GRANTEE AND SUBGRANTEE ELIGIBILITY

1. Is the borrower/owner or subgrantee a potentially responsible (liable) party (PRP) under CERCLA for contamination on the site?

If YES, the site is **NOT** eligible for RLF funding.

The party must satisfy all of the following requirements to be noni liable:

- a. The party did not cause the contamination or own the Site during disposal
- b. The party acquired the Site after contamination/disposal occurred and satisfied(ies) the following two requirements:
- i. The party conducted All Appropriate Inquiry (AAI) <u>prior</u> to purchase?
 - 1. Prior to 1980: ??? (this is a gray area)
 - 2. 1980 - 1986/1987 – some type of environmental inspection consistent with the standard of practice at the time of acquisition
 - 3. 1986/1987 1993: Phase I ESA
 - 4. 1993 2002: ASTM E-1527 or equivalent **Phase I ESA**
 - 5. 2002 Date: ASTM E-1527-05/13 **Phase I ESA** or CERCLA AAI
- ii. The party has fulfilled the following Continuing Obligations:
 - 1. Take reasonable steps to prevent continuing releases; prevent future releases; and prevent or limit human, environmental, or natural resource exposure to hazardous substances
 - 2. Comply with land use restrictions and not impede the effectiveness or integrity of institutional controls

Also,

- 1. Provide access/cooperation to persons conducting response actions or natural resource restoration on the Site
- 2. Provide all legally required notices with respect to the discovery or release of any hazardous substances at the Site
- 3. Comply with any request for information or administrative subpoena issued under CERCLA (Superfund)
- ➤ If YES the Site may be eligible for RLF funding.
- 2. Does a unit of government or non-profit agency/corporation own the site?
 - If YES, the Site may be eligible for an RLF subgrant or loan forgiveness.

CLEANUP ACTIVITY ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Potential Eligible response activities include:
 - a. "Limited" assessment/delineation
 - b. Cleanup design
 - c. Pilot studies
 - d. Source removal
 - e. Source treatment
 - f. Exposure mitigation (engineered barriers, vapor mitigation, fences)
 - g. PCB cleanup
 - h. Asbestos abatement
 - i. Demolition, under limited circumstances with EPA approval if needed to conduct environmental response activities
