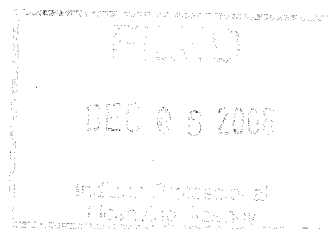

PETITION FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION

The State of Indiana, by Counsel, Shelley M. Johnson, Deputy Attorney General, moves the Indiana State Board Of Nursing (“Board”) to suspend the license of Georgetta Sue Parton, L.P.N. (“Respondent”) for 90 days, and in support of its petition states the following:

1. Respondent is a licensed Licensed Practical Nurse in the State of Indiana.
2. This Board has jurisdiction to suspend Respondent’s license in accordance with the provisions of Indiana Code § 4-21.5-4 et seq. and Indiana Code § 25-1-9-10.
3. If allowed to continue to practice as a licensed Licensed Practical Nurse, Respondent represents a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety for the following reasons:

Respondent initiated the intake process for the Indiana State Nurses Assistance Program (“ISNAP”) on or about March 28, 2006 due to suspected diversion of narcotics. Respondent had a prescription for Vicodin and Xanax. On or about April 28, 2006, Respondent was diagnosed with Opioid abuse. On or about May 1, 2006, the ISNAP clinical team met and recommended an eighteen (18) month Recovery Monitoring Agreement (“RMA”). On or about May 22, 2006, ISNAP called the Respondent because she failed to sign and return her RMA. On or about June 16, 2006, Respondent returned her signed RMA to ISNAP.

On or about September 6, 2006, ISNAP called the Respondent and left her a voicemail to return their call to discuss what medications she was currently taking. Respondent did not respond to the telephone call.

On or about October 26, 2006, Jan Senteney, Administrator of Summerhill, called to inform ISNAP that the Respondent had been "pre-setting medications." When confronted by Ms. Senteney, the Respondent lost control and started yelling and proceeded to walk out. Respondent was terminated from her position at Summerhill. Ms. Senteney expressed concerns that the Respondent was showing signs of impairment such as mood liability, inaccessibility, leaving work station sporadically and attendance problems.


On or about November 2, 2006, ISNAP performed a quarterly review and the Respondent was in significant non-compliance. She was missing addictionologist reports, and her monthly reports.

On or about November 11, 2006, Respondent's case was closed with ISNAP for non-compliance.

WHEREFORE, the State of Indiana requests that this Board set a hearing on this petition for summary suspension and suspend Respondent's license for a period of ninety (90) days and for all other proper relief.


