WHAT IS THE HOUSING INVENTORY COUNT?



Inventory of organizations, projects, and beds in 91/92 counties in the Indiana BoS available for unhoused persons.



It lists all agencies serving people experiencing homelessness and shows the utilization rate of each project.

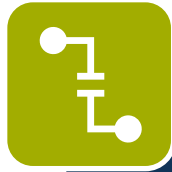


Provides insights about the current homeless system in Indiana. It sparks conversations on how to make it more efficient.

WHAT IS THE POINT-IN-TIME COUNT?



A count of unhoused people in a single night of January. This year, the count was on Wednesday, January 25th.



The count is divided in sheltered and unsheltered counts. Sheltered count includes people in ES, SH, and TH.



It informs of the number and characteristics of people experiencing homelessness.

BIG WINS IN 2023!



71% county participation in this year's counts!



More efficient housing using available beds:

- 5 percentage point increase of the utilization rate from 2022 and decrease in avg days homeless in LSA data



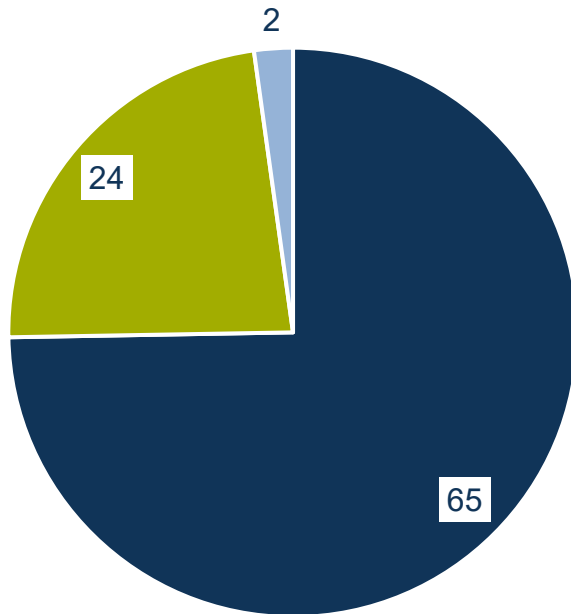
Improved data quality and preliminary results review resulted in reflective counts.



Outreach efforts were a gamechanger!

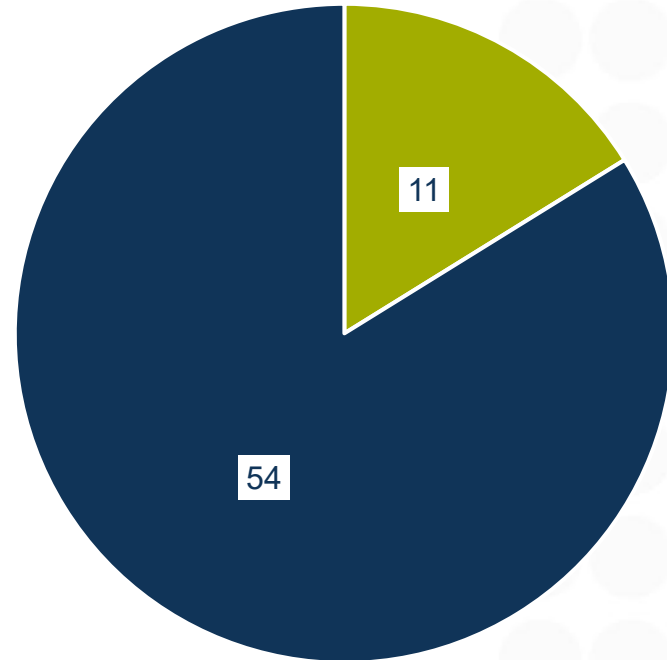
COUNTY PARTICIPATION IN THE 2023 PIT COUNT

