    Board, and the public attending today.
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    much appreciate the opportunity to give you an
    update on our activities. First, however, I do
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21
    want to thank Dan Bortner, Director of DNR, for
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    coming to the meeting today.
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Dan is not a new DNR employee.

In fact,

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- 1 if I'm not mistaken, he's worked at the
- 2 Department for about 15 years, so he brings a
- 3 wealth of experience in the Department of Natural
- 4 Resources with him as now the director, and I'm
- 5 just thrilled that he's in his new position and
- 6 look forward to working with him as a colleague
- 7 in the Governor's cabinet.
- 8 So, welcome, Dan, and thank you for making
- 9 time for the Board meeting today.
- MR. BORTNER: Thank you.
- 11 COMM. PIGOTT: You're quite welcome.
- 12 Dan, is there anything else you'd like to tell
- 13 us? Tell us -- can you tell us just a little bit
- 14 about where you came from in DNR so that people
- 15 are aware?
- MR. BORTNER: Sure. I came in
- 17 in 2005, believe it or not, as the Human
- 18 Resources Director. I had a previous life in the
- 19 private sector in human resources, came in to DNR
- 20 as the HR Director, and in that first year was
- 21 moved over to State Parks and spent the last 15
- 22 years as Director of the Indiana State Parks
- 23 Division.

COMM. PIGOTT: Well, so you had the 1 great job of running the State Parks. 2 I've always looked at that as a really nice position. 3 4 And so, now you're responsible for the whole agency, and we really look forward to continuing 5 to work with you, Dan. I know, as a member of 6 7 the Natural Resource Commission, about the good 8 work you've done, because you've presented many times before the Commission. So, I'm looking 9 10 forward to the agency doing even better things, 11 and appreciate your presence.

The second think I wanted --

MR. BORTNER: Thank you so much.

COMM. PIGOTT: You're quite welcome,

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The second thing I wanted to mention

was -- it's kind of hot off the press this

morning. I had a conversation with the Assistant

Commissioner in our Office of Air Quality, and he

let me know that he will be retiring in -- at the

end of October, so October 30th is Keith Baugues'

last day at the Department of Environmental

Management.

And a couple of things to say about that. One is I can't tell you how much I appreciate Keith's patience with me. As you all know, I have a good deal of experience in Water, but not as much in Air, and Keith has served as a mentor and friend over the -- oh, I don't know, 15 years, Keith, that you and I have worked together.

And Keith, I just want to give you a chance to say a couple of words. I doubt that there will be an opportunity for Keith to say goodbye to the Board after -- or at the next Board meeting. So, Keith, anything you'd like to say?

MR. BAUGUES: I've been here ten and a half years in this stint. I was there six years, from 1973 to '79. I certainly believe the air is a whole lot cleaner now than it was then, but still is never good enough for some people. But I appreciate the opportunity.

Thank you.

COMM. PIGOTT: Well, Keith, we will miss you and really appreciate your service, not

- 1 just to our agency, but at U.S. EPA and your
- 2 various other jobs in the consulting world in
- 3 other places. You've brought to us a variety of
- 4 valuable experiences and led our Office of Air
- 5 Quality with distinction over the last decade.
- 6 So, thank you.
- 7 CHAIRMAN GARD: Yes, and we wish you
- 8 a good retirement, and thank you so much for all
- 9 you've done in working with the various
- 10 commissions and this Commission and others, and
- 11 enjoy retirement.
- 12 COMM. PIGOTT: I have a feeling that,
- 13 like many folks who retire, Keith will still be
- 14 active in the air field, and look forward to his
- 15 continued work.
- In terms of the position, we will look to
- 17 fill the position, and we'll post it and do the
- 18 hiring in our regular process, so we'll be
- 19 posting it. Those that are interested can apply
- 20 on-line, and we will conduct interviews and hire
- 21 a new head of the Office of Air Quality. So,
- 22 we'd like to do that as soon as possible. We'll
- 23 put together the paperwork necessary to fill the

slot and run it through the approval process. I don't expect that we will hear that we cannot fill it. So, that's the Office of Air Quality.

