**Request:** I&M is requesting approval of a two-year extension of the date by which application for service under I&M’s Economic Development Rider (“EDR”) can be made, from January 1, 2019 to January 1, 2021. Furthermore, I&M is seeking to extend the EDR stipulation that all billing credits offered under the EDR shall terminate no later than December 31, 2025, by two additional years to December 31, 2027.

I&M’s EDR, which was initially approved on April 19, 2017 in Cause No. 44913, provides discounts for new load of qualifying new or existing customers receiving service under I&M Tariffs GS, LGS, LGS TOD, IP, or CS IRP-2. I&M states that the continuation of its EDR as proposed will further encourage economic development in Indiana by incentivizing businesses to locate new or expanded industry in I&M’s service area, which should benefit all stakeholders through plant and facilities investments, job creation, and preservation opportunities.

**Customer Impact:** No customer impact is expected.

**Tariff Pages Affected:** I.U.R.C. No. 17, First Revised Sheet Nos. 31 and 31.1.

**Staff Recommendations:** I&M has met all requirements for its request. Staff recommends approval of the modified tariff.
