

2020-2021 FAFSA Completion Update

As of January 17, 2020...

Indiana residents:

115,884 applications (up 2.7% year-to-date)

<u>Indiana high school seniors</u>:

- 27,688 applications (NCAN FAFSA Tracker) or 34.3%
- 29,469 applications (ScholarTrack) or 36.4%

Senior 21st Century Scholars:

5,608 applications or 39.3%



2020-2021 FAFSA Completion Update

- Beginning in 2019, Indiana high schools are required to sign a data-sharing agreement with ICHE to participate in the federal government's FAFSA Completion Initiative.
- ICHE provides student-level FAFSA completion data to participating high schools through ScholarTrack.
- 476 high schools including all traditional public schools have signed an agreement to date.

Upcoming Changes

21st Century Scholars Secondary Means Test

- Beginning with high school graduating class of 2020, Scholars must have a household size and household income on the FAFSA that is below 370% of the Federal Poverty Level.
- Scholars who exceed the secondary means test are removed from the program and may receive a one-time \$2,500 award.

 Family 370% of the 2018

Add \$15,984 for each additional family member



21st Century Scholars Secondary Means Test

- Any Scholars above the threshold who are still Pell eligible are exempt.
- Any Scholars who enrolled due to placement in a legal guardianship or foster care are exempt.
- Scholars in high school graduating classes earlier than 2020 will still be held to the \$24,570 EFC means test until the 2023-2024 award year.

Household Size

SAP Requirement for CVO

 Effective for terms beginning after July 1,
 2020, Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) is required for all Tuition and Fee Exemptions (CVO) at public institutions.



College Scholar Success Program

 Beginning 2020-2021, 21st Century Scholars in the high school graduating class of 2019 or later are required to annually complete a College Scholar Success Program.

 This will first impact award renewal in 2021-2022 award year.

2020 Legislative Update

Overview

A total of 902 bills were introduced this Session

More than 166 bills directly impact P-12 and higher education

We are tracking only nine bills fewer bills than last
 Session even though 442 fewer bills were filed



Overview

 The 3rd reading deadline is February 3rd in the House and February 4th in the Senate

The second half of session will start February 10th

Session is scheduled to end by March 14th



ICHE Agenda Bill

HB 1082: Various Higher Education Matters

You Can. Go Back. Renewal

- Removes language sun-setting the program
- Allows ICHE to contact stop-outs sooner

EARN Indiana Changes

- Removes hour restriction on summertime internships
- Removes requirement for juniors and below to fill out the FAFSA

Graduate Medical Education Board

 Technical change: Prevents GMEB funds from reverting to the Tobacco Master Settlement Fund.



Various Financial Aid Bills

FAFSA Requirements

SB 223:

- Requires all students to complete the FAFSA during senior year of high school
- Allows waivers
 - Parent refuses to fill it out
 - School has contacted parent with no response
 - Student is 18 or emancipated and can opt his or herself out
- Requires the Commission to include information about the requirement in the annual FAFSA notice



21st Century Scholars Program

HB 1066: Various Education Matters

 Allows dual enrollment high school students who are enrolled "full time" to access their 21st Century Scholarship prior to high school graduation.

HB 1321: Twenty-First Century Scholars Program

Allows high school students enrolled in the 21st
 Century Scholars program to access their funding
 prior to high school graduation if enrolled in CELL
 approved early college program.



21st Century Scholars Program

SB 412: 21st Century Scholars Program

 Codifies the requirement that the Commission waive the one year matriculation requirement for religious mission trips.

SB 357: Twenty-First Century Scholars Program Eligibility

 Provides high school students receiving services under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance act to enroll in 21st Century Scholars after 8th grade.



Bills of Interest

HB 1007: Fiscal Matters

 Cash funds various capital project at public colleges and universities

HB 1414: Electric Generation

 Gives dislocated coal mine employees priority when awarding credit-bearing Workforce Ready Grants

SB 316: Collection of Veteran Status Information

 Requires various agencies, including ICHE, to include questions about veteran status on all applications



Military Aid Programs

HB 1329/HB1333/1398: Various CVO Bills

- Removes the 2011 reforms from the CVO program
- Restricts CVO to undergraduate programs
- Reduces eligibility by the amount of dual credit earned in high school

HB 1086: Reservist Tuition Supplement Program

Creates a program NGSG like program for Reservists

HB 1110: Health Workforce Student Loan Repayment Program

HB 1340: Repayment of Federal Student Loans

SB 64: Indiana Youth Service Program

SB 287: Scholarship in Health Care for Minority Students
