At this time, US EPA believes that all of the available documentation regarding the federal involvement, description of area including photographs, maps, drawings and remediation plans has been reviewed. In addition, Indiana Finance Authority (IFA) and Indiana State Historic Preservation Officer (Indiana SHPO) have taken all the necessary steps to identify any potential historic properties. Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. Section 800.11(d), US EPA determines that a finding of no historic properties affected accurately reflects the assessment for the site.

The submittal for the site included information on the federal funding source, site background, historical status of site; sources of historical information and enclosures that included pictures, maps and detailed descriptions of the remediation work proposed for the site.
