Kosciusko County and the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) intend to proceed with a project involving the extension of CR 1300 N to SR 15 in Kosciusko County, Indiana. This letter is part of the early coordination phase of the environmental review process. We are requesting comments from your area of expertise regarding any possible environmental effects associated with this project. Please use the above designation number (Des. No.) and description in your reply. We will incorporate your comments into a study of the project's environmental impacts.

This project is in northern Kosciusko County north of the Town of Milford, Indiana. The east terminus is located east of the intersection of CR 1300 N and old SR 15, and the western terminus is at SR 15. Specifically, the project is located in Sections 4, 5, 8, and 9, Township 34 North, Range 6 East, as shown on the Milford, Indiana 7.5 minute quadrangle map. The purpose of this project is to address the bottleneck of traffic in the Town of Milford and the Town of Milford Junction between CR 1300 N and SR 15. The need for this project is the lack of a direct connection between CR 1300 N and SR 15. The area north of the Town of Milford has been identified by the North Central Regional Logistics Council as a bottleneck, partly because CR 1300 N does not directly connect to SR 15. Traffic at the existing western terminus of CR 1300 N must be diverted either north to Milford Junction or south to the Town of Milford. Both options for traffic leads to an at-grade crossing of the Norfolk Southern Railroad. CR 1300 N is utilized heavily by truck traffic and local school buses to access SR 15.

This project proposes to extend CR 1300 N to the west to SR 15. An overpass bridge will be constructed to eliminate the need to use the at-grade crossings of the Norfolk Southern Railroad in the Town of Milford and the Town of Milford Junction. Main Street will be realigned to the east to allow for the new bridge to cross both the Norfolk Southern Railroad and Main Street. A signalized intersection may also be installed at the intersection of the proposed CR 1300 N extension and SR 15. The proposed bridge and roadway will provide two 12-foot wide travel lanes, one in each direction, with 4-foot wide shoulders. The bridge will provide a clear roadway width of 32 feet. Traffic is anticipated to be maintained through closure of Main Street and a detour. The detour route will likely utilize E South Street, Old SR 15, and E Syracuse Street and will be approximately 1.35 miles in length. Lane restrictions will likely be necessary for the installation of the traffic signals at the intersection of the proposed CR 1300 N and SR 15. Approximately 11 acres of permanent right of way is anticipated to be necessary for this project. Right of way quantities will be defined during the design process. Project letting is anticipated to be in May 2021.

Land use in the vicinity of the project is primarily agricultural and industrial. The H R Weisser Airport is west of the proposed crossing of CR 1300 N and Main Street. The USFWS range-wide programmatic informal consultation for the Indiana bat and northern long-eared bat will be completed

for this project. An historical investigation will be completed to satisfy the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. An ecological investigation into water resources in the project area will be completed to determine the presence or absence of jurisdictional water features.

Please respond with comments, questions, and concerns within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of this letter; if no response is received, it will be assumed that your agency feels that there are no adverse effects incurred as a result of this proposed project. However, should you find that an extension to the response time is necessary, a reasonable amount may be granted upon request. If our agency has regulatory jurisdiction over the project, the recommendations contained in this letter may become requirements of any permit issued. If we do not

have permitting authority, all recommendations are voluntary.

Regulatory Assessment:

Formal approval by the Department of Natural Resources under the regulatory programs administered by the Division of Water is not required for this project.

Natural Heritage Database:

The Natural Heritage Program's data have been checked.

To date, no plant or animal species listed as state or federally threatened, endangered,

or rare have been reported to occur in the project vicinity.

Fish & Wildlife Comments:

The measures below should be implemented to avoid, minimize, or compensate for impacts to fish, wildlife, and botanical resources:

- Revegetate all bare and disturbed areas with a mixture of grasses (excluding all varieties of tall fescue) and legumes as soon as possible upon completion; low endophyte tall fescue may be used in the ditch bottom and side slopes only.
- 2. Do not excavate in the waterway and minimize disturbance to bank vegetation and contain disturbance to within the project limits.
- 3. Do not cut any trees suitable for Indiana bat or Northern Long-eared bat roosting (greater than 5 inches dbh, living or dead, with loose hanging bark, or with cracks, crevices, or cavities) from April 1 through September 30.
- 4. Appropriately designed measures for controlling erosion and sediment must be implemented to prevent sediment from entering the stream or leaving the construction site; maintain these measures until construction is complete and all disturbed areas are stabilized.
- 5. Seed and protect all disturbed streambanks and slopes not protected by other methods that are 3:1 or steeper with erosion control blankets that are heavy-duty, biodegradable, and net free or that use loose-woven / Leno-woven netting to minimize the entrapment and snaring of small-bodied wildlife such as snakes and turtles (follow manufacturer's recommendations for selection and installation); seed and apply mulch on all other disturbed areas.
- 6. Do not excavate or place fill in any riparian wetland.

