Request: NIPSCO is proposing to revise its Rider 173 – Universal Service Program (USP) Rider, First Revised Sheet No. 117 of its IURC Gas Service Tariff, Original Volume No. 8.

NIPSCO is proposing revisions to the USP Rider to update the definition of “Hardship Customer” to include customers who fall at or below 250% of the federal poverty guidelines as issued annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. This change will allow NIPSCO to assist a greater number of customers because more customers will be eligible to receive the funding given the tariff currently defines a Hardship Customer to include those customers who were below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines. This change is particularly important as customers are coping with the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Customer Impact: This change does not impact NIPSCO’s September 25, 2020 compliance filing in Cause No. 44094 which was an update to the USP factors for the 2020-2021 heating season since there is no need to change the forecasted number of customers used in the calculation.