And then to move to the Office of Water Quality for just a moment, it's not a personnel matter, but a substantive policy issue. As you all are aware, the Trump Administration recently passed a new definition of Waters of the United States, and people have wondered over time what impact that would have in the -- our regulatory actions.

And for the most part, the impact of the new definition will be felt in our 401 Water Quality Certification area. We will not be regulating ephemeral streams, as they're no longer included in the definition of the Waters of the United States.

Those streams, which flow only part of the year, by definition, do provide many upstream and downstream benefits. We understand that they protect against floods, they filter pollutants, they recycle potentially harmful nutrients, provide food and habitat for many kinds of fish,

play a critical role in maintaining the quality and supply of our drinking water, ensure a continued flow of water to surface waters, and help recharge underground aquifers.

And while we will not regulate them
because they are no longer included in the new
definition, IDEM will encourage and encourages
the consideration of avoidance, minimization of
downstream water impacts, and any mitigation when
filling ephemeral streams. And therefore, that's
our -- the agency's position moving forward with
ephemeral streams under the new definition of the
Waters of the United States, and I thought I
would share that with this group today.

We have been in touch with other regulated entities that have been interested in this rule, had meetings with them, discussed the new federal definition and what it means for the State of Indiana, and this is the result of both those discussions but also of the new definition.

So, Sen. Gard, that's, in essence, the report from the Department for this month.

CHAIRMAN GARD: Well, I have a

question about your last topic. Do you have an estimate of how much time that your people have spent on regulating ephemeral streams?

asked the question about the time we've spent. I did look at the coverage of the number of permits that we've issued, and I found that there were a great -- over the past 20 years, there are a great number of permits that we issued that regulated the dredge-and-fill activities for ephemeral streams. Oftentimes the regulatory activities are not just limited to ephemeral stream, oftentimes you're impacting a jurisdictional water as well, one --

CHAIRMAN GARD: Uh-huh.

COMM. PIGOTT: -- that would require a permit. So, I don't believe that it will eliminate all of the -- or a large chunk of the permits that we issue. Rather, it will narrow the focus of some of those permits to just jurisdictional waters for our 401 Program.

CHAIRMAN GARD: Okay.

1 COMM. PIGOTT: We'll continue regulating our isolated wetlands under the state 2 isolated wetland regulation, however. 3 don't -- I don't think in any single year it will 4 result in a huge reduction of time or effort, but 5 over a time it could mean a reduction in the 6 7 number of permits we issue, over 20 years or 8 something like that. 9 CHAIRMAN GARD: Okay. Thank you. 10 Does anybody else on the Commission have any questions for the Commissioner? 11 12 (No response.) 13 CHAIRMAN GARD: No questions? 14 (No response.) 15 CHAIRMAN GARD: Okay. Chris Pedersen 16 will make a report, please. 17 MS. PEDERSEN: Hi. My name is Chris 18 Pedersen. I'm in the Rules Development Section 19 of the Office of Legal Counsel, and I wanted to 20 talk to you a little bit about the upcoming Board 21 meetings and what rules to expect. At this time, we expect the next Board meeting after today will 22 23 be on November 18th. That's one week later than

we would normally hold it because of the Veterans

Day holiday.

As far as the rules for November, some of the rules that are before the Board today could also be at the meeting in November. First, the Marion County SO2 Redesignation Emergency Rule, that is likely to need to be readopted in order to maintain that coverage.

And possibly the other emergency rule, which is the Vigo SO2 Redesignation, and the Lake and Porter Ozone Reclassification Rule. The regular rulemaking is up for adoption today, and if adopted, we may not need that emergency rule after this meeting.

In addition to that, two of the rules that are before the Board today for preliminary adoption, the Air Permit Fee Updates Rule and the Hazardous Waste Pharmaceuticals and other Hazardous Waste Updates Rules, those might be ready for final adoption in November. Because the meetings are closer together than normal, we're not a hundred percent positive, but they could be ready.

In addition to that, other rules that we should have ready in November for final adoption: Cold Cleaning Degreasing. This rule is dealing with solvents. Currently the sources must use a low-vapor-pressure solvent for cleaning and degreasing machine parts. The rule would allow sources to use a higher vapor-pressure solvent if they're also using a control device to control emissions, and these amendments are consistent with current U.S. EPA regulations.