This is in response to your October 8, 2019, letter requesting comments on a proposed project to extend County Road (CR) 1300N westward approximately 0.44 mile to connect with State Road (SR) 15 in Kosciusko County, Indiana (Des. No. 1801935). The project purpose is to relieve traffic bottlenecks by providing a direct connection from CR 1300N to SR 15. A bridge would be constructed to pass CR 1300N over a railroad track (Norfolk Southern) and Main Street. A section of Main Street would be realigned eastward to pass under the new bridge alongside the railroad track. The roadway extension is about 100 feet northward of the existing path of CR 1300N; therefore, a section of the existing CR 1300N would be realigned to make the transition. The project also involves work areas on both SR 15 and Old SR 15 to accommodate intersection with the CR 1300N. The following information is provided in accordance with our responsibilities under our Regulatory and Civil Works Programs.

Your project may require a Department of the Army Permit, pursuant to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act and/or Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899. Any of the proposed work that occurs within a water of the United States or adjacent wetlands, will likely require prior authorization through our regulatory permit process. For further information on permit requirements and the application process, please contact the Michiana Branch, Regulatory Office, South Bend, Indiana, at 574-232-1952.

There are no current plans under our Civil Works Program to develop waterways in the vicinity of your project; nor do we have any current or proposed flood risk management studies for the area described in your letter.

The project work is not within a Federally delineated floodplain. However, the Preston Miles Ditch passes under and follows close to SR 15 in the vicinity of the intersection work to connect CR 1300N with SR 15. We recommend that you coordinate with local officials and with the Indiana Department of Natural Resources regarding the applicability of a floodplain permit prior to construction. This coordination would help ensure compliance with local and state floodplain management regulations and acts, such as the Indiana Flood Control Act (IC 13-2-22). If you obtain information

that any part of your project would impact the floodplain, you should consider other alternatives that, to the extent possible, avoid or minimize adverse impacts associated with use of the floodplain.

We appreciate the opportunity to comment on the proposed project to extend CR 1300N westward approximately 0.44 mile to connect with SR 15 in Kosciusko County, Indiana. 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

RE: This project will extend CR 1300 N over the Norfolk Southern Railroad and Main Street via an overpass bridge in Kosciusko County, Indiana. Des No. 1801935.

This letter from the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) serves as a standardized response to enquiries inviting IDEM comments on roadway construction, reconstruction, or other improvement projects within existing roadway corridors when the proposed scope of the project is beneath the threshold requiring a formal National Environmental Policy Act-mandated Environmental Assessment or Environmental Impact Statement. As the letter attempts to address all roadway-related environmental topics of potential concern, it is possible that not every topic addressed in the letter will be applicable to your particular roadway project.

For additional information on specific roadway-related topics of interest, please visit the appropriate Web pages cited below, many of which provide contact information for persons within the various program areas who can answer questions not fully addressed in this letter. Also please be mindful that some environmental requirements may be subject to change and so each person intending to include a copy of this letter in their project documentation packet is advised to download the most recently revised version of the letter; found at: http://www.in.gov/idem/5283.htm (http://www.in.gov/idem/5283.htm).

To ensure that all environmentally-related issues are adequately addressed, IDEM recommends that you read this letter in its entirety, and consider each of the following issues as you move forward with the planning of your proposed roadway construction, reconstruction, or improvement project:

WATER AND BIOTIC QUALITY

1. Section 404 of the Clean Water Act requires that you obtain a permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) before discharging dredged or fill materials into any wetlands or other waters, such as rivers, lakes, streams, and ditches. Other activities regulated include the relocation, channelization, widening, or other such alteration of a stream, and the mechanical clearing (use of heavy construction equipment) of wetlands. Thus, as a project owner or sponsor, it is your responsibility to ensure that no wetlands are disturbed without the proper permit. Although you may initially refer to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service National Wetland Inventory maps as a means of identifying potential areas of concern, please be mindful that those maps do not depict jurisdictional wetlands regulated by the USACE or the Department of Environmental Management. A valid jurisdictional wetlands determination can only be made by the USACE, using the 1987 Wetland Delineation Manual.

USACE recommends that you have a consultant check to determine whether your project will abut, or lie within, a wetland area. To view a list of consultants that have requested to be included on a list posted by the USACE on their Web site, see USACE Permits and Public Notices

Much of northern Indiana (Newton, Lake, Porter, LaPorte, St. Joseph, Elkhart, LaGrange, Steuben, and Dekalb counties; large portions of Jasper, Starke, Marshall, Noble, Allen, and Adams counties; and lesser portions of Benton, White, Pulaski, Kosciusko, and Wells counties) is served by the USACE District Office in Detroit (313-226-6812). The central and southern portions of the state (large portions of Benton, White, Pulaski, Kosciosko, and Wells counties; smaller portions of Jasper, Starke, Marshall, Noble, Allen, and Adams counties; and all other Indiana counties located in north-central, central, and southern Indiana) are served by the USACE Louisville District Office (502-315-6733).