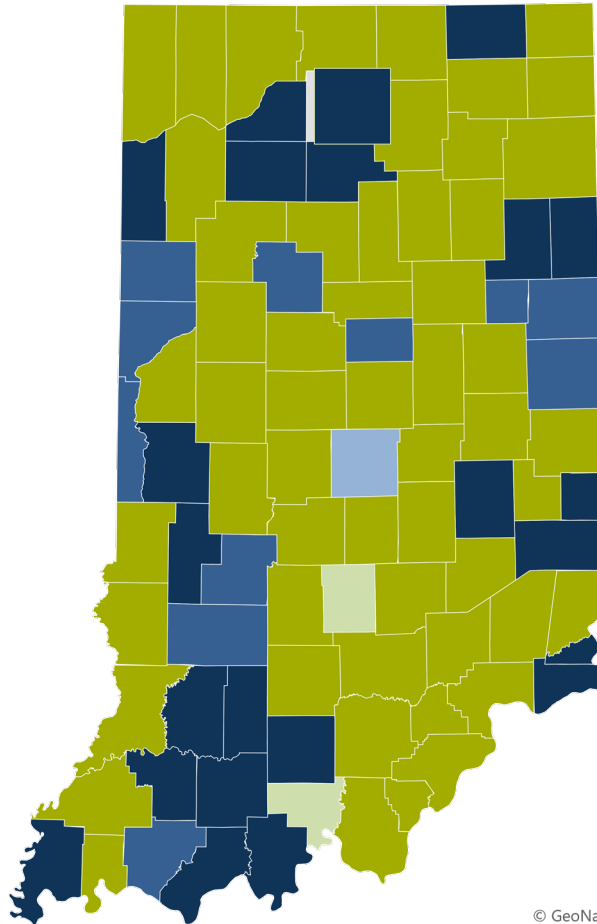

MAP OF COUNTIES THAT PARTICIPATED IN THE 2023 PIT

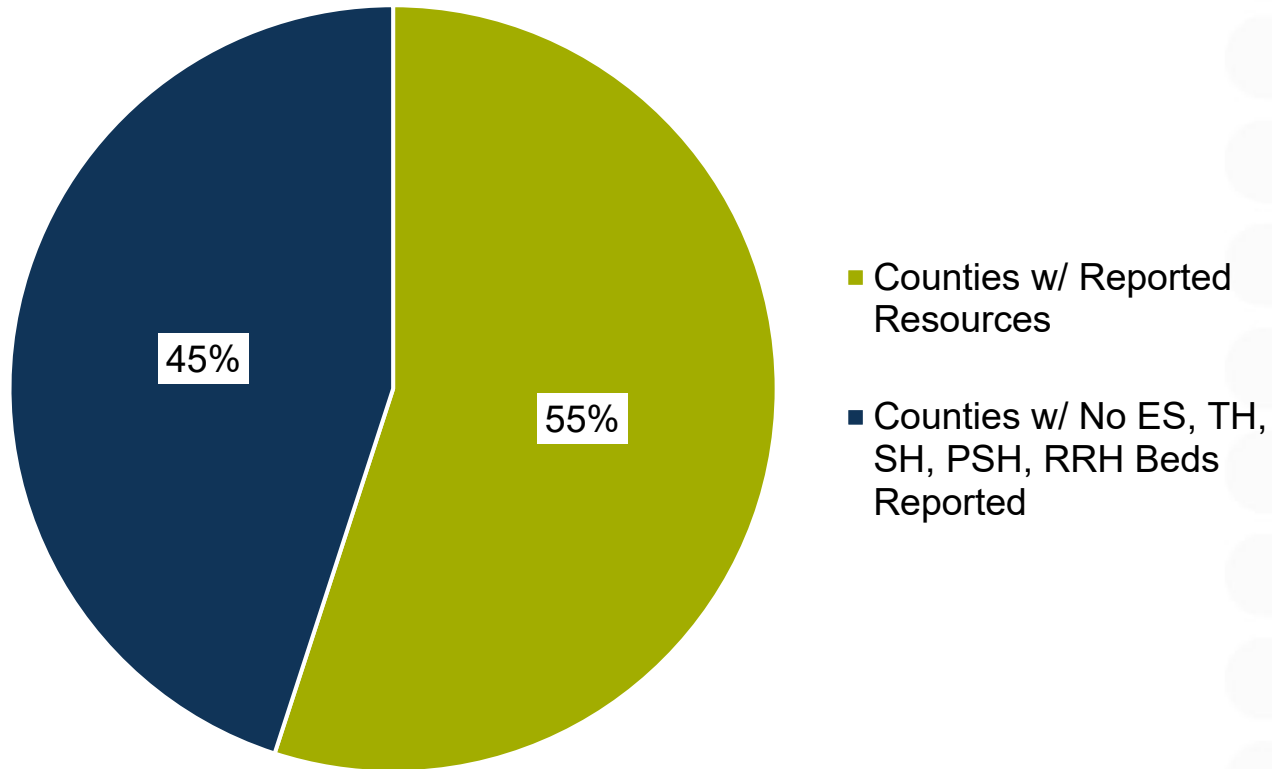

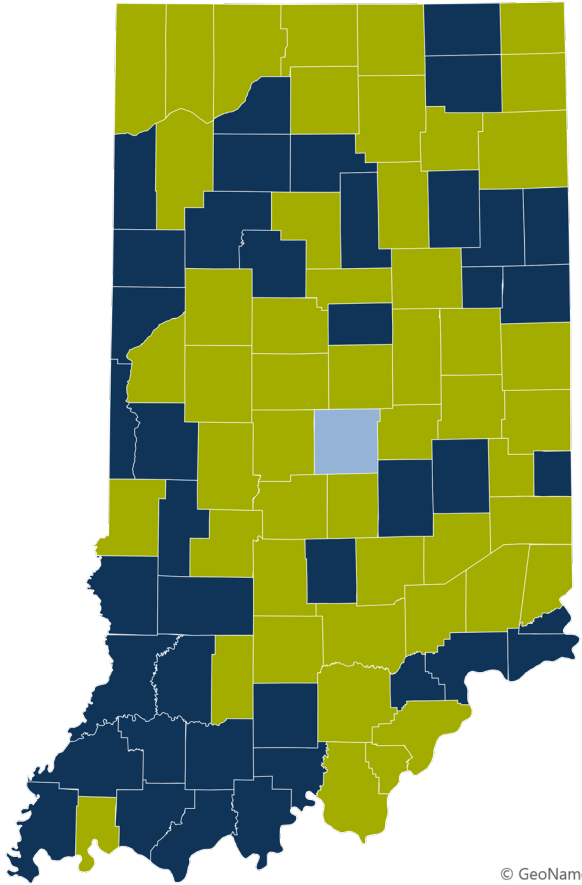

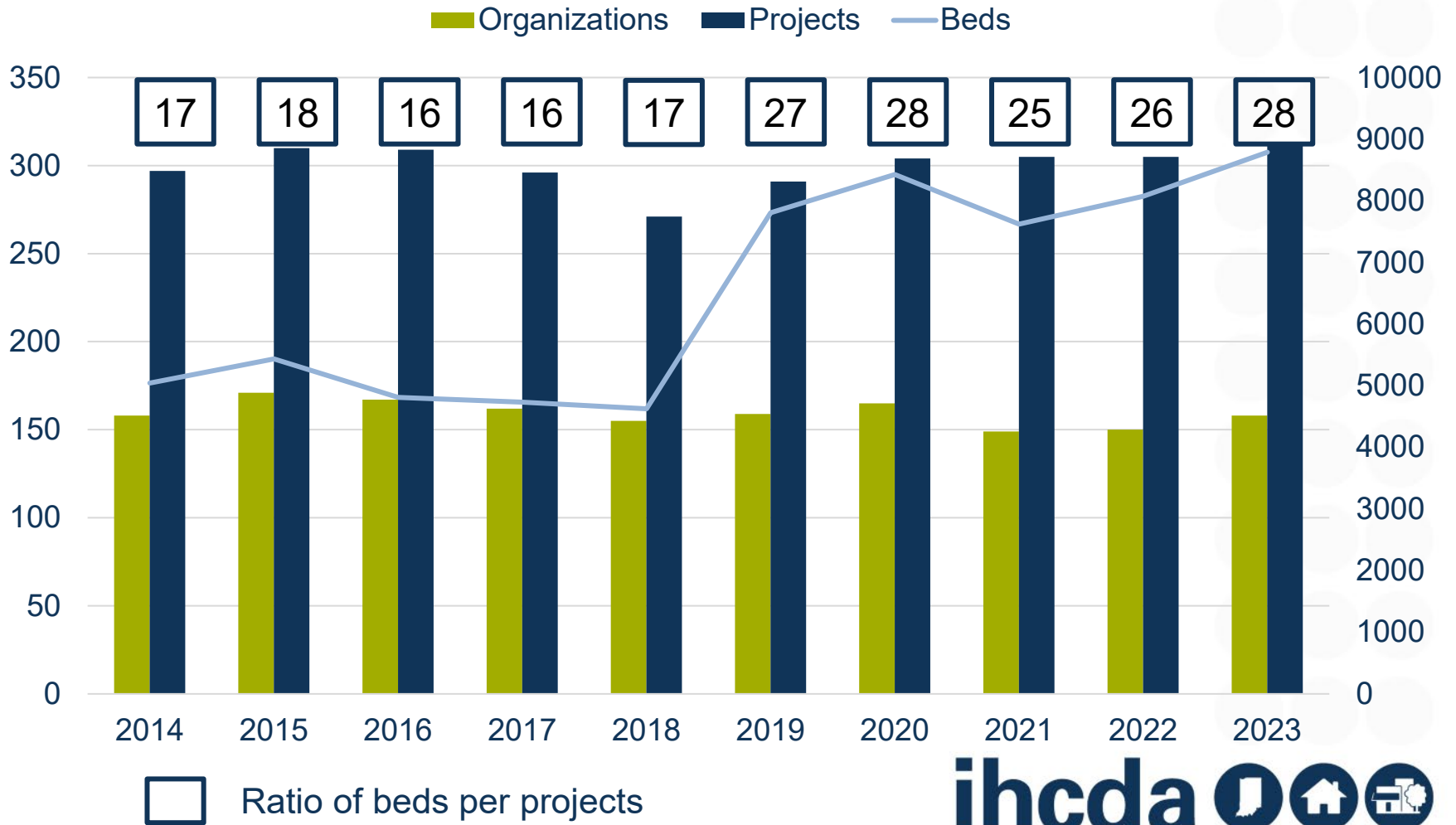

