4. The percentage difference between the rates and charges imposed on users of the works for service to property located outside the corporate boundaries of the municipality and to property located within the corporate boundaries is approximately 36.5% applied to the monthly base rate. The percentage difference to the total sewage bill varies based upon the amount of consumption.

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 50.092 and 50.093 of the Portland Code of Ordinances.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORTLAND, JAY COUNTY, INDIANA as follows:

Chapter 50.092, Schedule of Rates and Charges, for metered water users and unmetered water users is hereby amended as follows:
