The following Final Article "A" and Preliminary Article "A" are submitted to each of you to acquaint you with the tariffs eligible for action or acceptance on or after July 3, 2007.

“A” Final

The following miscellaneous item(s) will be eligible for final consideration at the next Commission Conference and based upon review by staff members of the Commission, I recommend approval.

1. Indiana Bell Telephone Company, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Indiana

The Company has filed an exception to FCC Transmittal No. 1605 that introduces temporary rate reductions (April 5,2007 to June 30, 2010) in areas where the FCC has granted Phase II pricing flexibility of price cap services. FCC Transmittal No. 1605 was filed on March 29, 2007 and became effective on April 5, 2007. These rate reductions appear in Section 21.5.2.7 of the Ameritech Operating Companies FCC No. 2 Tariff.


These temporary rate reductions are being offered on an interstate basis only and do not apply to the Indiana intrastate jurisdiction.

FCC Transmittal No. 1608 was filed on April 4, 2007, effective on April 5, 2007, and FCC Transmittal No. 1617 filed on May 18, 2007, effective June 2, 2007 are also part of this filing. Both represent a correction to FCC Transmittal No. 1605. FCC Transmittal 1608 deleted several vintage rate pages that were incorrectly added to FCC Transmittal 1605. FCC Transmittal 1617 clarifies the time frame for the rate reductions and the rates that will be in effect after the rate reduction expires, June 30, 2010. AT&T Indiana will mirror the rates that are proposed to take effect on July 1, 2010 for intrastate rates going forward from April 5, 2007.






“A” Preliminary

The following new miscellaneous item has been reviewed by staff members of the Commission and we recommend accepting it for filing.

1. Bargersville Municipal Water Utility

The utility is proposing to add new, larger sprinkler, or fire service connection rates to its current tariff. While it currently has rates for two-, four-, and six-inch connections, the utility is expecting new large customers and seeks to establish eight-, ten-, and twelve-inch rates.


The proposed rates are based upon a generally-accepted practice regarding the ratios of different pipe cross-sections, which approximates the ability to deliver water at a prescribed rate. They have based their calculations on the size and rate of the existing, six-inch connection.

	Current Charge	Proposed Charge
8-inch connection	n/a	\$1,543.13
10-inch connection	n/a	\$ 2,411.13
12-inch connection	n/a	\$ 3,472.00

Finally, to avoid customer confusion, the utility also seeks to rename its “Facility Charge” to “Monthly Base Charge.” This represents the fixed charge, or amount that the customer must pay whether or not there is any water consumption.