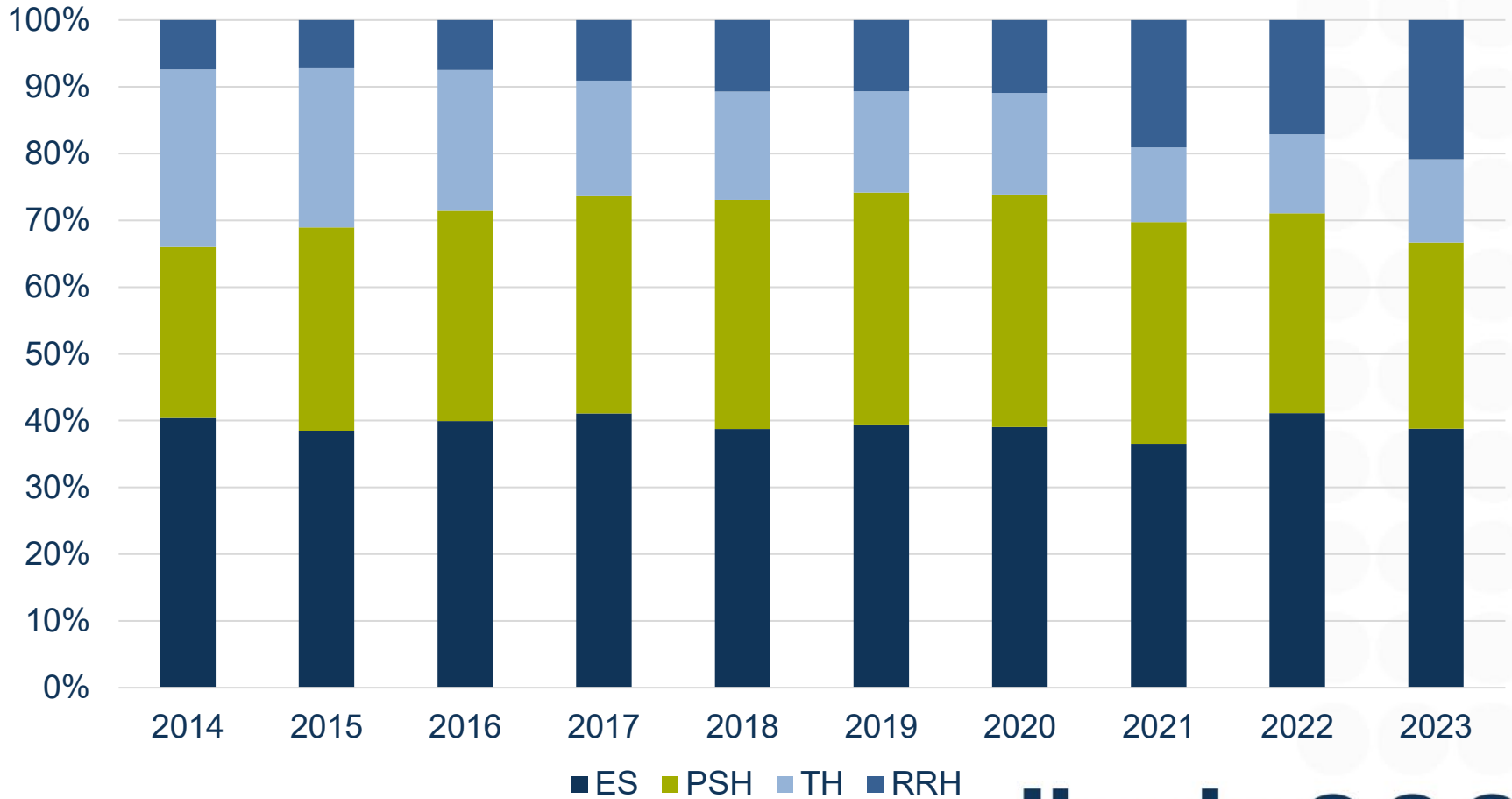

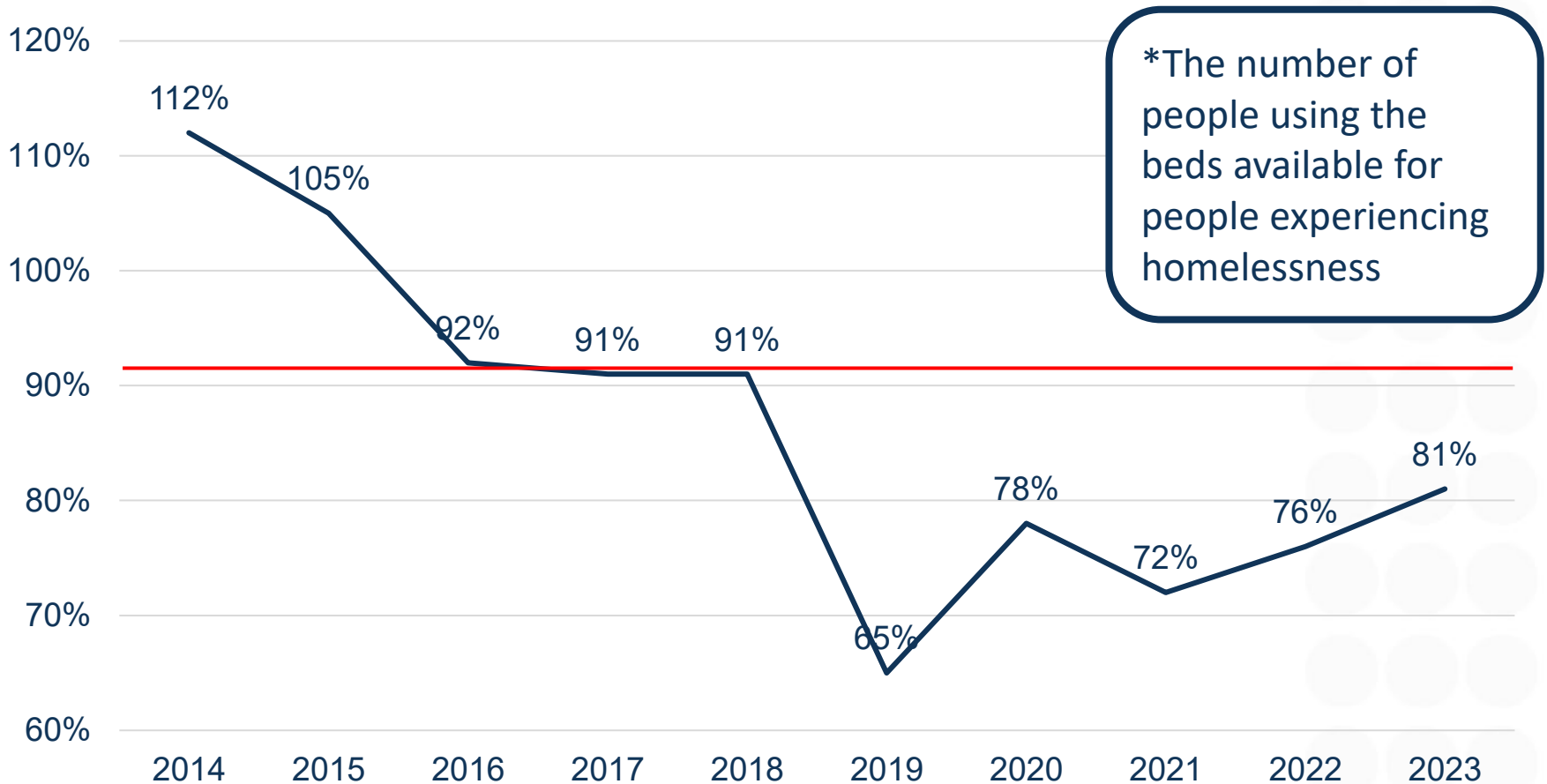

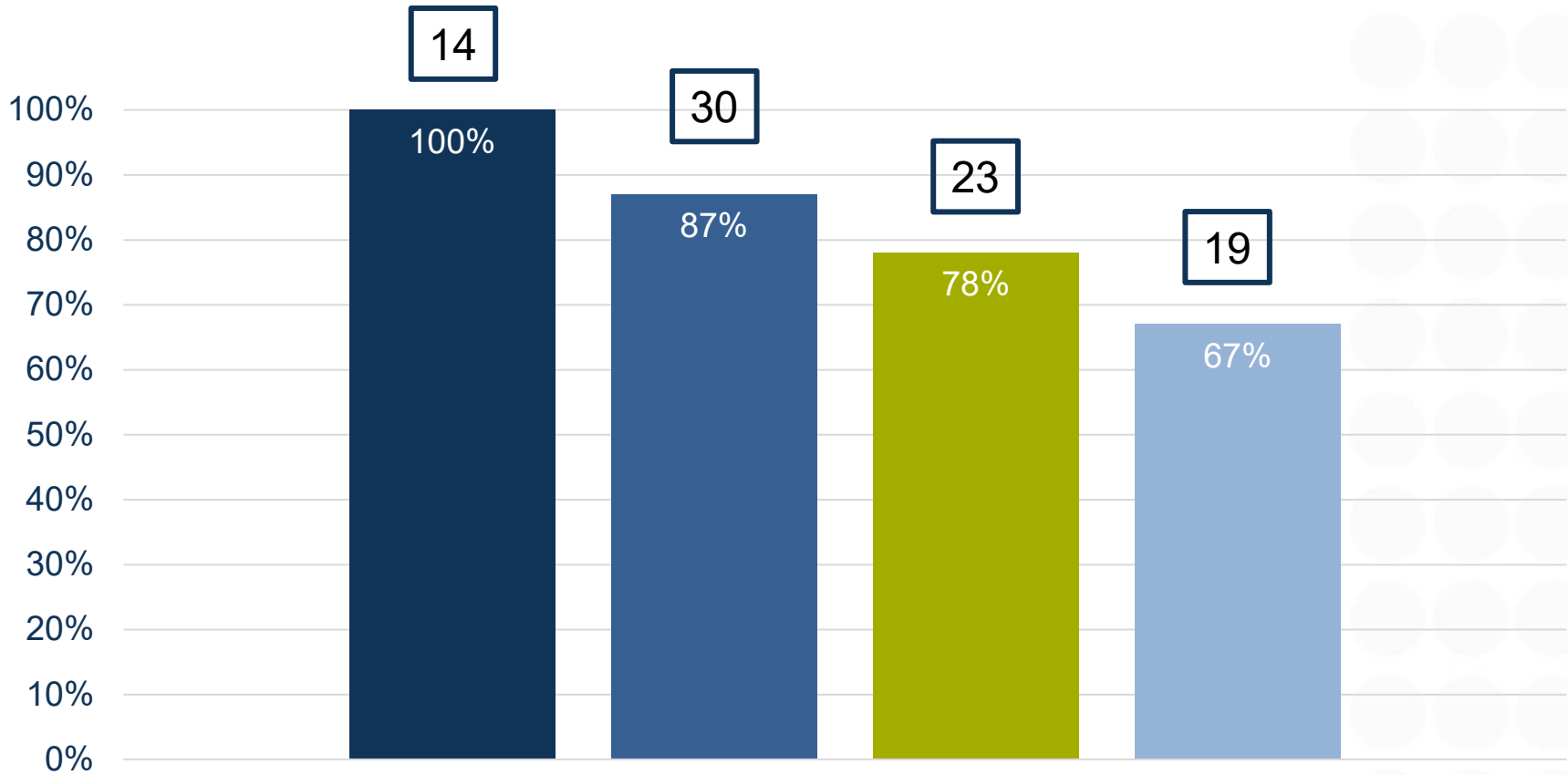
SHARE PER PROJECT TYPE 2014 – 2023

HIC HIGHLIGHTS



28 beds on average per project



9% increase in the total number of beds from 2022



RRH projects almost doubled since 2014 due to ESG-CV



Transitional projects halved since 2014



PSH projects serve on average 30 people using 28 beds.

