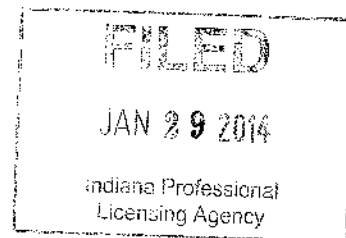

SUMMARY SUSPENSION ORDER

The Indiana State Board of Nursing (“Board”), pursuant to the authority of Ind. Code § 4-21.5-4-1 *et seq.* and Ind. Code § 25-1-9-10, by a vote of 5-0-0 at its regularly scheduled meeting on January 16, 2013, in the Auditorium of the Indiana Government Center South, 302 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana 46204, **SUMMARILY SUSPENDS** the Registered Nurse license held by Valerie Roll, R.N. (“Respondent”) for ninety (90) days, as the Board finds that an emergency exists and that Respondent represents a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to continue to practice as a licensed Registered Nurse in the State of Indiana.

The State of Indiana (“Petitioner”) was represented by David A. Fleischhacker, Deputy Attorney General. Respondent did not appear in person or by counsel.

This **NON-FINAL** emergency order is based on the following:

1. The Respondent is a Registered Nurse (“R.N.”) in the State of Indiana having been issued license number 28181262A in September 2008.
2. The Respondent’s address on file with the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency is 100 Miede Drive, New Albany, Indiana 47150. The Respondent is believed to accept mail at 520 Henretty Road, Underwood, Indiana 47177.

3. This Board has jurisdiction to suspend the Respondent's license in accordance with the provisions of Ind. Code ch. 4-21.5-4 and Ind. Code § 25-1-9-10.

4. On or about October 20, 2003, the Respondent was charged in Jackson County, Indiana in Cause Number 36C01-0310-FD-289 with resisting law enforcement, a Class D Felony; possession of a controlled substance, a Class D Felony; operating a vehicle while intoxicated ("OWI") endangering a person, a Class A Misdemeanor; and failure to stop after an accident resulting in damage to property other than a vehicle, a Class B Misdemeanor. The charges alleged the Respondent crashed into a vendor stand with her vehicle and then fled law enforcement, failed multiple sobriety tests, and was in possession of Xanax.

5. On or about June 3, 2004, the Respondent pled guilty to and was convicted in Cause Number 36C01-0310-FD-289 of resisting law enforcement, a Class A Misdemeanor, and OWI, a Class A Misdemeanor. All other charges were dismissed. On each count, the Respondent was sentenced to 365 days incarceration, all suspended, consecutively, and was placed on supervised probation for two (2) years.

6. On or about June 20, 2008, the Respondent submitted an Application for Licensure by Examination for an Indiana R.N. license. She answered "No" when asked, "Have you ever been convicted of, pled guilty or nolo contendere to any offense, misdemeanor or felony in any state?" on the application form.

7. On or about September 3, 2008, the Respondent submitted a repeat Application for Licensure by Examination for an Indiana R.N. license. She again answered "No" when asked, "Have you ever been convicted of, pled guilty or nolo contendere to any offense, misdemeanor or felony in any state?" on the application form.

8. On or about January 7, 2013, the Respondent was charged in Scott County, Indiana in Cause Number 72D01-1301-FD-0005 with fleeing law enforcement, a Class A Misdemeanor; resisting law enforcement, a Class A Misdemeanor; theft, a Class D Felony; possession of a controlled substance, a Class D Felony; and possession of paraphernalia, a Class A Misdemeanor. The charges alleged the Respondent stole multiple items from a supermarket, fled police on foot, and possessed a spoon with burnt residue and half a tablet of Opana.

9. On or about January 30, 2013, the Respondent was charged in Clark County, Indiana in Cause Number 10C02-1301-FD-184 with possession of methamphetamine, a Class D Felony; possession of a hypodermic needle, a Class D Felony; visiting a common nuisance, a Class B Misdemeanor; and possession of paraphernalia, a Class A Misdemeanor. The charges alleged the Respondent was present at a residence where numerous syringes and drug paraphernalia, including a glass pipe and spoons with burnt residue, were found.

10. On or about January 31, 2013, the Respondent was charged in Jackson County, Indiana in Cause Number 36C01-1301-FD-51 with theft, a Class D Felony. The charge alleged the Respondent diverted morphine from a resident in October 2012 at Hoosier Christian Village located in Brownstown, Indiana, where she worked.

11. On or about March 15, 2013, Petitioner filed a Petition for Summary Suspension against the Respondent's license.

12. On or about March 21, 2013, the Board summarily suspended the Respondent's Indiana nursing license for ninety (90) days.

13. On or about June 20, 2013, the Respondent was charged in Scott County, Indiana in Cause Number 72D01-1306-FD-000204 with unlawful possession of a syringe, a Class D Felony.

14. On or about July 16, 2013, Petitioner filed a Petition for Summary Suspension against the Respondent's license.

15. On or about July 18, 2013, the Board summarily suspended the Respondent's Indiana nursing license for ninety (90) days.

16. On or about September 26, 2013, the Respondent pled guilty to and was convicted in Cause Number 72D01-1301-FD-0005 in Scott County, Indiana of theft and possession of a controlled substance, both as Class A Misdemeanors. She was sentenced to 365 days incarceration, with 349 days suspended and credit given for sixteen (16) days based on time served, and placed on probation for 349 days. She was further ordered to enter the Scott County Drug and Alcohol Program.

17. On or about September 26, 2013, the Respondent pled guilty to and was convicted in Cause Number 72D01-1306-FD-000204 in Scott County, Indiana of unlawful possession of a syringe, a Class D Felony. She was sentenced to 196 days incarceration with credit given for 196 days based on time served.

18. On or about October 15, 2013, Petitioner filed a Petition for Summary Suspension against the Respondent's license.

19. On or about October 17, 2013, the Board summarily suspended the Respondent's Indiana nursing license for ninety (90) days.

20. As of January 15, 2014, the Respondent's criminal matters in Clark and Jackson counties remain pending.


21. On or about January 15, 2014, the current summary suspension on the Respondent's license lapsed.

WHEREFORE, RESPONDENT IS ORDERED to immediately cease and desist all acts constituting the practice of Nursing for a period of ninety (90) days from the effective date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent shall immediately surrender all indicia of licensure to the Board in care of Indiana Professional Licensing Agency, 302 West Washington Street, Room W072, Indianapolis, Indiana 46204.
