Dear Mr. Brooks:

We have completed our review of INDOT's Amendment #20-47 to the FY 2020-2024 Indiana Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) dated April 15, 2021 and revised on April 30, 2021 due to FHWA's comments. INDOT has re-demonstrated fiscal constraint, air quality conformity, where applicable, and provided opportunity for public comment and involvement on Amendment #20-47.

FHWA only recognizes years 2020-2023 in the STIP. Any projects and/or phases of projects added in years outside of 2020-2023 are considered illustrative, and thus ineligible for federal funding at this time.

FHWA considers this amendment to be in substantial compliance with the applicable requirements as sufficient to support a consistency finding for inclusion into the STIP.

The Indiana Department of Transportation requests the projects listed in STIP Amendment 20-47 to be incorporated into the 2020-2024 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Any projects and/or phases of projects added in years outside of 2020-2023 are considered illustrative, and thus ineligible for federal funding at this time.

The required Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) documents have been included in this request and duly noted in the Amendment. We have determined that the proposed amendments are: 1) consistent with the transportation plan; 2) the TIP remains fiscally constrained in that federal funding resources are sufficient to support the new or modified projects; and 3) conform to state and national air quality standards.

The total dollar amount of this amendment is \$\$4,645,433.40 (for fiscal years 2020-2023), has been verified with FHWA.

RESOLUTION NO. 43-20 A RESOLUTION ENDORSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE SOUTH BEND AND ELKHART/GOSHEN FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2020-2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS

- WHEREAS, the "FAST Act", Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act: Designating joint Federal Highway Administration/Federal Transit Administration rules and regulations, under Section 134, Title 23 of the US Code, the act requires the annual preparation of a Transportation Improvement Program by the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization(s) as a part of the transportation planning process in urbanized areas of 50,000 or more population; and
- WHEREAS, the Michiana Area Council of Governments (MACOG) being the duly designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the South Bend and Elkhart/Goshen Urbanized Areas, in cooperation with local governmental units and implementing agencies within the urbanized areas, has prepared a FY 2020-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) which consists of improvements recommended in the MACOG Region.
- WHEREAS, the FY 2020-2024 TIP is consistent with the 2045 Transportation Plan (TP) and its corresponding conformity determination, which uses the MACOG travel demand model, developed with the most recently available socio-economic and other input data to estimate mobile source emissions for the conformity analysis.
- WHEREAS, MACOG consulted with the Interagency Consultation Group and the agencies concurred in the MPO finding that the TIP amendment projects are exempt and there is no need to update the conformity analysis or issue a new conformity finding.
- WHEREAS, the MACOG Policy Board from time to time receives and amends/modifies its Transportation Improvement Programs and upon review of the amendments below, MACOG here within finds that they are consistent with the 2045 TP and its corresponding conformity analysis.

I wanted to provide a little more information about the College Ave project from 9th St to US 33. Added Travel Lane really refers to the inclusion of an auxiliary center turn lane that will serve as a Two Way Left Turn Lane. The total length of the project is 1.2 miles and the total estimated cost to complete is \$9,357,000. This phase of College Ave is not currently in our 2045 MTP.

For the Blackport Rd Reconstruction and Multi-Use Path from Monroe St to Lincoln Ave, the length of the project is 0.5 miles and the total estimated cost to complete is \$2,730,000. We will be sure to include this information going forward.



The Urban Transportation Advisory Board convened on Tuesday, February 2, 2021, at 1:30 p.m. in Conference Room 440, Citizens Square, Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Staff members present were Dan Avery, Executive Director; Matt Vondran, Senior Transportation Planner; Stephen Senior, Associate Transportation Planner, and Debbie Magsam, Administrative Assistant. Jodi Coblentz, Mark Jesse, John Leckie, Terry Martin, Eli Samaan and Mike Thornson were also present.

Mr. Gunawardena brought the meeting to order. The first item of business was the approval of the January 5, 2021 minutes. Mr. Hartman moved that the minutes be approved. Ms. Brown seconded the motion and it carried.

Mr. Hartman reported for Allen County Highway. The Bass Road Phase 1B project will be let on March 3, 2021. Right-of-way for three out of the five parcels has been secured for the Bass Road Phase 3A project and it will be let on October 13, 2021. The Bass Road Phase 3B & 3C project will be let on October 12, 2022. There is a slight increase in the construction estimate and estimated overall project cost for the South County Line Road Bridge #271 project. There is a slight decrease in estimated overall project cost for the Fogwell Parkway project. On January 15,

2021 a notice to proceed was issued for PE to Butler, Fairman, & Seufert for the Antwerp Road Bridge #15 project.