IDEM recommends that impacts to wetlands and other water resources be avoided to the fullest extent.

- 2. In the event a Section 404 wetlands permit is required from the USACE, you also must obtain a Section 401 Water Quality Certification from the IDEM Office of Water Quality Wetlands Program. - 3. If the USACE determines that a wetland or other water body is isolated and not subject to Clean Water Act regulation, it is still regulated by the state of Indiana. A State Isolated Wetland permit from IDEM's Office of Water Quality (OWQ) is required for any activity that results in the discharge of dredged or fill materials into isolated wetlands. To learn more about isolated wetlands, contact the OWQ Wetlands Program at 317-233-8488
- 4. If your project will involve over a 0.5 acre of wetland impact, stream relocation, or other large-scale alterations to water bodies such as the creation of a dam or a water diversion, you should seek additional input from the OWQ Wetlands Program staff. - 5. Work within the one-hundred year floodway of a given water body is regulated by the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Water. The Division issues permits for activities regulated under the follow statutes:
 - o IC 14-26-2 Lakes Preservation Act 312 IAC 11
 - IC 14-26-5 Lowering of Ten Acre Lakes Act No related code
 - o IC 14-28-1 Flood Control Act 310 IAC 6-1
 - o IC 14-29-1 Navigable Waterways Act 312 IAC 6
 - o IC 14-29-3 Sand and Gravel Permits Act 312 IAC 6
 - IC 14-29-4 Construction of Channels Act No related code

The physical disturbance of the stream and riparian vegetation, especially large trees overhanging any affected water bodies should be limited to only that which is absolutely necessary to complete the project. The shade provided by the large overhanging trees helps maintain proper stream temperatures and dissolved oxygen for aquatic life.

- 6. For projects involving construction activity (which includes clearing, grading, excavation and other land disturbing activities) that result in the disturbance of one (1), or more, acres of total land area, contact the Office of Water Quality Watershed Planning Branch (317/233-1864) regarding the need for of a Rule 5 Storm Water Runoff Permit. To obtain, and operate under, a Rule 5 permit you will first need to develop a Construction Plan (http://www.in.gov/idem/4917.htm#constreq (http://www.in.gov/idem/4917.htm#constreq)), and as described in 327 IAC 15-5-6.5 (http://www.in.gov/legislative/iac/T03270/A00150 [PDF] (http://www.in.gov/legislative/iac/T03270/A00150.PDF), pages 16 through 19). Before you may apply for a Rule 5 Permit, or begin construction, you must submit your Construction Plan to your county Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) (http://www.in.gov/isda/soil/contacts/map.html (http://www.in.gov/isda/soil/contacts/map.html)).

Upon receipt of the construction plan, personnel of the SWCD or the Indiana Department of Environmental Management will review the plan to determine if it meets the requirements of 327 IAC 15-5. Plans that are deemed deficient will require re-submittal. If the plan is sufficient you will be notified and instructed to submit the verification to IDEM as part of the Rule 5 Notice of Intent (NOI) submittal. Once construction begins, staff of the SWCD or Indiana Department of Environmental Management will perform inspections of activities at the site for compliance with the regulation.

Please be mindful that approximately 149 Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) areas are now being established by various local governmental entities throughout the state as part of the implementation of Phase II federal storm water requirements. All of these MS4 areas will eventually take responsibility for Construction Plan review, inspection, and enforcement. As these MS4 areas obtain program approval from IDEM, they will be added to a list of MS4 areas posted on the IDEM Website at: http://www.in.gov/idem/4900.htm (http://www.in.gov/idem/4900.htm).

If your project is located in an IDEM-approved MS4 area, please contact the local MS4 program about meeting their storm water requirements. Once the MS4 approves the plan, the NOI can be submitted to IDEM.

Regardless of the size of your project, or which agency you work with to meet storm water requirements, IDEM recommends that appropriate structures and techniques be utilized both during the construction phase, and after completion of the project, to minimize the impacts associated with storm water runoff. The use of appropriate planning and site development and appropriate storm water quality measures are recommended to prevent soil from leaving the construction site during active land disturbance and for post construction water quality concerns. Information and assistance regarding storm water related to construction activities are available from the Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) offices in each county or from IDEM.