Another rule is Septage Management. This rule was originally preliminarily adopted in August of 2019. It includes statutory changes, including the changing of the term "wastewater" to "septage" and removing the vehicle licensing requirements for septage vehicles.

The rule also adds phosphorus testing and standards for land application of septage. It eliminates the surface application for consistency with the state statute, and it also updates, clarifies and adds flexibility to the transport, treatment, storage or disposal of septage.

Another rule possibly for final adoption is the Waste Tire Rule. It includes updates and clarifications to existing waste tire management requirements and removes unnecessary requirements. It also adds new standards and procedures for legitimate use of waste tires.

And then for preliminary adoption, we have four rules. The first is the NOx Emissions

Monitoring Rule. This rule revises existing monitoring and reporting requirements for certain large fossil fuel boilers to add an alternative for monitoring and reporting of NOx emissions that is consistent with a recently released federal rule.

The Vertellus Particulate Matter

Revisions. Vertellus is a chemical manufacturing company in Indianapolis, and they have requested revisions to their current particulate matter emission limits. This is in order to remove units that are no longer operating or have been demolished at the facility. It also makes changes to PM limits for consistency with some recently adopted sulfur dioxide limits, and then

adds new language for units that burn both natural and landfill gases.

The Metals Criteria Rule. This rule revises Indiana's aquatic life and human health ambient water quality criteria for certain metals. It's based on federal recommendations and current science, and it will result in some proposed criteria being more stringent and some less stringent than the current criteria.

And then finally, the Hazardous Waste
Financial Assurance Rule. This rule revises
requirements for financial assurance hazardous
waste facilities. It adds more information and
clarification for existing requirements that are
authorized under the federal regulations.

And that is my report. I'll be glad to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN GARD: Are there any questions for Chris?

(No response.)

CHAIRMAN GARD: One clarification I want to make, and it will come up again, but in her report she said the next Rules Board meeting

is November the 18th, and that's correct. The

public hearing that we are having in October on

the citizens petition is not considered a

Rules -- an official Rules Board meeting. So,

don't confuse those, and we'll discuss that again

later.

COMM. PIGOTT: Sen. Gard, could I just interrupt for just a minute? I'd forgotten, one of the folks on the meeting today is Grant Geiss, and I just wanted to introduce him to the rest of you. Grant is our Chief Financial Officer, and in this age where budgets have a great deal of impact on our ability to conduct our business, I'm happy to introduce him to you.

He's an important player in the agency, and he's done a great job already of working to ensure that our budget is robust enough to continue our activities despite the fact that the Governor's Office and the Budget Office has asked the agency to roll back 15 percent of its budget in the next biennium budget. And Grant comes to us with a rich background in finance, both with

 Government, working -- was it -- Grant, was it at

 DCS or FSSA?
- 4 MR. GEISS: It was DCS, Bruno.

agency. Grant was a critical player in that agency, and we're lucky to have him on our team, and he'll be working internally with us as we work through our budget issues, not only in the development of the budget for the Governor's budget, but also when we testify before the House and Senate. So, I just wanted to introduce Grant to all of you folks on the Board, and I'm sorry for interrupting.

15 CHAIRMAN GARD: Oh, that's fine.

Grant, I think you're going to have a yeoman's job this year.

MR. GEISS: Yeah, it's -- I welcome the opportunity to work with all of you guys, and very excited. I started with IDEM on March 23rd, so it was right before all of this pandemic happened, so I've been learning by the fire as we go, but have great teammates that are willing to

- show me some expertise and knowledge that they
 have, and I look forward to working with all of
 you and what the future holds.

In addition, today we will have hearings and 9 10 Board action on final adoption of the following rules: Vigo County SO2 Redesignation and Ozone 11 12 PM2.5 Classification Updates for Clark, Floyd, 13 Lake and Porter Counties; NPDES General Permits; 14 and Transfer Patient -- Transfer Station 15 Reporting. We will also have hearings and Board action on preliminary adoption of Air Permit Fee 16

Finally, we will have a hearing on Nonexpiring Rules in accordance with the requirements of IC 13-14-9.5-1.5.

the Rules Development Branch within IDEM's Office
of Legal Counsel.

