Dear Mr. Brooks:

We have completed our review of INDOT's Amendment #20-46 to the FY 2020-2024 Indiana Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) dated April 16, 2021. INDOT has redemonstrated fiscal constraint, air quality conformity, where applicable, and provided opportunity for public comment and involvement on Amendment #20-46.

FHWA only recognizes years 2020-2023 in the STIP. Any projects and/or phases of projects added in years outside of 2020-2023 are considered illustrative, and thus ineligible for federal funding at this time.

FHWA considers this amendment to be in substantial compliance with the applicable requirements as sufficient to support a consistency finding for inclusion into the STIP.

The Indiana Department of Transportation requests the projects listed in STIP Amendment 20-46 to be incorporated into the 2020-2024 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Any projects and/or phases of projects added in years outside of 2020-2023 are considered illustrative, and thus ineligible for federal funding at this time.

The required Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) documents have been included in this request and duly noted in the Amendment. We have determined that the proposed amendments are: 1) consistent with the transportation plan; 2) the TIP remains fiscally constrained in that federal funding resources are sufficient to support the new or modified projects; and 3) conform to state and national air quality standards.

The total dollar amount of this amendment is \$30,877,614.00 (for fiscal years 2020-2023), has been verified with FHWA.

WHEREAS, the Policy Committee of the Evansville Metropolitan Planning Organization from time to time amends its TIP;



The Kentucky Division Office of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Region 4 of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), in consultation with the Indiana Division Office of the Federal Highway Administration and Regions 4 and 5 of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), have reviewed the following documents:

Amendment 1 to the 2020-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Amendment 1 to the 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) for the Louisville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) (MPO approval date July 23, 2020)

The Kentucky Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet's Division for Air Quality, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Division of Planning, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Office of Transportation Delivery, the Louisville Metro Air Pollution Control District, and the Transit Authority of River City also had an opportunity to review and comment on the aforementioned documents.

We found that these documents meet the five primary criteria of the Transportation Conformity Rule (40 CFR Part 93):

- use of the latest planning assumptions,
- use of the latest emissions model,
- use of appropriate consultation procedures,







- **WHEREAS**, the FY 2020-2024 Delaware Muncie Transportation Improvement Program (DMTIP) is in agreement with the 2018-2045 Delaware Muncie Transportation Plan, which conforms with the Indiana State Implementation Plan (SIP); and
- **WHEREAS**, the DMMPC's Intergovernmental Consulting Group (ICG) concurred on February 12-19, 2021 that Project Des #2100088, as bridge rehabilitation with no additional travel lanes, was an Air Quality conformity exempt project; and
- **WHEREAS**, the proposed FY 2020-24 DMTIP amendment to add Project Des #2100088 and drop Project Des #1700682 was reviewed and approved by the Technical Advisory Committee by email vote on February 12-17, 2021; and
- **WHEREAS**, the same proposed DMTIP amendment was reviewed and approved by the Transportation Policy Committee at its regular meeting on February 17, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Transportation Policy Committee of the DMMPC as follows:

Section 2. That the FY 2020-24 DMTIP was amended to add Project Des #2100088, Bridge #193 rehabilitation for Memorial over White River, for preliminary engineering (PE) in FY 2021 and 2022, for right-of-way acquisition (RW) in FY 2022 and construction in FY 2025.
