Allen County next stop on Commissioner's statewide "College Success Tour"

Indiana Commissioner for Higher Education Teresa Lubbers will be at Indiana Tech today, on her statewide "College Success Tour". She will be engaging the public and local college success coalition members in a discussion to help support students in the community. The event will begin at 4:00 p.m.

"Today we have 50 county coalitions working together to offer students and families across Indiana more opportunities and brighter futures, and we plan to bring on an additional 20 counties each year until we have reached all 92 Indiana counties. We want to partner with community leaders in Northeastern Indiana and across our state to help more Hoosiers of all ages to complete education beyond high school," said Lubbers.

Indiana currently ranks 40th nationally in both education attainment and personal per capita income, two data points that are directly linked to the fact that only a third of Hoosier adults have more than a high school diploma. Indiana has set a goal of increasing the proportion of Hoosiers with a college credential, including one-year workforce certificates, two-year associate degrees and four year bachelor's degrees, to 60 percent of the state's population by 2025. Less than 40 percent of Allen county residents currently have college credentials. The county has the highest number of 21st Century Scholars in the region, with more than 6,000 scholars in grades 7-12.

College Success Summits

Sponsored by the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, the regional "College Success Summits" events are taking place in the outreach regions for the 21st Century Scholars program, the state's premier college scholarship and preparation program for low-income students. Each regional event will be hosted by a county College Success Coalition, a growing statewide network of nearly 1,500 local organizations working to increase college access and success.

Through the Commission's Learn More Indiana outreach initiative, the state has supported the development of 50 county College Success Coalitions to date with another 20 counties invited to form coalitions this fall.
