






### What is an ecosystem health report card?

- Broad-level assessments of a region or system
- Communicate complex information
- Based on real data: transparent and defendable
- Provide accountability
- Engage communities








# Report cards provide information for multiple users

- Report Card is supported by data
- Methods are transparent
- Users can access information most relevant to them







# The 5-step process of report cards

- Creates engagement from multiple stakeholders
- Forces a critical review of available data
- Forces goal setting and status assessment
- Creates a shared vision
