The emergency rule currently under consideration will temporarily supersede

326 IAC 1-4-50. This section is comprised of an attainment status table for certain air pollutants in Marion County.

The only change being made is the status of Center, Perry and Wayne Townships, which is being changed from nonattainment to attainment for the 2010 one-hour primary Sulfur Dioxide

National Ambient Air Quality Standard. We are making this change to maintain consistency with the federal designation that was published in the Federal Register on May 21st of this year.

IDEM is requesting that the Board approve this emergency rule while the agency completes the regular rulemaking to incorporate these changes into the Indiana Administrative Code.

This emergency rule was most recently adopted on July 8th of this year.

IDEM requests that the Board approve this emergency rule as presented, and I'm happy to

 of the Board. My name is Krystal Hackney, and
 I'm a Rule Writer in the Rules Development
 Section within the Office of Legal Counsel.

This rule temporarily revises

326 IAC 1-4-46 and 326 IAC 1-4-65 to reflect the federal reclassification of Lake and Porter

Counties to serious nonattainment for the 2008 eight-hour ozone standard, and 326 IAC 1-4-85 to reflect the redesignation of Fayette and Harrison Townships in Vigo County for the 2010 Sulfur Dioxide Standard.

The emergency rule adopted on July 8th 1 of 2020 included the Vigo County SO2 2 redesignation, but did not include Lake and 3 Porter Counties for the 2008 eight-hour ozone 4 standard, because a federal attainment 5 redesignation was anticipated. 6 7 It was not issued due to high ozone levels 8 in the area, so Lake and Porter Counties have 9 been included in this emergency rule to 10 reclassify those counties to serious nonattainment for the 2008 eight-hour ozone 11 12 standard, to be consistent with the current 13 federal designations. Today's adoption of the 14 emergency rule is necessary to maintain the 15 current federal designations until the regular 16 rulemaking is completed. 17 IDEM requests that the Board adopt this emergency rule as presented, and I'm available if 18 19 you have any further questions. 20 CHAIRMAN GARD: Thank you, Krystal. 21 Does the Board have any questions for 22 **Krystal?**

On July 11th, 2019, U.S. EPA published a correction in the Federal Register for the 2012 annual particulate matter with a diameter of 2.5 microns or less, which is PM2.5, National Ambient Air Quality Standards in Clark, Floyd, Lake and Porter Counties, to update the effective dates, and the designation status from unclassifiable to unclassifiable or attainment.

On August 23rd of 2019, U.S. EPA published a final determination that the Chicago nonattainment area, which includes both Lake and Porter Counties that are currently classified as moderate nonattainment, failed to attain the 2008 eight-hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards using monitoring data from 2015 to 2017 by the attainment date of July 20th of 2018.

The Environmental Rules Board adopted the first general permits rulemaking in August 2015 that transitioned five of the existing general permit rules. Two existing permit by rule general permit rules will remain after this rulemaking, and will be handled in a future rulemaking.

Changing how general permit coverage is issued is based on comments from U.S. EPA concerning establishing a permit term limit for general permits and coverage under them, and concerns about potential conflicts of interest related to the way general permit coverage is currently issued.

The three categories of dischargers for whom general permit coverage is transitioning under this rulemaking from the existing permit by

rule process to the administratively issued general permit coverage that is issued by the Commissioner of IDEM include those discharging stormwater runoff associated with construction activity, stormwater associated with municipal separate storm sewer system conveyances, and on-site residential sewage discharging disposal systems within the Allen County On-Site Waste Management District.

The existing permit by rules for these three categories of dischargers are found at 327 IAC 15-5, 15-13, and 327 IAC 15-14. This rulemaking is changing the process by which these dischargers receive the permit coverage they must have in order to discharge. The requirements of the general permit for each of the three categories are not being changed by this rulemaking, only the process by which permit coverage is issued is changing.