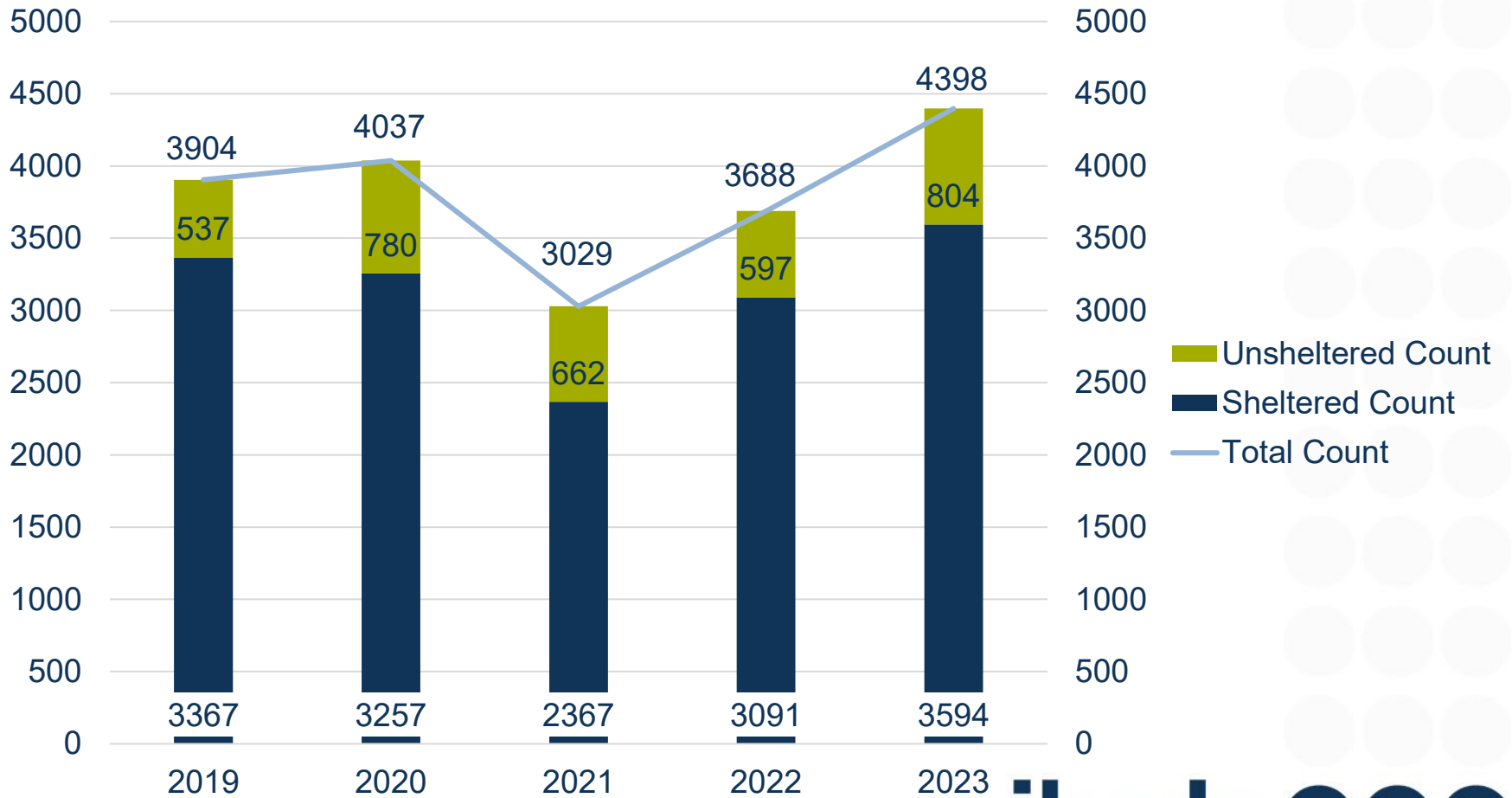

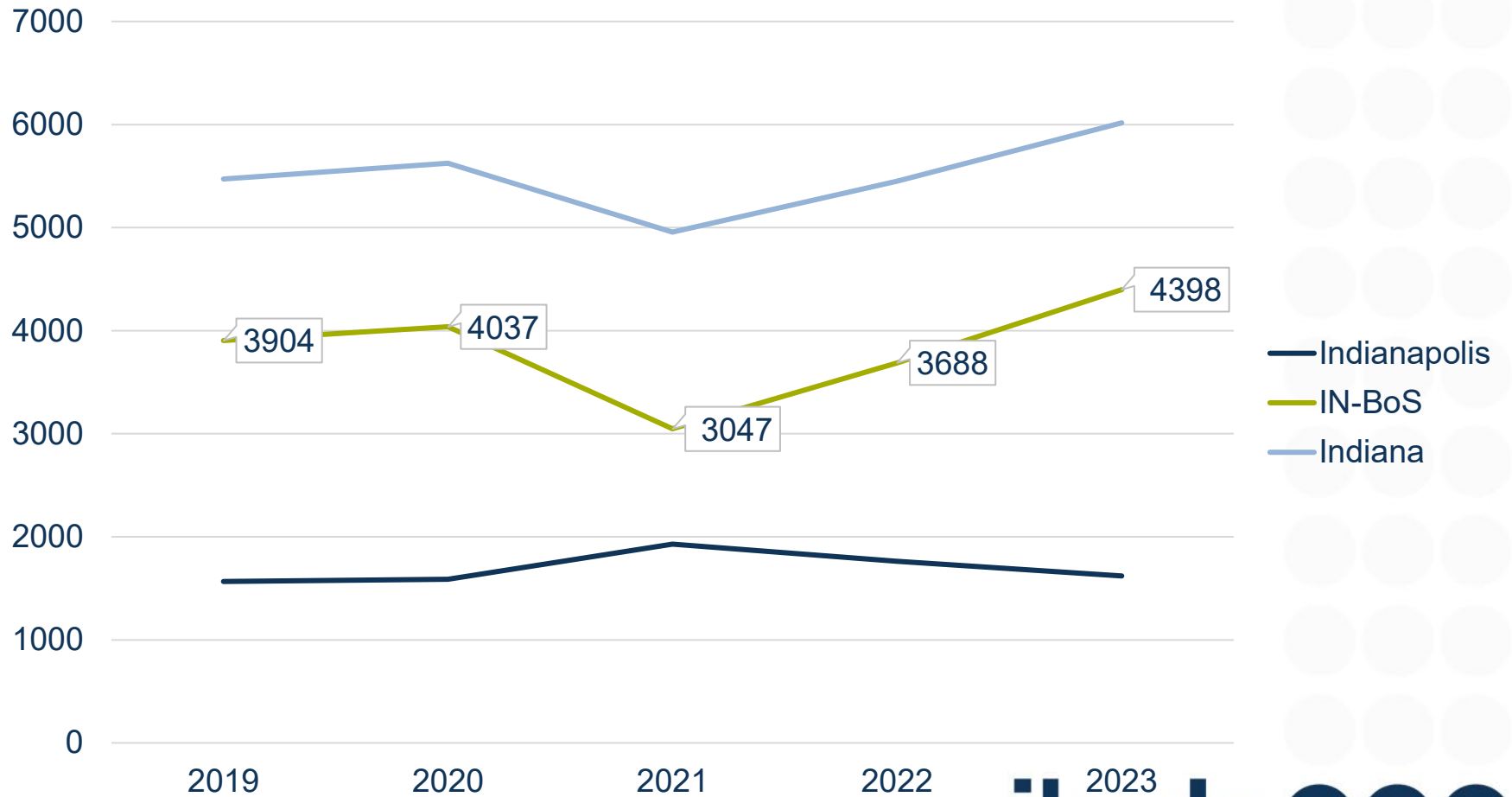

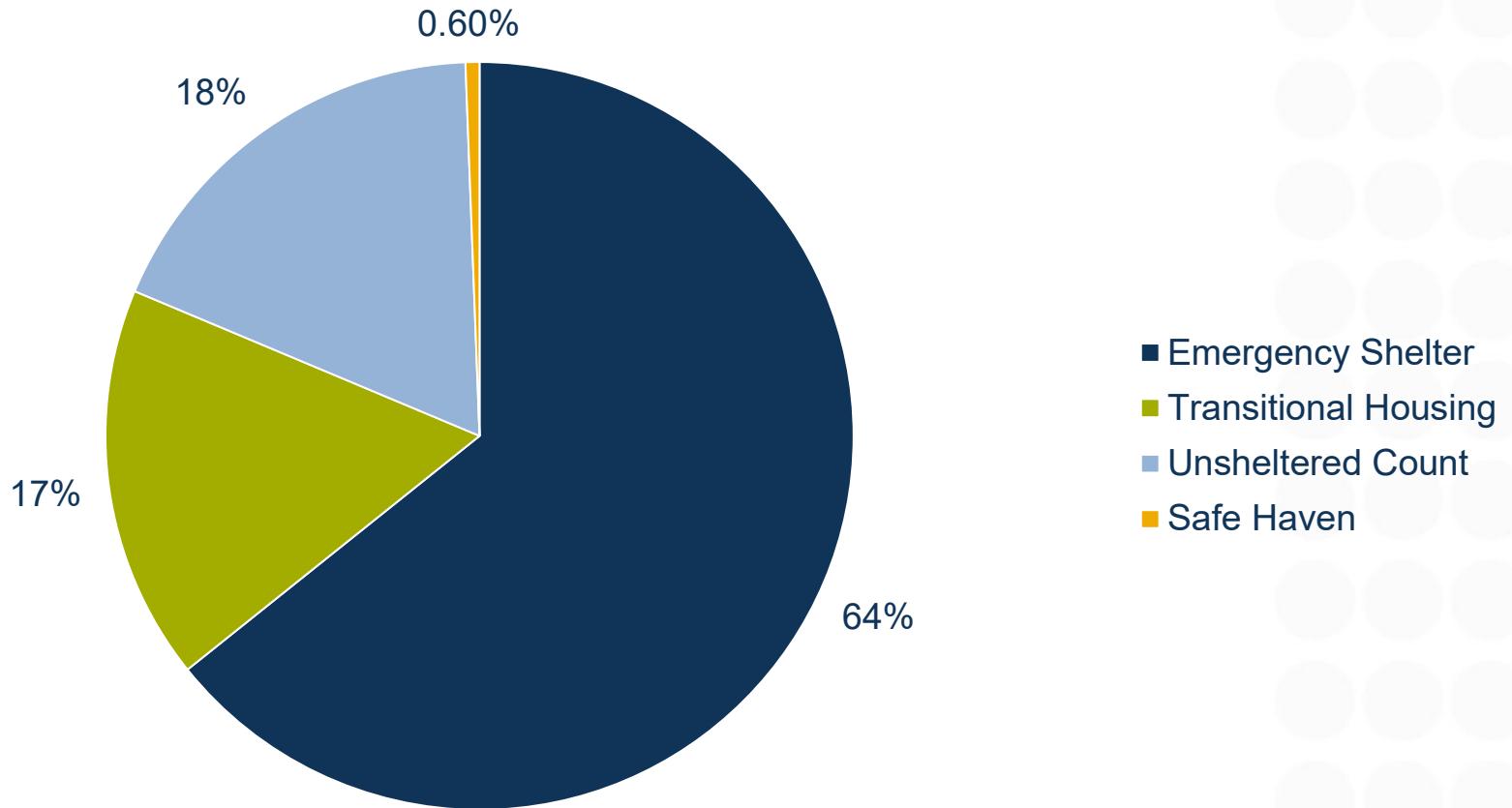
SHELTERED AND UNSHELTERED COUNT FROM 2019-2023



