Her Cabin at Wildflower Woods is nestled on the shores of Sylvan Lake amongst 148 acres of fields, woods and beautiful formal gardens. Academic topics covered include natural history, environmentalism, early 20th century culture (1913-1925), and art, science, reading and writing.

Spaces available for use

Interior

- Carriage House upstairs (elevator access) holds 40 people sitting, 60 without tables and chairs.

Outside Gardens

- Good for wandering or plain air and up to 50 people depending on location.
- Pavilion with picnic tables holds 70 people under pavilion with additional seating (up to 150 people in surrounding lawn).
- Front porch with lawn holds around 50 people.

Hours

The Gene Stratton-Porter Historic Site is open:

- **Tuesday–Saturday** 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- **Sunday** 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Closed on Mondays and December through March (except by appointment). The grounds are open dawn to dusk year round.



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