Comments received during the comment periods held to date have been limited in number. At both first and second notice comments periods, two letters were received during each comment

period from county surveyors. Their comments were actually about the requirements of the general permit being negotiated between U.S. EPA and IDEM for the stormwater runoff associated with construction activity general permits rather than this rulemaking to transition to administratively issued general permit coverage.

Comments received from the Hoosier

Environmental Council had to do with requirements that have been moved in the rule. The Hoosier

Environmental Council wants those requirements in the rule, but haven't been able to locate them.

Comments from U.S. EPA have been dealt with to the degree that can be in this rulemaking. Complete address of U.S. EPA's comments will be accomplished in the future rulemaking to transition the two remaining permit by rule general permits to administratively issued general permit coverage.

Members of the Board, good afternoon again. My name is Seth Engdahl, and I am a Rule Writer in the Rules Development Branch within IDEM's Office of Legal Counsel.

The rule currently under consideration would amend 326 IAC 2-1.1-7 so that the fees contained in the rule accurately reflect the fee amounts currently being collected by IDEM. As a refresher, on August 14th, 2019, Environmental Rules Board approved a 27-percent increase in the fees associated with the Title V Air Permit Program.

This action was in response to a statutory mandate that was included in Public Law 19-250, which directed the Board to increase Title V Air Permit fees to cause the aggregate fee revenue to be two million dollars greater than the aggregate fee revenue that was received by the agency during the year preceding the increase.

IDEM began collecting fees at the increased level in January of this year. This rulemaking would simply alter the fee amounts and the table found at 326 IAC 2-1.1-7 so that they properly reflect the fees actually being charged and collected by the agency. The rule makes minor stylistic changes and corrections to the rule as well.

- 7 MR. WATTS: Good afternoon, everyone.
- 8 Dan Watts, of the Rules Development Branch, and
- 9 I'm presenting LSA Document 20-204 for
- 10 preliminary adoption.
- 11 This rulemaking updates the Hazardous
- 12 Waste Rules at 329 IAC 3.1 with the incorporation
- 13 by reference of recently promulgated federal
- 14 hazardous waste rules, and also makes
- 15 improvements and corrections to the existing rule
- 16 language.
- 17 As a component of administering an
- 18 authorized hazardous waste program, IDEM must
- 19 maintain requirements that are consistent with
- 20 and no less stringent than the federal hazardous
- 21 waste requirements. IDEM is proposing to
- 22 incorporate recent federal hazardous waste rules
- 23 that include management standards for hazardous

waste pharmaceuticals, safe management of recalled airbags, and the addition of aerosol cans to the Universal Waste Rule.

Also proposed for adoption are the requirements at 40 CFR 260.2(c) and (d), which are associated with previously adopted federal rules, but not included in the original incorporate by reference. Changes in EPA guidance for the state adoption of the federally administered provisions in 40 CFR 260.2 prompted their adoption at this later date.

Representatives from IDEM are available to answer any questions you may have for this rulemaking, and the Department respectfully requests that the Board adopt this rule so Indiana's authorized hazardous waste program can be consistent with current federal hazardous waste rules for the affected waste streams and industry sectors.

A 30-day comment 9 10 period was provided for each notice. No comments were received. The rules that are found in 11 12 today's Board packet are introduced into the record of the hearing. 13 14 At this time, is there anyone who would 15 like to comment on any of the rules listed in any of the notices of nonexpiring rules? 16 17 (No response.) 18 CHAIRMAN GARD: Is there anyone else 19 who would wish to speak on these rules? 20 (No response.) 21 CHAIRMAN GARD: This hearing is 22 concluded. The Board must determine, based on

comments received, whether to direct the agency

to open a new rulemaking for any of the rules 1 that are listed in the notices. If the Board 2 chooses not to ask for a rulemaking, a motion 3 should be made for no further action to be taken 4 on the rules. Is there any Board discussion? 5 (No response.) 6 7 CHAIRMAN GARD: Is there a motion for 8 either no further action on listed rules or to direct the agency to begin a rulemaking on a 9 10 specific rule? 11 (No response.) CHAIRMAN GARD: I'll say that again. 12 I need a motion to either -- for either no 13 further action on listed rules or to direct the 15 agency to begin a rulemaking on the specific listed rule. 16 MR. Okay. Under Other Matters, last fall the Board received a citizens' petition regarding the 2012 recreational criteria for Indiana's waters. Due to the pandemic, the hearing on the petition has been delayed. We have scheduled the public hearing for Wednesday, October 28th at 1:30 p.m.