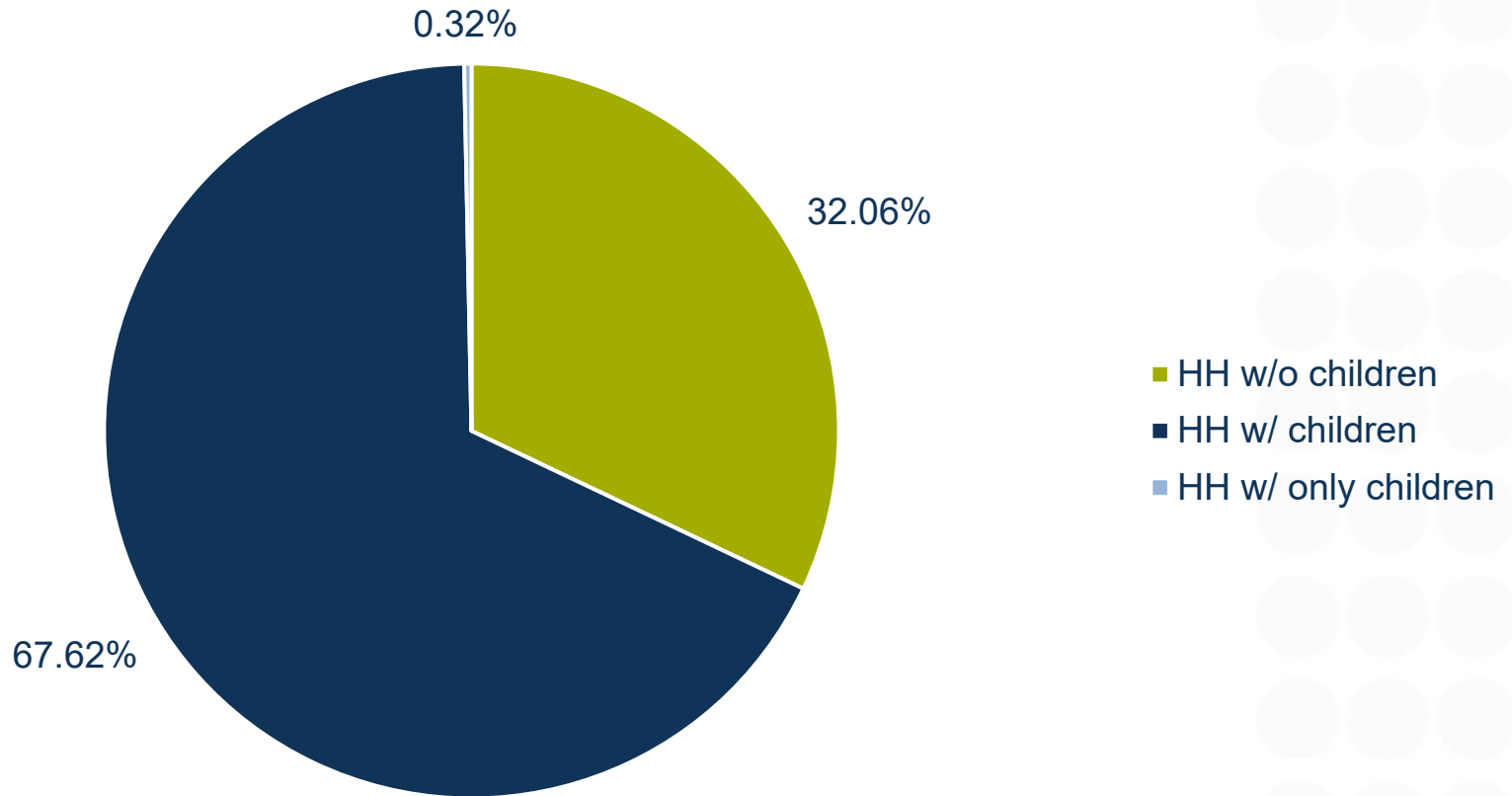
POINT IN TIME TRENDS FOR IN 2019 – 2023



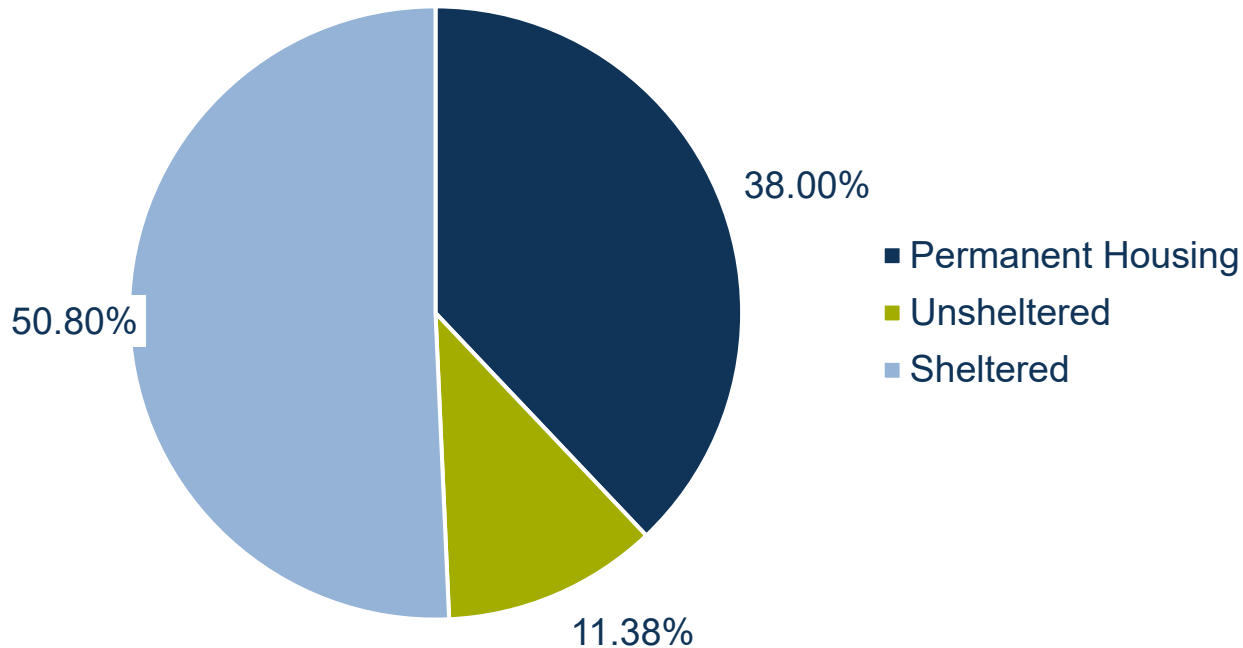
SHARE OF PEOPLE COUNTED PER PROJECT TYPE



SHARE OF PEOPLE PER HOUSEHOLD

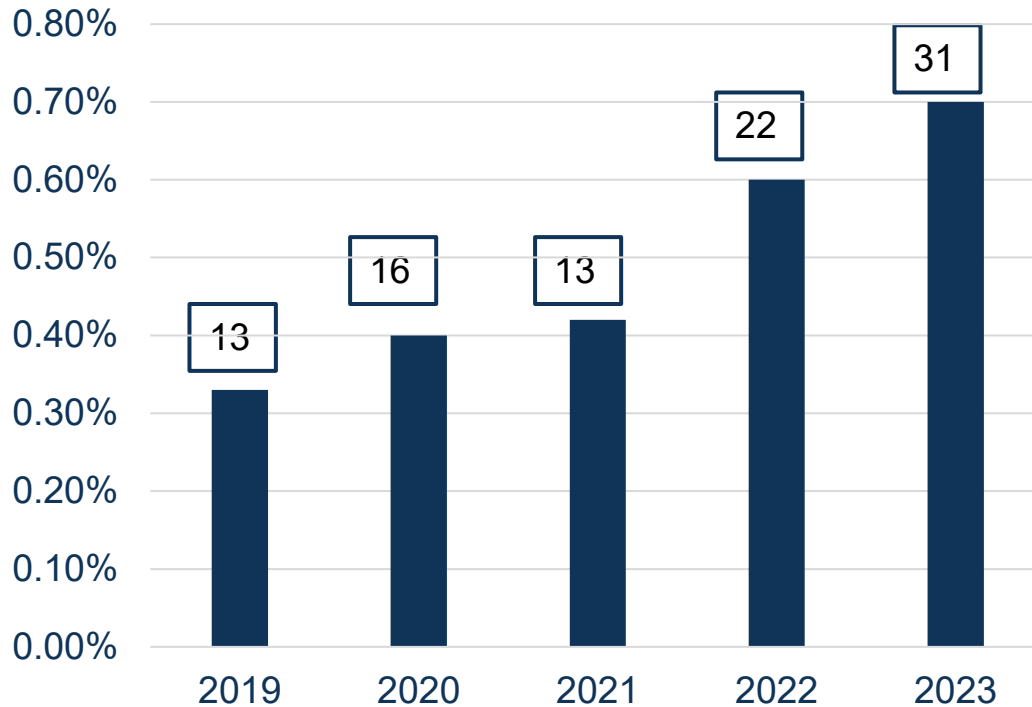


ANOTHER PERSPECTIVE ON THE PIT



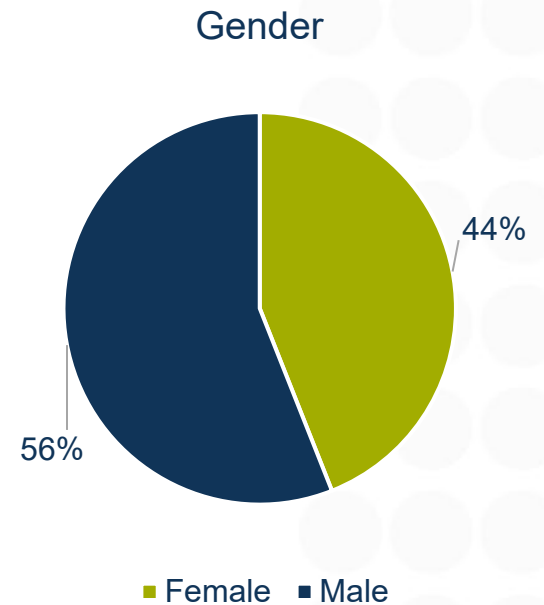
“Permanent Housing” refers to people who are in PSH or OPH.