Mr. Zaharako reported for the City of Fort Wayne. The Bluffton Road Bridge #358 project has received the notice to proceed and USI was selected as the consultant on the project. The Goeglein Road Bridge #113 project has received the notice to proceed and Beam, Longest & Neff was selected as the consultant on the project. Work will resume on the St. Joe Center Road project in the spring. The State Boulevard project is almost complete. The only work that remains is the prelim punch-list items and interpretive signs need to be installed. The Maplecrest Road Phase II project was awarded to Phend & Brown and work will start in the spring.

Mr. Good gave the report for the City of New Haven. The Landin Road project will have a bid letting on February 10, 2021. The City of New Haven has two Community Crossing projects, Green Road and Lincoln Highway, that will be bid by March 2021. Mr. Gunawardena asked if the Landin Road project would be a one season project. Mr. Good responded the project will have two phases and the first phase will be this year and second phase in 2022. The City of New Haven submitted for a 2021 Community Crossing grant and will use those funds to improve Woodmere Road from Moeller Road to the East Allen Career Center.

Mr. Burgess gave the report for INDOT. The concrete pavement restoration project on I-69 is scheduled for project letting in October 2021. The Coldwater Road/I-69 bridge replacement, bridge deck overlay, and interchange modification project is scheduled for project letting in November 2021. This project will be in done with the City of Fort Wayne's Ludwig Road project and a public meeting will be held on Thursday, February 4, 2021. New cable rail barriers will be installed on US 24 from I-469 to the Ohio state line and the project letting is scheduled for November 2021.

Ms. Wagner gave the report for Citilink. A request for proposals was submitted last week for the automatic passenger counter system. Ridership is still down about 30%. Citilink is currently looking for additional bus drivers, hostlers and mechanics. These positions will be posted on Citilink's website and Indeed.com. Citilink has had a mask mandate in place and will see little to no change with the federal mask mandate.

Mr. Hinderman was not present so there was no progress report for the airport.

The first item of new business was the FY 2022 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) and Small Urban and Rural Planning Program (SURP) presented by Mr. Avery. The UPWP and SURP are submitted every year and outline the activities that will be performed by NIRCC. The Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration identify planning emphasis areas. The FY22 planning emphasis areas are pedestrian safety, resiliency, metropolitan planning area & urbanized area boundaries, Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan, and micromobility. Pedestrian fatalities have outpaced overall traffic fatalities in the last decade and needs to be studied further. Resiliency is the ability to anticipate, prepare for, and adapt to changing conditions such as floods, earthquakes, and climate change. Once the census data is available NIRCC and INDOT will collaborate on adjusting the urban area boundary. The Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan was last updated in 2017 and will

be updated in 2021 or 2022. Micromobility refers to a range of small, lightweight vehicles operating at speeds typically below 20 mph like e-bikes, Segways, and electric scooters. Micromobility needs to be assessed to determine the potential impact on the pedestrian environment. It is important these devices do not interfere with pedestrian safety, mobility and ADA accommodations. A handout was distributed listing all the planning activities for the UPWP and SURP. Mr. Zaharako made a motion to approve the FY 2022 Unified Planning Work Program and Small Urban and Rural Planning Program. Ms. Brown seconded the motion and it carried.

The next item of new business was the Transit Asset Management (TAM) presented by Mr. Avery. The TAM sets performance measures for the revenue service vehicles, non-revenue service vehicles, and facilities. The revenue services vehicles are categorized by buses (large), cutaway buses, and specialized vans. Both useful life benchmark (ULB) and state of good repair (SGR) are looked at and used to set targets. Mr. Avery shared slides comparing the proposed targets and to the actual from 2017 to 2020. Citilink has been mostly consistent in meeting or exceeding the targets. The proposed 2021 Targets for Rolling Stock are for buses (large) that 31% meet or exceed ULB and 90% are in SGR, cutaway buses 65% meet or exceed ULB and 90% are in SGR, specialized vans 0% meet or exceed ULB and 90% are in SGR. The proposed 2021 Targets for Rolling Stock are for the non-revenue vehicles are 81% meet or exceed ULB and 80% are in SGR. The facilities are rated using a TERM (transit economic requirements model scale) rating scale. The TERM rating scale is from 1 (poor) to 5 (excellent). An acceptable TERM rating is 3 or greater. The facilities include the administration and maintenance building, the storage barn, passenger station, and passenger shelters. The proposed 2021 Targets for Facilities are 0% below the 3 TERM rating and 90% are in SGR and for passenger shelters the proposed 2021 targets are 0% below the 3 TERM rating and 80% are in SGR. Mr. Hartman made a motion to approve the 2021 Performance Targets for Rolling Stock, Non-Revenue Vehicles and Facilities. Mr. Zaharako seconded the motion and it carried.

