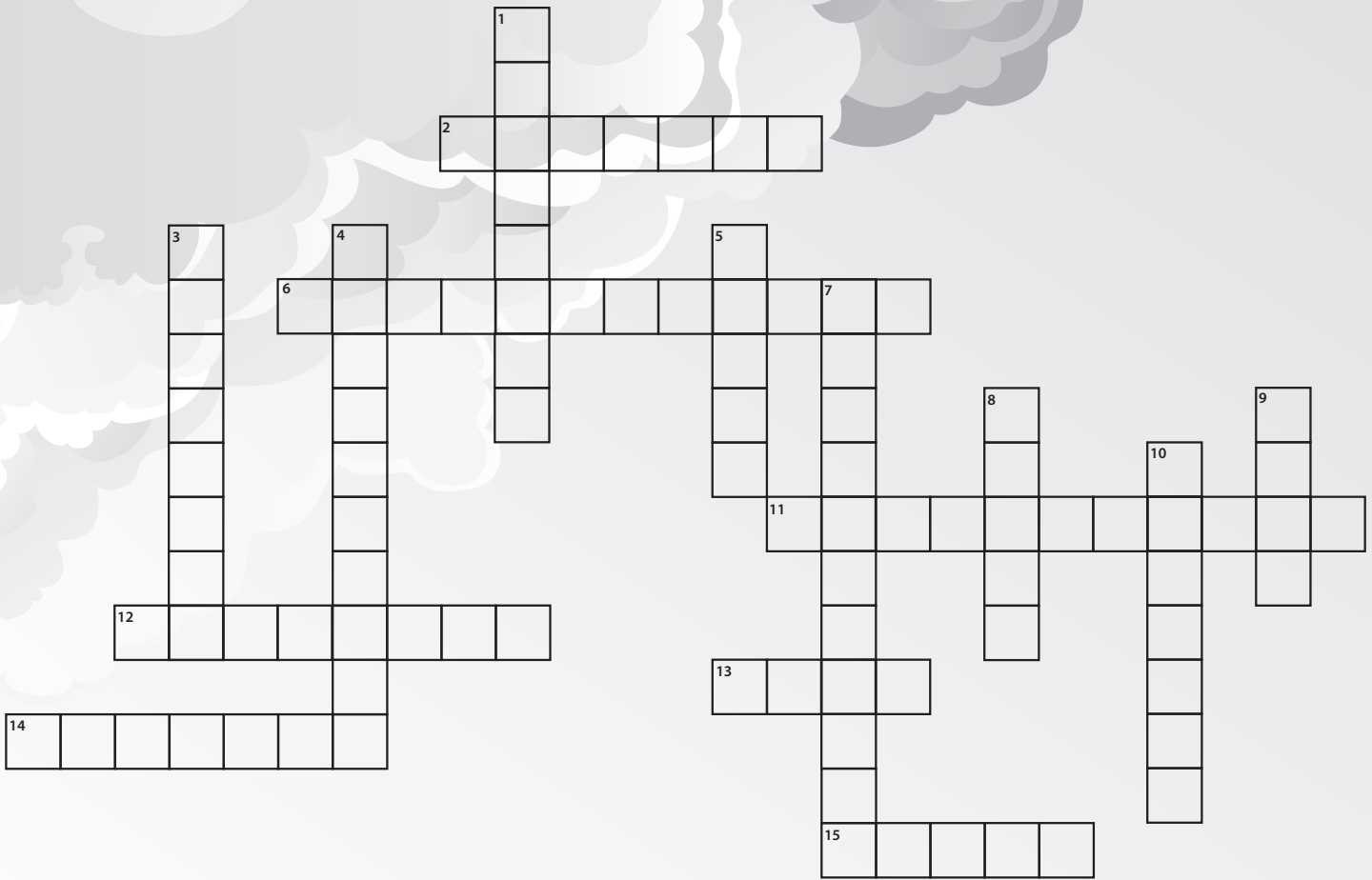
### Down

- 4 – A waste type consisting of everyday items that are discarded (commonly known as trash or garbage).
- 5 – Thickness of a material laid on or spread over a surface.
- 7 – All the physical surroundings on earth, including everything living and nonliving.
- 8 – A thick plastic layer on the bottom of a landfill.
- 9 – The acronym for the state agency tasked with protecting the environment and human health.
- 10 – An obstacle that prevents movement or access.
