## STEP #1



#### CSR Abuse: Affects at MGH

- Rise in patient requests in ED & Physician Offices
- Patient's disposition and aggressiveness
- Climate: threatening, volatile & disruptive
   = employee and physician dissatisfaction
- Q: Research how other hospital system's handling?
- A: NO MODEL, Create our own roadmap





## STEP #2: Self Evaluation

RAL HOSPITAL

In 2012-2013

- 27,000 Doses (30,000 tablets) of hydrocodone containing pain reliever
- 10,000 Hydromorphone injections
- 7,000 Fentanyl injections
- 11,000 Morphine injections
- Over 63,000 units of OOCS were administered hospital wide
- Over 9,600 doses of OOCS were administered in ED
- 2,343 (21%) patients prescribed OOCS
- 36,400 pills prescribed
- 15.5 average pills per patient
- Largest single prescription Lortab 5-500 #60 for rib fracture
- Second largest prescription Norco 5-325 #40 for toothache





## CSR Abuse: Affects in our Community Reality Check



Pills were entering the local streets from Rx written from our community's medical staff.

- Believed in the ethical backbone of our medical staff. Was no intention to cause harm or provide an access in pills.

   Administrators to DO THE RIGHT THING







## HIV Hep C In Grant County


#### Indiana Persons Living with HIV/AIDS as of December 31, 2016