GENDER BREAKDOWN

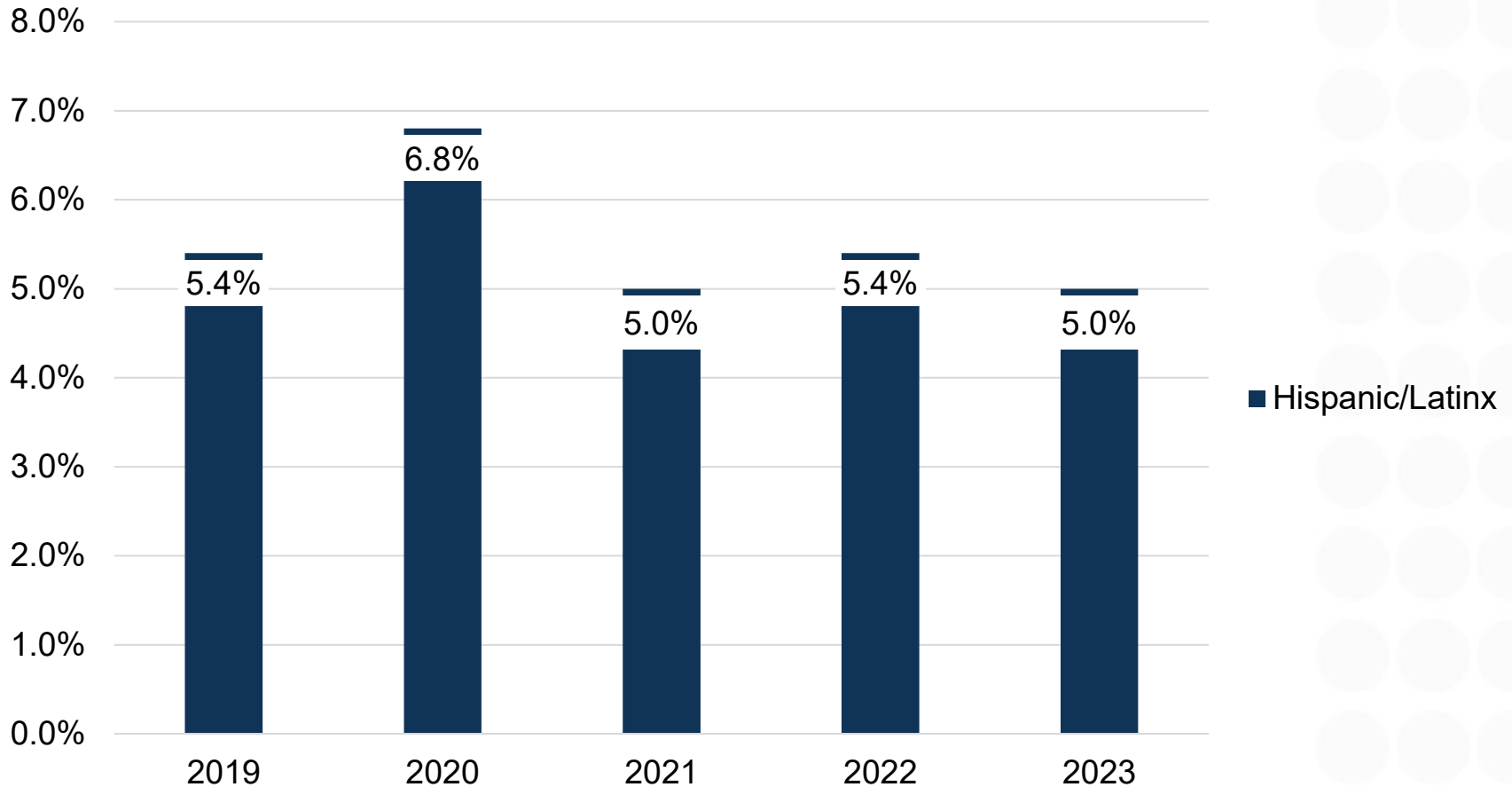


■ % People Who Identify with Other Genders

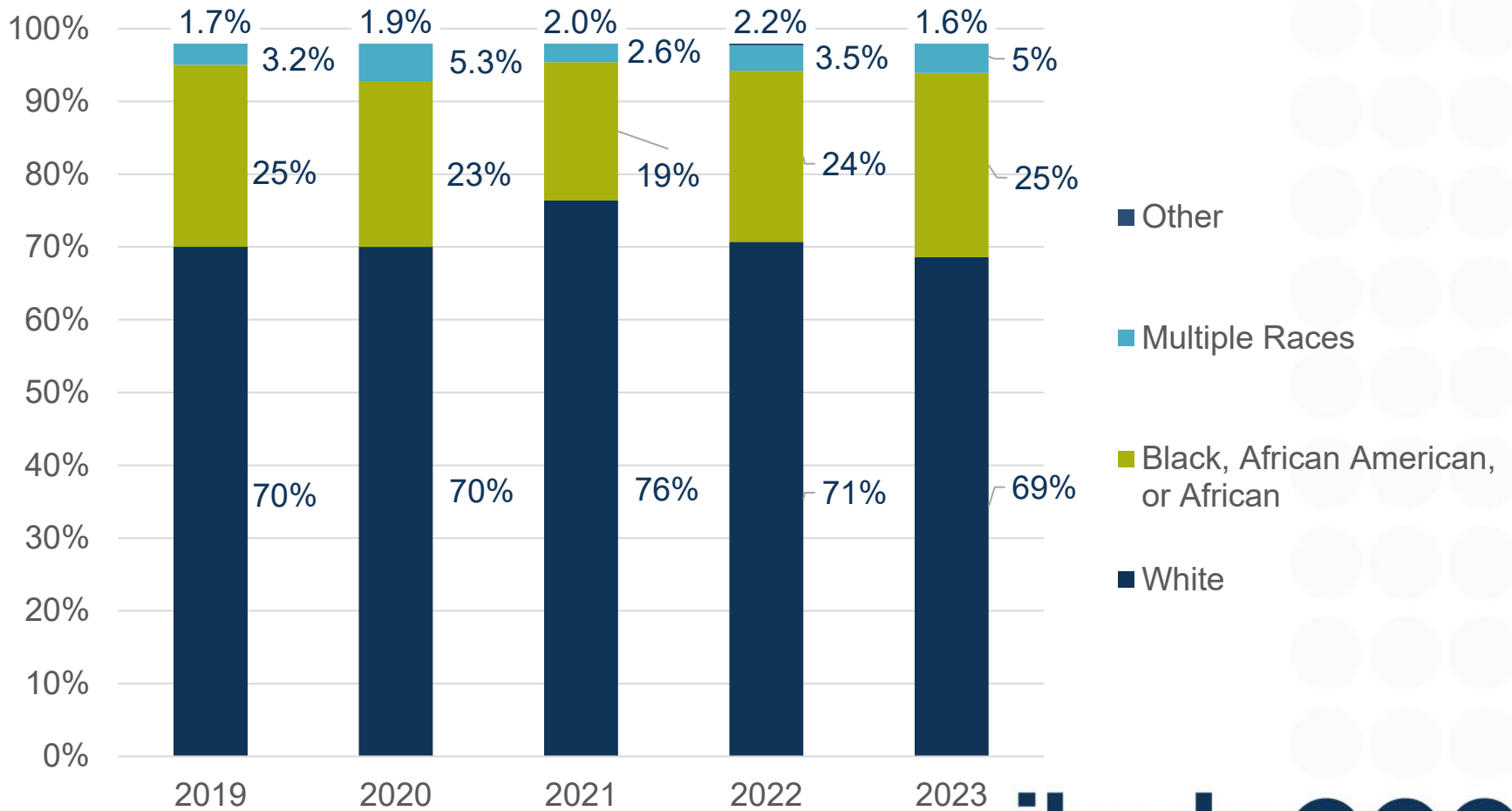
□ Number of People Who Identify with Other Genders