- 7. For projects involving impacts to fish and botanical resources, contact the Department of Natural Resources Division of Fish and Wildlife (317/232-4080) for addition project input.
- 8. For projects involving water main construction, water main extensions, and new public water supplies, contact the Office of Water Quality Drinking Water Branch (317-308-3299) regarding the need for permits.
- For projects involving effluent discharges to waters of the State of Indiana, contact the Office of Water Quality

 Permits Branch (317-233-0468) regarding the need for a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit.
- 10. For projects involving the construction of wastewater facilities and sewer lines, contact the Office of Water Quality - Permits Branch (317-232-8675) regarding the need for permits.

AIR QUALITY

The above-noted project should be designed to minimize any impact on ambient air quality in, or near, the project area. The project must comply with all federal and state air pollution regulations. Consideration should be given to the following:

 Regarding open burning, and disposing of organic debris generated by land clearing activities; some types of open burning are allowed (http://www.in.gov/idem/4148.htm (http://www.in.gov/idem/4148.htm)) under specific conditions. You also can seek an open burning variance from IDEM.

However, IDEM generally recommends that you take vegetative wastes to a registered yard waste composting facility or that the waste be chipped or shredded with composting on site (you must register with IDEM if more than 2,000 pounds is to be composted; contact 317/232-0066). The finished compost can then be used as a mulch or soil amendment. You also may bury any vegetative wastes (such as leaves, twigs, branches, limbs, tree trunks and stumps) onsite, although burying large quantities of such material can lead to subsidence problems, later on.

Reasonable precautions must be taken to minimize fugitive dust emissions from construction and demolition activities. For example, wetting the area with water, constructing wind barriers, or treating dusty areas with chemical stabilizers (such as calcium chloride or several other commercial products). Dirt tracked onto paved roads from unpaved areas should be minimized.

Additionally, if construction or demolition is conducted in a wooded area where blackbirds have roosted or abandoned buildings or building sections in which pigeons or bats have roosted for 3-5 years precautionary measures should be taken to avoid an outbreak of histoplasmosis. This disease is caused by the fungus Histoplasma capsulatum, which stems from bird or bat droppings that have accumulated in one area for 3-5 years. The spores from this fungus become airborne when the area is disturbed and can cause infections over an entire community downwind of the site. The area should be wetted down prior to cleanup or demolition of the project site. For more detailed information on histoplasmosis prevention and control, please contact the Acute Disease Control Division of the Indiana State Department of Health at (317) 233-7272.

 The U.S. EPA and the Surgeon General recommend that people not have long-term exposure to radon at levels above 4 pCi/L. (For a county-by-county map of predicted radon levels in Indiana, visit: http://www.in.gov/idem/4145.htm (http://www.in.gov/idem/4145.htm).)

The U.S. EPA further recommends that all homes (and apartments within three stories of ground level) be tested for radon. If in-home radon levels are determined to be 4 pCi/L, or higher, EPA recommends a follow-up test. If the second test confirms that radon levels are 4 pCi/L, or higher, EPA recommends the installation of radon-reduction measures. (For a list of qualified radon testers and radon mitigation (or reduction) specialists visit: http://www.in.gov/isdh/regsvcs/radhealth/pdfs/radon_testers_mitigators_list.pdf (http://www.in.gov/isdh/regsvcs/radhealth/pdfs/radon_testers_mitigators_list.pdf).) It also is recommended that radon reduction measures be built into all new homes, particularly in areas like Indiana that have moderate to high predicted radon levels.

3. With respect to asbestos removal: all facilities slated for renovation or demolition (except residential buildings that have (4) four or fewer dwelling units and which will not be used for commercial purposes) must be inspected by an Indiana-licensed asbestos inspector prior to the commencement of any renovation or demolition activities. If regulated asbestos-containing material (RACM) that may become airborne is found, any subsequent demolition, renovation, or asbestos removal activities must be performed in accordance with the proper notification and emission control requirements.

If no asbestos is found where a renovation activity will occur, or if the renovation involves removal of less than 260 linear feet of RACM off of pipes, less than 160 square feet of RACM off of other facility components, or less than 35 cubic feet of RACM off of all facility components, the owner or operator of the project does not need to notify IDEM before beginning the renovation activity.

For questions on asbestos demolition and renovation activities, you can also call IDEM's Lead/Asbestos section at 1-888-574-8150.

However, in all cases where a demolition activity will occur (even if no asbestos is found), the owner or operator must still notify IDEM 10 working days prior to the demolition, using the form found at http://www.in.gov/icpr/webfile/formsdiv/44593.pdf (http://www.in.gov/icpr/webfile/formsdiv/44593.pdf).

Anyone submitting a renovation/demolition notification form will be billed a notification fee based upon the amount of friable asbestos containing material to be removed or demolished. Projects that involve the removal of more than 2,600 linear feet of friable asbestos containing materials on pipes, or 1,600 square feet or 400 cubic feet of friable asbestos containing material on other facility components, will be billed a fee of \$150 per project; projects below these amounts will be billed a fee of \$50 per project. All notification remitters will be billed on a quarterly basis.

