



times while he was attempting to stop her from striking his father. After battering her husband, Respondent carved the words "Die" and "F\*\*\*er" on the wooden stock of a shotgun his father had given him.

5. On or about August 8, 2012, Respondent was charged with domestic battery, a Class A misdemeanor; battery resulting in bodily injury, a Class A misdemeanor; and criminal mischief, a Class B misdemeanor; in Vermillion County, Indiana, in Cause No. 83C01-1208-CM-000216.

6. On or about August 8, 2012, Respondent was ordered to have no contact with her husband in Cause No. 83C01-1208-CM-000216.

7. On or about December 19, 2012, Respondent was charged with battery causing serious bodily injury, a Class C felony, in Vermillion County, Indiana, in Cause No. 83C01-1212-FC-000018, due to her hitting and battering her husband causing him to become unconscious on or about July 29, 2012.

8. On or about December 26, 2012, Respondent was ordered to have no contact with her husband in Cause No. 83C01-1212-FC-000018.

9. On or about December 30, 2012, Respondent's husband passed away.

10. On February 14, 2013, Petitioner filed a Petition for the Summary Suspension of Respondent's nursing license.

11. On February 21, 2013, after a hearing on the matter, the Board found that an emergency existed and that Respondent represented a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to continue to practice as a Registered Nurse in the State of Indiana and by a vote of 7-0-0, ordered the Emergency Suspension of Respondent's Indiana nursing license for ninety (90) days.

12. On or about May 13, 2013, Respondent initiated intake with the Indiana State Nurses Assistance Program (ISNAP).

13. On May 16, 2013, after a hearing on the matter, the Board, by a vote of 6-0-0, found that Respondent continued to represent a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety and voted for Respondent's license to continue to be on Summary Suspension for an additional ninety (90) days.

14. On or about June 13, 2013, Respondent was assessed and diagnosed with alcohol dependence.

15. On or about July 5, 2013, Respondent entered into a three (3) year Recovery Monitoring Agreement (RMA) with ISNAP.

16. On or about August 14, 2013, Respondent's current Summary Suspension period may expire.


17. As of August 12, 2013, Respondent's criminal matter, Cause No. 83C01-1212-FC-000018, is still pending and a jury trial is currently set for November 4, 2013.

18. Based on the evidence previously presented to the Board on February 21, 2013, including, but not limited to, the underlying facts alleged in Cause No. 83C01-1212-FC-000018, the State argues Respondent represents a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to continue to practice nursing.

**WHEREFORE**, the State of Indiana requests that this Board set a hearing on this petition for summary suspension and suspend Respondent's license for a period of ninety (90) days and for all other proper relief.