REPORTED ETHNICITY FOR THE TOTAL PIT POPULATION

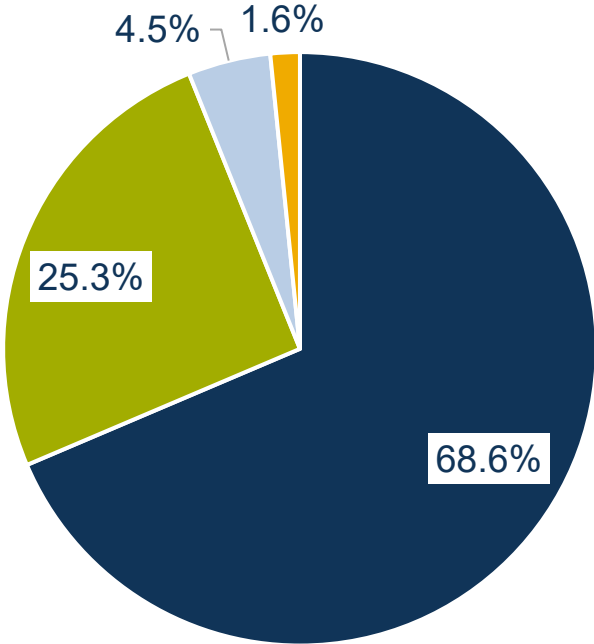


RACE REPRESENTATION 2019 – 2023

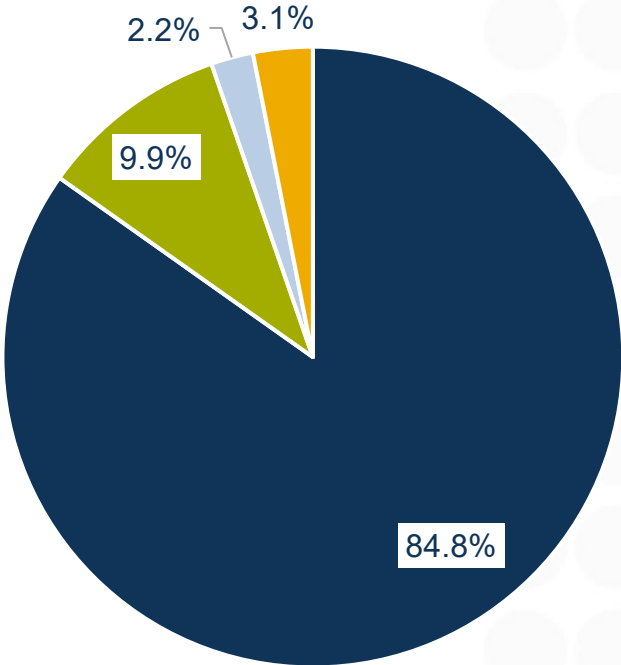


2023 INDIANA CENSUS AND BOS RACE COMPARISON

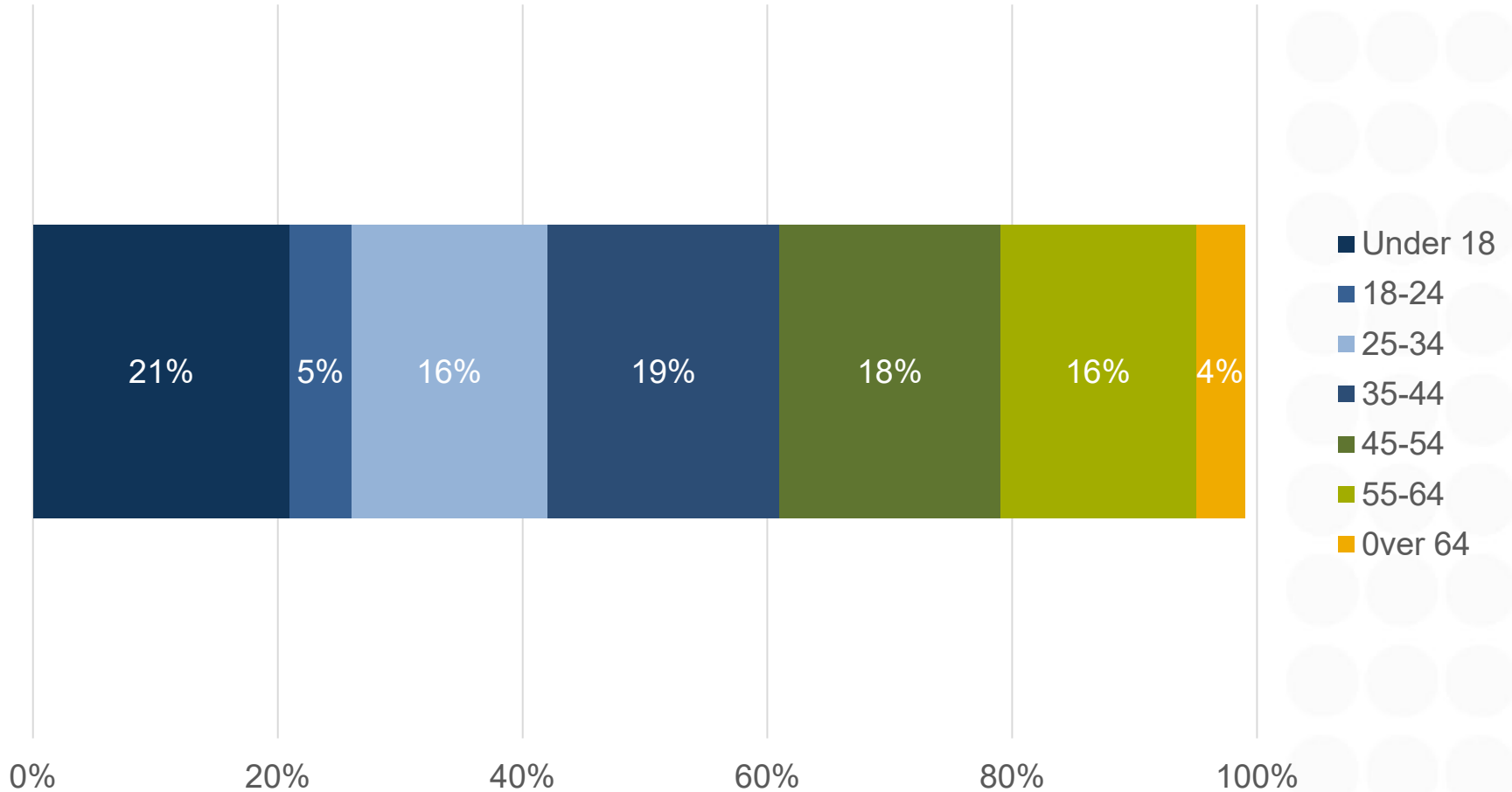

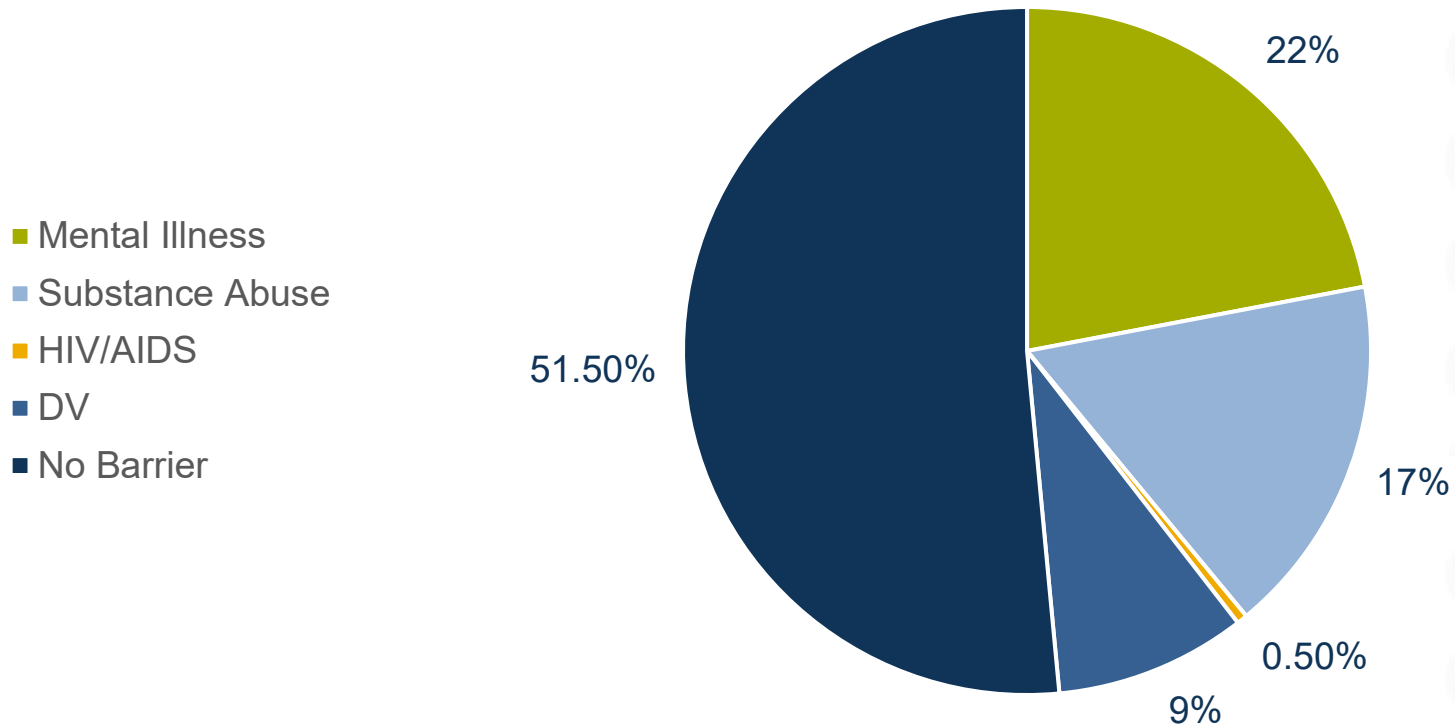

SELF-REPORTED BARRIERS FROM THE 2023 COUNT



VETERAN TOTALS



328 people were in veteran households



306 out of the 328 people were veterans themselves



Out of the 306 veterans, 35 were chronically homeless

PIT TAKEAWAYS



There was a 19% increase in the number of people counted from 2022



88.8% of people counted were in sheltered situations



African-Americans, Blacks, or Africans are overrepresented when compared with state census data



There were 17 less chronically homeless veterans compared to last year.



1 in 5 people who experience homelessness are minors