The next item of new business was the FY2022-2026 Draft Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) -Project Lists. The transit projects, local roadway projects, and the INDOT roadway projects lists were distributed for review. The TIP is in the process of being updated. These lists will be discussed at the March 2, 2021 UTAB meeting and the FY2022-2026 TIP will be approved at the April 6, 2021 UTAB meeting. Many of the projects on the transit list are for replacement vehicles. Some projects added into the local roadway list for future funding are an intersection improvement project at the intersection of Broadway and Taylor Street in Fort Wayne, the Grabill Road bridge project in Grabill, the Maplecrest Road South project in New Haven, and the Tonkel Road project. Several projects were highlighted from the INDOT roadway projects list including the intersection improvement project at Kroemer Road and US 30, new interchange construction at Flaugh Road and US 30, the Coldwater Road and I-69 project, interchange improvements along I-469, and some intersection improvement projects along SR 930. There will be some additional money received from the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act. The amount is not known at this time. Mr. Spoelhof asked what the process was for these draft project list. Mr. Avery responded the lists will be discussed at the March 2, 2021 UTAB meeting and ask for approval to advertise the lists for public comment. At the April 6, 2021 UTAB meeting the TIP will be finalized and approved.

The last item of new business was the FY20-24 TIP Amendments. There are three INDOT project amendments. These projects including traffic signals modernization, intersection improvements-slotted left turn, and lighting installed all at various locations in the Fort Wayne District. Ms. Brown made a motion to approve the FY20-24 TIP Amendments. Ms. Wire seconded the motion and it carried.

At this point, Mr. Gunawardena asked for public comment. Mr. Samaan commented on the importance of the US 30 Corridor project.

There being no further business, Mr. Gunawardena adjourned the meeting.

The Kentucky Division Office of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Region 4 of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), in consultation with the Indiana Division Office of the Federal Highway Administration and Regions 4 and 5 of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), have reviewed the following documents:

Amendment 1 to the 2020-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Amendment 1 to the 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) for the Louisville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) (MPO approval date July 23, 2020)

The Kentucky Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet's Division for Air Quality, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Division of Planning, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Office of Transportation Delivery, the Louisville Metro Air Pollution Control District, and the Transit Authority of River City also had an opportunity to review and comment on the aforementioned documents.

We found that these documents meet the five primary criteria of the Transportation Conformity Rule (40 CFR Part 93):

- use of the latest planning assumptions,
- use of the latest emissions model,
- use of appropriate consultation procedures,
- consistency with the mobile vehicle emission budgets in the State Implementation Plan (SIP), and
- provisions for timely implementation of transportation control measures in the SIP.

We found that these documents met the criteria outlined in the July 1, 2004 Transportation Conformity Rule Amendments for New 8-hr Ozone and PM_{2.5} National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), Response to March 1999 Court Decision and Additional Rule Changes (69 FR 40004). We therefore find that these amendments conform to the 2015 8-hour Ozone NAAQS.

RESOLUTION

OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE OHIO-KENTUCKY-INDIANA REGIONAL COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

CONCERNING AMENDMENT #2 OF THE FISCAL YEARS 2021 – 2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Ohio-Kentucky-Indiana Regional Council of Governments (OKI) is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governors of Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) and the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) and in cooperation with locally elected officials in the OKI region; and

WHEREAS, the Intermodal Coordinating Committee (ICC), as the technical advisory committee to OKI, has reviewed and recommended the projects listed in the resolution and recommend that they be added/amended into the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

WHEREAS, all federally funded transit and highway projects in the Ohio Counties of Butler, Clermont, Hamilton and Warren, the Kentucky Counties of Boone, Campbell and Kenton and the Indiana County of Dearborn must be included in the TIP prior to the expenditure of federal funds and be listed with year of expenditure dollars; and

WHEREAS, the amendments are consistent with the *OKI 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan* as adopted on September 10, 2020 and the OKI Regional ITS Architecture adopted on September 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Cincinnati ozone nonattainment area consists of the Ohio counties of Butler, Clermont, Hamilton and Warren; and a portion of the Kentucky counties of Boone, Campbell and Kenton; and OKI's Transportation Plan and TIP are subject to transportation conformity rules; and

WHEREAS, Amendment 2 – Fiscal Years 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program includes the addition of one project and makes funding and timing changes to six other projects that are subject to transportation conformity requirements and these changes have not been previously analyzed, and due to those changes, a new conformity determination is required based on a new regional emissions analysis, and OKI has engaged in interagency consultation with federal, state and local partners, including the U.S. Department of Transportation, and those partners have concurred with the methodology used by OKI to determine conformity; and

WHEREAS, the amended OKI FY 2021-2024 TIP conforms with all applicable U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved State Implementation Plans for air quality; and

WHEREAS, the opportunity for public participation has been provided per OKI's Public Participation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the environmental justice impacts of these amendments have been considered with "Executive Order 12898 Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low Income Populations"; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that remains fiscally constrained: Now,