This will be a remote hearing in which all interested parties may provide testimony to those Board Members who are able to attend. While this hearing is not a meeting, per se, as I said before, the Board will not be voting on rules. Due to the remote nature of the hearing, we have scheduled it for a date that the majority of our Board members will be able to join to hear the testimony firsthand.

As the hearing will be recorded, it will be available to review prior to the next meeting for any Board Members or other interested parties that are not able to join in person that's scheduled for November 18th, during which the

Board will discuss the petition.

You all understand the discussion that we've had on this. It's been pretty near a year ago, I would say, and so, we will take testimony in October. We won't make any decisions. If we decide to move forward with it, we will do that at the November meeting, and then if we decide to move forward, then we'll schedule something further out to deal with it.

Nancy, do you want to add any more to that?

MS. KING: No, that's essentially the process. It's been a while since we've had this, and this will be unique in that we're still remote, but we felt that it was good to be able to finally get this scheduled and allow enough time for those members who may not be able to attend to be able to watch the hearing itself, to facilitate the discussion that will occur at the next scheduled Board meeting.

CHAIRMAN GARD: Has notice been sent out to those people that we think are interested parties on this?

MS. KING: There will be a public notice that we are going to publish on this. I have been in contact with the petitioners about the timing of it, and they're also disseminating that information, but I've asked if there are additional notification requirements that would be beneficial to make sure that we are able to contact all of those who are interested. They've agreed to talk and let me know if there are some other avenues that we can explore to get that information out. We'll also be putting it on our Web site as well.

CHAIRMAN GARD: Okay. Now, the one question that I have is: Are we going to set some sort of a time limit? I know, particularly if we're dealing with engineering companies, they can go on for a while.

(Laughter.)

MS. KING: Well, usually people say that about us lawyers, but I'll take that now. Essentially we, at this point in time -- I know in the past, if -- you know, when we know, because we have a packed room, how many folks are

going to want to testify --

CHAIRMAN GARD: Right.

MS. KING: -- we may want to limit that time frame. I think it's going to be a little more difficult right now. I believe Chris Pedersen has been working with Ryan to get this scheduled. I don't think that we have a specific like time limit on these, but at this point we're thinking that we're going to try to schedule it to last until 4:00, just in case. But I think it's going to be one of those things we're going to kind of have to assess the day of it.

It might be possible or it might be a good idea before the hearing if I can try to reach out to folks and get maybe sort of a ballpark idea of how many folks want to testify on this. I'm not sure that that'll be entirely accurate, but it could give us a good estimation of the number of folks who will want to provide some information.

CHAIRMAN GARD: Right.

MS. KING: I think that that might be the best we're going to do, and then it might kind of be a game-day decision as to whether we

want to provide time limits on testifying. 1 CHAIRMAN GARD: Well, you know, when 2 you're talking to them, just encourage them to be 3 4 concise. MS. KING: I will do so. 5 CHAIRMAN GARD: 6 Okay. Now, this is an Open Forum. 7 8 DR. ALEXANDROVICH: I'm sorry; may I 9 ask a question about that hearing? 10 CHAIRMAN GARD: Yeah, sure. 11 DR. ALEXANDROVICH: Is IDEM planning 12 to put together a presentation on that issue? 13 MS. KING: Yes, IDEM is. We will be 14 presenting -- basically the water program is 15 working on a presentation on -- on their views of the 2012 rec criteria as well. 16 17 DR. ALEXANDROVICH: I'm wondering if that's going to be posted ahead of time for the 18 19 meeting. 20 That, I don't know. MS. KING: 21 not -- this isn't like we're sending this out for 22 people -- you know, we're not getting other

people's testimony ahead of time, so essentially,

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we are testifying just like everyone else.