- 4. With respect to lead-based paint removal: IDEM encourages all efforts to minimize human exposure to lead-based paint chips and dust. IDEM is particularly concerned that young children exposed to lead can suffer from learning disabilities. Although lead-based paint abatement efforts are not mandatory, any abatement that is conducted within housing built before January 1, 1978, or a child-occupied facility is required to comply with all lead-based paint work practice standards, licensing and notification requirements. - 5. Ensure that asphalt paving plants are permitted and operate properly. The use of cutback asphalt, or asphalt emulsion containing more than seven percent (7%) oil distillate, is prohibited during the months April through October. See 326 IAC 8-5-2, Asphalt Paving Rule (http://www.ai.org/legislative/iac/T03260/A00080.PDF (http://www.ai.org/legislative/iac/T03260/A00080.PDF)).
- 6. If your project involves the construction of a new source of air emissions or the modification of an existing source of air emissions or air pollution control equipment, it will need to be reviewed by the IDEM Office of Air Quality (OAQ). A registration or permit may be required under 326 IAC 2 (View at: www.ai.org/legislative/iac/t03260/a00020.pdf (http://www.ai.org/legislative/iac/t03260/a00020.pdf).) New sources that use or emit hazardous air pollutants may be subject to Section 112 of the Clean Air Act and corresponding state air regulations governing hazardous air pollutants.

The attached species list identifies any federally threatened, endangered, proposed and candidate species that may occur within the boundary of your proposed project or may be affected by your proposed project. The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT), is acting on behalf of FHWA, and submitting this letter for standard informal consultation for the Indiana bat, Myotis sodalis, and northern long-eared bat, Myotis septentrionalis (NLEB). This project does not qualify for the Range-wide Programmatic Agreement because construction activities will occur beyond 300 feet from the existing roadway.

Background

Des 1801935 involves the extension of CR 1300 North from the existing intersection of County Road (CR) 1300 North and Old State Road (SR) 15 to the west to SR 15. This project will eliminate the at-grade crossings of various streets and the Norfolk Southern Railroad by creating an overpass over the existing railroad and Main Street before terminating at SR 15. The proposed roadway will provide 12-foot travel lanes and 8-foot shoulders. Main Street will be realigned to allow for a shorter overpass bridge length. This project aims to improve the efficiency of the high volume of truck traffic traveling between Syracuse and SR 15 by eliminating the at-grade crossings of Norfolk Southern Railroad. No work on existing culverts or bridges will be required to complete the project. Construction will occur between Winter 2021 and Winter 2023.

Existing Conditions

The existing project area is between the towns of Milford and Milford Junction in northern Kosciusko County. CR 1300 N terminates at the intersection of CR 1300 N and Old SR 15. The project area is primarily agricultural with some residences and commercial properties adjacent to the project termini and where Main Street will be realigned. Norfolk Southern Railroad runs north/south through the project area. The existing crossings are at North and South Street to the north of the proposed project area and at Syracuse Street to the south of the proposed project area. The HR Weisser Airport is a private airport that has a runway within and adjacent to the project area. Land from this runway will be acquired to complete the construction of the roadway extension. An early coordination letter was sent to the affected property owner and coordination with the property owner is ongoing.

Existing Habitat and Bat Data

Suitable summer habitat for the Indiana bat and northern long-eared bat includes stands of trees near the eastern project terminus and individual trees that are within 1,000 feet of stands of trees. Dominant tree species identified within the forested parcel include Sugar Maple (Acer saccharum) and White Oak (Quercus alba). No tree removal will occur to complete the project. The Red Flag Investigation dated December 13, 2019 indicated that no bats have been documented within 0.5 mile of the project area.

Water Resources and Wetlands

Two emergent wetlands, Wetland 1 and Wetland 2, and one ditch, Preston Miles Ditch, were identified within the study area as part of the Waters of the US Report that was approved on January 29, 2020. All three resources are located near the western project terminus. Wetland 1 and Wetland 2 are both considered poor quality and Preston Miles Ditch is considered average quality.

Impacts

Impacts to wetlands or waterways may occur, and removal of suitable bat habitat in the form of tree removal will not be required for this project.

Lighting

Temporary lighting may be used to construct the project. This lighting may be utilized during the active season for bats. Permanent lighting will not be installed as part of the scope of this project.

Early Coordination

Early coordination letters were sent to the appropriate agencies on October 8, 2019. The Indiana Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) responded on November 7, 2019 and indicated that no endangered, threatened, or rare species have been identified within the vicinity of the project area. The US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) did not respond to the early coordination letter.

