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#### PREPARE FOR WINTER

Indiana's <u>winter disconnection moratorium</u> for electric and natural gas services starts on Dec. 1. However, it only applies if the consumer is receiving help from the federally funded <u>Energy Efficiency Program</u> (EAP) or if the customer's local EAP intake office has notified the



utility that the customer is qualified. EAP <u>intake offices</u> in each Indiana county are taking applications (or making appointments) now. Consumers can also apply <u>online</u>.

In addition, many Indiana utilities are still offering extended payment plans due to the COVID-19 pandemic. If you receive a utility bill that you cannot pay on time and in full, it is critical to contact the utility immediately to ask about payment arrangements and request a plan you can afford. OUCC staff (pictured) appeared on a recent <u>Facebook Live</u> discussion with AARP Indiana to discuss payment plans and related issues.

Indiana's 2-1-1 help line can direct consumers to local resources for financial assistance and to their county EAP intake offices. Township trustees and certain utilities also offer assistance to consumers in need

In addition, consumers living in apartments and other rental units should be aware of the Emergency Solutions Grant CARES Act rental assistance program. Qualifying renters can receive up to 6 months in rental assistance to cover past due and ongoing monthly rent payments. # **CASE UPDATES**

- Vectren has filed a new natural gas rate case for its southwestern Indiana service territory.
   OUCC staff will review the request and will likely have a February deadline to file testimony
- The IURC's evidentiary hearing on Vectren's proposed solar energy tariff has been rescheduled to Nov. 17.
- The OUCC has filed its Duke Energy rate case brief with the Indiana Court of Appeals.
- OUCC testimony in several rate cases will be filed in the next few weeks. They include <u>Aqua Indiana</u> (Nov. 12), <u>LMS Conservancy District</u> (Nov. 12), <u>American Suburban Utilities</u> (Nov. 18), <u>Columbus City Utilities</u> (Dec. 11), and <u>Crawfordsville Electric Light & Power</u> (Dec. 23). <u>Written consumer comments are invited in all cases.</u>
