Opportunity for Public Comment on Indiana Michigan Power's Environmental Compliance Case

What: A field hearing will be held in Ft. Wayne by the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (Commission) to hear from the public on Indiana Michigan Power's environmental compliance case petition, under Cause No. 44871.

When: Feb. 21, 2017, at 6 p.m.

Where: Homestead High School, 4310 Homestead Rd., Ft. Wayne, IN 46814

Why: Indiana Michigan Power has filed a petition before the Commission for approval of a clean energy project and qualified pollution control property and for issuance of a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for use of clean coal technology.

How: During field hearings, ratepayers have the opportunity to speak directly to the Commission or submit written comments. Please note, though, that because this is a pending case, the commissioners and judge are not allowed to answer questions or engage in any discussion about the case.
