


Same campus and degree level




More students are graduating from college in indiana.

At public institutions, 42.3 percent of all Indiana college students graduate on time. Nearly two-thirds (62 percent) of all students complete college within six years.


EXTENDED TIME COMPLETION

Any campus or degree level within six years




STEM SUCCESS

Students who pursue a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math (STEM) program of study are more likely to graduate on-time than students pursuing other majors.




SCHOLARS ON TRACK

Adult learners, low-income and minority students are less likely to graduate on time than their peers across all campus types.




PART-TIME STUDENTS

About 90% of part-time students start at two-year campuses. The extended-time completion rates of those who start part-time (23.1%) are lower than students who enter full-time (36.9%) at two-year institutions.
