**Method used to calculate savings description:**

Based on the average cost per home allowance in the Grant Cycle of \$8,000, Indiana's weatherization network is projected to complete 5902 units during the Grant Cycle.

5902 units weatherized multiplied by 29.3 MBTU yields the total estimated energy saved for this cycle by DOE funded weatherization work as 172,929 of the cycle.

**IV.4 DOE-Funded Leveraging Activities**

At this time, we do not set aside DOE funds for a leveraging program.

However, sub-grantees routinely leverage their funds against other programs and utility funds in order to weatherize more homes.

**IV.7 Miscellaneous**

<p>Multi-Family</p> <p>Because the state of Indiana does not have a large history of multi-family projects, IHCDA plans to become a sub-grantee in order to manage multi-family projects instead of allowing existing sub-grantees to perform the work related to large multi-family projects. The state will contract with vendor(s) who will do the work on multi-family, but IHCDA will be responsible for the additional work and reporting that is necessary with large multi-family projects.</p> <p>IHCDA also plans to hold back \$1,043,031.00 of it's T&amp;TA allocation to allocate to sub-grantee upon request. This is reflected on the allocation given to State of Indiana in the Annual File breakdown.</p> <p>IHCDA will retain 10% of BIL production funding to develop, implement, and execute a supplemental multi-family fund. Sub-grantees may not perform multi-family projects with their BIL allocation. Sub-grantees are not prohibited from participating in this multi-family program, though other entities will also be able to participate.</p> <p>Accordingly with Davis Bacon Act compliance, any BIL-funded weatherization work on multifamily buildings with no fewer than 5 units will be required to pay</p>
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wages to all laborers and mechanics engaged in the construction, alteration, or repair of those multifamily buildings (whether employed by a contractor or subcontractor) wages "at rates not less than those prevailing on similar projects in the locality, as determined by the Secretary of Labor." WPN BIL 22-1

**Buy American**

The BIL included a new "Buy America, Build America" section which created a number of new responsibilities and requirements, including a new—permanent—Buy American domestic preference requirement for all iron, steel, manufactured products, and construction materials used in certain financial assistance projects. This new requirement applies to "infrastructure projects," as those terms are defined by the act:

"Projects" is defined as the "construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of infrastructure in the United States."

- "Infrastructure" includes the structures, facilities, and equipment for, in the United States:
- Roads, highways, and bridges;
- Public transportation;
- Dams, ports, harbors, and other maritime facilities;
- Intercity passenger and freight railroads;
- Airports;
- Water systems, including drinking water and wastewater systems;
- Electrical transmission facilities and systems;
- Utilities;
- Broadband infrastructure; and
- Buildings and real property.

Though requirements and applicability are still being internally determined, it is a near-certainty that this requirement will apply to WAP-funded work. DOE must start applying this domestic preference requirement no later than May 14, 2022. A waiver process will be available, but waivers will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and approval will depend on the specific facts and circumstances involved. Recipients should plan on exhausting all available options before applying for a waiver.

Though this requirement is not being enforced yet, recipients should begin planning activities, such as ensuring any supplies of iron, steel, manufactured goods, or construction materials can certify, in writing, that their products are manufactured domestically. Other guidance and instructions will be provided as it is developed. WPN BIL 22-1.

Buy American Act only applies to publicly owned units that are to be weatherized.

**Sub-grantee Replacement**

The sub-grantee, People Working Cooperatively (PWC), stopped doing Weatherization work in Indiana as of September 30, 2022. They covered three counties that are now being handled by existing sub-grantees. Work in Wayne and Fayette counties is being done by ICAP; work in Union County is being done by SIEOC.