Commitments

The following commitments are proposed as Avoidance and Minimization Measures (AMMs) to reduce potential impacts to the Indiana bat and northern long-eared bat.

- General AMM 1: Ensure all operators, employees, and contractors working in areas
 of known or presumed bat habitat are aware of all FHWA/FRA/FTA (Transportation
 Agencies) environmental commitments, including all applicable AMMs.
- Lighting AMM 1: Direct temporary lighting away from suitable habitat during the active season.

Conclusion

Based on the review of existing data and applied AMMs, the FHWA has determined the proposed project has an effect finding of "May Affect, Not Likely to Adversely Affect - with AMMs" for the federally endangered Indiana bat (Myotis sodalis) and the federally threatened northern long-eared bat (Myotis septentrionalis).

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The FHWA is requesting USFWS concurrence with this project "May Affect, Not Likely to Adversely Affect - with AMMs" determination.

This responds to your letter dated April 29, 2020, requesting our comments on the aforementioned project.

These comments have been prepared under the authority of the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (16 U.S.C. 661 et. seq.) and are consistent with the intent of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, the Endangered Species Act of 1973, and the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Mitigation Policy.

The proposed project consists of the extension of CR 1300N from its existing end at Old SR 15 to the current SR 15, a length of about 0.5 mile. The project includes an overpass of the Norfolk Southern Railroad and Main Street, with Main Street being realigned closer to the railroad. Land use in the project area is a mix of agriculture, commercial, and residential. No tree clearing is anticipated.

ENDANGERED SPECIES

The proposed project is within the range of the Federally endangered Indiana bat (<u>Myotis sodalis</u>) and the threatened northern long-eared bat (<u>Myotis septentrionalis</u>). However, there is no habitat for these species within the proposed project area, so we concur with your determination that the proposed project is not likely to adversely affect these endangered and threatened species.

This precludes the need for further consultation on this project as required under Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended. However, should new information arise pertaining to project plans or a revised species list be published, it will be necessary for the Federal agency to reinitiate consultation.

Kosciusko County, with administrative oversight from the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT), proposes to proceed with the County Road 1300 North Extension Project, Des. No. 1801935. This project, which is part of the INDOT's Local Trax program, may receive funding from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) in the future.

This letter is part of the Section 106 review process for this project. Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act requires federal agencies to take into account the effects of their undertakings on historic and archaeological properties. We are requesting comments from you regarding the possible effects of this project. Please use the above Des. Number and project description in your reply and your comments will be incorporated into the formal environmental study.

A section 106 early coordination letter was distributed to invited consulting parties on November 18, 2019. In addition, a letter distributed on July 21, 2020 notified consulting parties that a Historic Properties Short Report (HPSR) and Archaeology Report were available for review and comment.

The proposed undertaking is on County Road 1300 North from Old State Road 15 to State Road 15 in Kosciusko County, Indiana. It is within Van Buren Township, Milford IN Topographic Quadrangle, in Sections 4, 5, 6, and 9, Township 34 North, Range 6 East.

The project is needed to address traffic congestion, motorist delays, and safety concerns caused by the existing road network north of the Town of Milford. CR 1300 N is currently used to connect communities in the Town of Milford and the Town of Syracuse. SR 15 connects the Town of Milford to the City of Goshen and the City of Warsaw. The existing CR 1300 N does not connect to SR 15 but ends at the Old SR 15, forcing motorists to travel south through the Town of Milford or north through the Town of Milford Junction to reach SR 15.

Motorists traveling south through the Town of Milford cause congestion and delays in town. Motorists must cross over the Norfolk Southern Railroad, using the at-grade railroad crossing on Syracuse Street. This crossing has a railroad crossing sign, known as a cross buck, signal lighting and gates. Motorists traveling north through Milford Junction must cross over the Norfolk Southern Railroad, using at-grade railroad crossings on either East North Street or East South Street. These existing crossings only have a railroad cross buck sign with a stop sign; neither of these crossings have signal lighting or gates. In addition, traffic continues to W 1350 N, where there is currently poor sight distance at the intersection with SR 15. Economic development in the area will likely result in increased traffic volumes in the coming years with more traffic being diverted and increased congestion. The purpose of the project is to provide traveling motorists, including school buses and emergency

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vehicles, a safe direct connection between communities that reduces travel through the Town of Milford, therefore reducing congestion and delays and the need to cross an at-grade railroad crossing.

This project proposes to extend CR 1300 N to the west to SR 15. An overpass bridge will be constructed to eliminate the need to use the at-grade crossings of the Norfolk Southern Railroad in the Town of Milford and the Town of Milford Junction. Main Street will be realigned to the east to allow for the new bridge to cross both the Norfolk Southern Railroad and Main Street. A signalized intersection may also be installed at the intersection of the proposed CR 1300 N extension and SR 15. The proposed bridge and roadway will provide two 12-foot wide travel lanes, one in each direction, with 4-foot wide shoulders. The bridge will provide a clear roadway width of 32 feet. Traffic is anticipated to be maintained through the closure of Main Street and a detour. The detour route will likely utilize East South Street, Old SR 15, and East Syracuse Street and will be approximately 1.35 miles in length.

