

LSTA Grant Awards for 2008

Technology Grants

The Indiana State Library received 41 applications for the LSTA Technology Grant Program requesting almost \$258,895. Twenty-five libraries received grants totaling \$155,000. This year the awards distributed among fifteen public libraries, eight school media centers, and two academic libraries. Projects varied greatly among libraries.

Digitization Grants

This year, the Indiana State Library was able to fund each of the project applications submitted. Ten libraries, six academic and four public, submitted applications with a total request of \$142,000. Individual awards varied from \$1,000 to \$24,000. Project topics include: WWII correspondence, women's history collections, historic clothing, African-American texts, early legislative history, photographs, and newspapers.

Innovative Library Project Grants

The Innovative Library Project Grant program is new for 2008. Eligible projects were requested to utilize cutting-edge technology and have the potential to be adapted for statewide impact. The Indiana State Library received 8 applications requesting \$583,126. Five grants were awarded to three public libraries, one academic library and one school media center for a total of \$193,009.

Institutional Literacy Grants

Twenty-three institutional libraries applied for the 2008 LSTA literacy and technology grant. Seventeen were successful applicants. Applicants could request up to \$7,500 of the \$100,000 available. Most applicants will purchase books, software, or computer lab components. Awards ranged from \$2,482 to \$7,500. Of the 17 successful applicants, 13 are Department of Correction Facilities; two are Indiana State Department of Health facilities; one is a Family and Social Services facility; and one is the Indiana School for the Blind & Visually Impaired.
