

INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION BUSINESS MEETING

June 11, 2009
Indiana Government Center South
Auditorium

Call to Order and Roll Call:

Chairman Timothy Murphy called the meeting to order at approximately 1:00 p.m. local time. A quorum was present.

Present:

Approval of the Minutes:

Upon motion by Tom Swihart, second by Robert Morgan, and the unanimous vote of those present, the Commissioners approved the proposed minutes of the March 19, 2009 business meeting.

Report of the Executive Director:

The Executive Director gave the following staff report: Anne Rady was introduced as the newest field auditor and Jeff Neuenschwander was introduced as the newest staff attorney.

In legislation, two charity gaming bills passed. The first, SE 414, had four provisions: 1) a worker at a festival event may participate in events except for the one which he or she is conducting and they may not participate in any PPT event during the calendar day they conduct such event, 2) charity gaming patrons are only required to provide their name, signature and date of birth upon winning \$250 or more on any PPT, 3) qualified organizations may share reusable licensed supplies acquired prior to January 1, 2009, and; 4) individuals may serve as operators for 3 qualified organizations per month rather than 1.

HEA 1286 removed civic organizations from the eligibility list for annual charity gaming licenses and substituted fraternal organizations. A qualified organization that totally restructures in name with a new tax identification number would be eligible for licensure without waiting five years. Facilities and locations for annual charity gaming nights are limited to use for only

three calendar days per week. Qualified and winner-take-all drawings may be eligible for roll over under specific conditions that do not increase the frequency of the drawing or the maximum limit of award. Driver's license information acquired by the agency is deemed confidential.

HEA 1285 authorized the agency to require the identity of a trustee for each casino licensee to be able to assume operational control of any operation which has a license revocation, a license non-renewal or a failure to transfer the license in a block sale of other casinos. It clarifies that only one supplier's license is required to conduct business with both casinos and racinos. It increases the annual supplier license fee from \$5,000 to \$7,500. It authorizes the agency to issue occupational licenses for period of one, two or three years rather than only one. It requires the horse racing integrity fund assessed to racinos be paid directly to the Horse Racing Commission rather than the IGC.

The last bill was SEA 160. This bill abolished the Boxing Commission and created the State's Athletic Commission which will license and regulate not only boxing but mixed martial arts. It further transfers these responsibilities to the Indiana Gaming Commission. This new commission is independent of the Gaming Commission itself, but will be staffed by existing agency personnel plus new hires. They will be charged with the responsibility of exacting rules to license and regulate mixed martial arts as well as continue its regulatory functions over boxing. This bill becomes effective July 1.

There have been two appellate court decisions since the last meeting. In the first of two opinions from the Supreme Court regarding East Chicago, the court reversed a trial judge's ruling dismissing the Attorney General's request to treat payments between Ameristar and Second Century as potentially a public trust and subject to the doctrine of unjust enrichment. This decision returns these allegations back to the court for trial on the merits. In the appeal by the Foundations of East Chicago against the City, the Court of Appeals ruled the LDA was subject to the authority of the City to change the recipient of the economic development funds at will and therefore did not address the Foundation's claim the 2007 legislation placed in the budget bill at the 11th hour was constitutional. The Foundations have filed a petition to transfer to the Supreme Court. The IGC also filed a Motion for the Supreme Court to accept the case and specifically affirm the Commission's ultimate authority over LDA's.

The Investigation Division has completed the re-investigations of Blue Chip and its parent Boyd Gaming, and Belterra and its corporate owner Pinnacle.

On May 5, Tropicana's reorganization plan was approved in bankruptcy but has not received discharge yet, although such is anticipated. Until then, Tom Dingman remains in operational control of Aztar Casino pursuant to the Commission's agreed power-of-attorney.

An update was given on the exclusions of Zurong Chen and Zhou Qiang Wu, who were placed on the lifetime exclusion list on March 23, and March 29, 2009, for marking cards while playing Blackjack at the French Lick Resort•Casino. Both Mr. Chen and Mr. Wu were given written notice to respond and request an Administrative Hearing, but both failed to respond to said notice.

Waiver of Rules and Regulations:

Argosy was granted a waiver allowing 4, 5 or 6 designated areas of wagering on blackjack layouts.

Belterra was granted a waiver allowing the dealer, after cutting the cards, to insert the cut card up to one half of one deck from the back of the stack. Granted a waiver allowing 3, 4, 5 or 6 designated areas of wagering on blackjack layouts.

Grand Victoria was granted a waiver allowing 4, 5 or 6 designated areas of wagering on blackjack layouts.

Hoosier Park's request was approved to place dedicated coverage on progressive displays showing incrementation when the display reads a minimum of \$40,000. The revenue audit department will be responsible for daily verification of the incremented amounts.

Majestic Star was approved a request to allow a total of 3 full time on-site internal auditors for Majestic I and II instead of the required 2 for each casino. They were also granted a waiver allowing the dealer, after cutting the cards, to insert the cut card up to one half of one deck from the back of the stack.

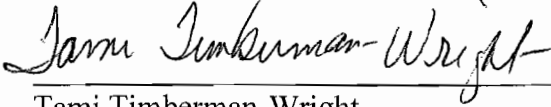

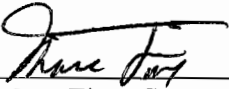