Approximately 11 acres of permanent right of way is anticipated for this project. Project letting is anticipated to be in May 2021.

Green 3, LLC is under contract with Kosciusko County to advance the environmental documentation for the referenced project.

In accordance with 36 CFR 800.2 (c), you were invited to become a consulting party as part of the Section 106 process, or you are hereby invited to become a consulting party as part of the Section 106 process. With regard to archaeological resources, an archaeologist who meets the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards relocated two previously recorded sites and identified two new sites within the project area. As a result of these efforts, no sites are recommended as eligible for listing in the NRHP and no further work is recommended.

On August 21, 2020, the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) staff agreed with the size of the APE in the HPSR (Wood, July 2020) and that "there are no historic properties listed or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places ('NRHP')." Regarding archaeology, the SHPO staff has "not identified any currently known archaeological resources listed in or eligible for inclusion in the NRHP within the proposed project area." Furthermore, the SHPO staff concurred with the conclusions of the Archaeology Report (C. Jackson,



07/15/2020) stating that the two resurveyed sites and the two newly identified sites "do not appear eligible for inclusion in the NRHP, and that no further archaeological investigations appear necessary at these portions of the proposed project area."

The area of potential effects (APE), as defined in 36 CFR 800.16(d), is "the geographic area or areas within which an undertaking may directly or indirectly cause alterations in the character or use of historic properties, if any such properties exist." The APE of the project includes all properties adjacent to the project and those with a proximate viewshed of the project. The dimensions of the APE were defined by the new roadway and bridge construction that will be built over the railroad tracks and N Main Street, as well as by the open space of the agricultural fields situated on a flat topographical landscape. The APE is approximately 0.69 mile long and approximately 0.92 mile wide. Please see the APE map in Appendix A.

2. EFFORTS TO IDENTIFY HISTORIC PROPERTIES

The NRHP, Indiana Register of Historic Sites and Structures (State Register), and the Indiana Historic Buildings, Bridges, and Cemeteries Map (IHBBCM), showing results of the Indiana Historic Sites and Structures Inventory (IHSSI), were consulted. No resources in the APE were previously evaluated.

There are no resources documented in the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS), the Historic American Engineering Record (HAER), and Historic American Landscapes Survey (HALS) identified within the vicinity of the project. The *INDOT Historic Bridge Inventory* (February 2009) by M & H Architecture, Inc. was reviewed. No historic bridges were identified within the APE.

On November 26, 2019, the Kosciusko County Commissioner Cary Groninger, accepted consulting party status via email.

On December 3, 2019, the Pokagon Band of Potawatomi Indians in their letter accepted consulting party status and determined that there would be "No Historic Properties in Area of Potential Effects (APE) significant to the Pokagon Band of Potawatomi Indians."

On December 12, 2019, the Miami Tribe of Oklahoma in their letter accepted consulting party status and offered no objection to the project as they "are not currently aware of existing documentation directly linking a specific Miami cultural or historic site to the project site."

On December 16, 2019, SHPO staff responded in their letter that they were "not aware of any parties who should be invited to participate in the Section 106 consultation on this project, beyond those whom INDOT already has invited."

Karen Wood, a Qualified Professional historian, conducted a site visit of the project area on March 6, 2020. She documented above-ground resources within the APE that are at least 50 years of age or that will be at least 50 years of age at the time of the project letting (expected 2021). The historian walked the APE, taking photographs of all resources meriting a "Contributing" or higher rating. Non-contributing resources or those that did not meet the age requirements were noted but not documented other than in general streetscape photographs. No resources in the APE were found to be listed in or eligible for the NRHP. Please see Appendix B for photos.

A Historic Property Short Report (HPSR) (Wood, July 2020) was completed for the project. An email was sent to participating consulting parties on July 21, 2020, notifying them that the report was available for review on IN SCOPE https://erms.indot.in.gov/Section106Documents/, INDOT's Section 106 document website, and a hard copy was sent to SHPO.

With regard to archaeology, Christopher Jackson, M.S., RPA, conducted Phase 1a archaeological reconnaissance investigation (Jackson, July 15, 2020). He relocated two previously recorded sites, and identified two new sites within the project area. As a result of these efforts, no sites were recommended as eligible for listing in the NRHP and no further work was recommended. The archaeology report was sent to consulting parties (SHPO and Tribes only) on July 21, 2020. The summary of the HPSR and Archaeology Report are found in Appendix D.

On August 21, 2020, the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) staff agreed with the size of the APE in the HPSR (Wood, July 2020) and that "there are no historic properties listed or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places ('NRHP')." Regarding archaeology, the SHPO staff has "not identified any currently known archaeological resources listed in or eligible for inclusion in the NRHP within the proposed project area." Furthermore, the SHPO staff concurred with the conclusions of the Archaeology Report (C. Jackson, 07/15/2020) stating that the two resurveyed sites and the two newly identified sites "do not appear eligible for inclusion in the NRHP, and that no further archaeological investigations appear necessary at these portions of the proposed project area."

None of the other consulting parties provided any additional comments regarding the early coordination letter, HPR, or archaeology report. Please see Appendix C for Consulting Party Correspondence.



Kosciusko County, with funding from the Federal Highway Administration and administrative oversight from the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT), proposes to proceed with County Road 1300 North Extension Project, Des. No. 1801935. Green 3, LLC is a subconsultant to Michael Baker International, who is under contract with INDOT to advance the environmental documentation for the referenced project.

This letter is part of the early coordination phase of the environmental review process requesting comments associated with this project. We are requesting comments from your area of expertise regarding any possible environmental effects associated with this project. Please use the above Des. Number and project description in your reply and your comments will be incorporated into the formal environmental study.

The proposed undertaking is on County Road 1300 North from Old State Road 15 to State Road 15 in Kosciusko County, Indiana. It is within Van Buren Township, Milford USGS Topographic Quadrangle, in Sections 4, 5, 6, and 9, Township 34 North, Range 6 East.

The project is needed to address traffic congestion, motorist delays, and safety concerns caused by the existing road network north of the Town of Milford. CR 1300 N is currently used to connect communities in the Town of Milford and Town of Syracuse. SR 15 connects the Town of Milford to the City of Goshen and the City of Warsaw. The existing CR 1300 N does not connect to SR 15 but ends at the Old SR 15, forcing motorists to travel south through the Town of Milford or north through Milford Junction to reach SR 15. Motorists traveling south through the Town of Milford cause congestion and delays in town. Motorists traveling north must cross over an at-grade railroad crossing. The existing crossing is at E South St and the Norfolk Southern Railroad and only has a railroad crossing sign, known as a cross buck, with a stop sign. The crossing does not have signal lighting or gates. In addition, traffic continues to W 1350 N, where there is currently poor sight distance at the intersection with SR 15. Economic development in the area will likely result in increased traffic volumes in the coming years with more traffic being diverted and increased congestion. The purpose of the project is to provide traveling motorists, including school buses and emergency vehicles, a safe direct connection between communities that reduces travel through the Town of Milford, therefore reducing congestion and delays, and the need to cross over an at-grade railroad crossing.

This project proposes to extend CR 1300 N to the west to SR 15. An overpass bridge will be constructed to eliminate the need to use the at-grade crossings of the Norfolk Southern Railroad in the Town of Milford and the Town of Milford Junction. Main Street will be realigned to the east to allow for the new bridge to cross both the Norfolk Southern Railroad and Main Street. Religious Facilities: No religious facilities are mapped within the 0.5 mile search radius; however, a review of aerial imagery revealed that there are four (4) religious facilities located within the 0.5 mile search radius. The nearest religious facilities are the Apostolic Christian Church (201 N Higbee Street, Milford, IN) and the Christian Church of Milford (201 N Henry Street, Milford, IN); both are located approximately 0.17 mile south of the project area. No impacts are anticipated.

Airports: One (1) private airport is located within the 0.5 mile search radius. H R Weisser Airport (13169 N Main Street, Milford IN) is located within the project area. Coordination with H R Weisser Airport will occur.

Cemeteries: Two (2*) cemeteries are mapped within the 0.5 mile search radius; however, it appears that the same cemetery is mapped twice. Milford Cemetery is located approximately 0.18 mile west of the project area. No impacts are anticipated.

Schools: One (1) school is located within the 0.5 mile search radius. Milford School (109 S Elm Street, Milford, IN) is located approximately 0.33 mile south of the project area. No impacts are anticipated.

Recreational Facilities: Two (2) recreational facilities are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. Big Boulder Golf Course (610 N Higbee Street, Milford IN) is located within the project area; however, it appears that this golf course is permanently out of business. No impacts are anticipated.

Pipelines: One (1) pipeline is located within the 0.5 mile search radius. A pipeline owned by Dome Pipeline Corp. is located approximately 0.25 mile north of the project area. No impacts are anticipated.

Railroads: Eight (8) railroad segments are mapped within the 0.5 mile search radius, but it appears that two (2) segments are mapped twice. The nearest railroad, owned by Norfolk Southern Railroad, is located within the project area. Coordination with Norfolk Southern Railroad should occur.
