College Completion in Indiana is Trending Upward, but Achievement Gaps are Also Widening

Increasing Indiana's college completion rates is the most important goal for the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, as completion is our most powerful tool to measure success.

The 2020 College Completion Report will show:

- How Indiana's college graduates overall are faring at completing their schooling on time (within two years for an associate degree or four years for a bachelor's degree) or within an extended timeframe (within six years of beginning any degree program)
- The on-time and extended-time completion rates at all of Indiana's public colleges and universities, along with demographic break-outs, persistence rates and trends over time for each institution
- A spotlight on growing achievement gaps, particularly with regard to race and ethnicity

As the Commission states in its fourth strategic plan for higher education, *Reaching Higher in a State of Change*, completion is "the key to unlocking individual opportunity for all Hoosiers and ultimately strengthening our economy and personal well-being."

We're not taking the significance of completion lightly.

As we continue on to 2025 with *Reaching Higher in a State of Change* as our guiding document, the Commission will release annual report cards updating our progress on key metrics. Along with Indiana's college-going rate and economic metrics, we will track the on-time, six-year, and adult learner completion rates.

Indiana set a goal in 2012 of having at least 60 percent of working-age Hoosiers with education and training beyond high school by 2025. We cannot make it to that goal without increasing Indiana's college completion rates for all populations of students.

We track completion in two ways: on time and extended time. Completing college on time is crucial for a student's return on investment. The Commission's 2020 College Value Report shows taking extra time to earn a two-year or four-year degree can cost thousands extra in added tuition and debt (not including lost wages during that extra time). Our most significant success in the past five years has been the improvement in on-time completion rates.

Tracking extended-time completion allows us to follow students who transfer schools and finish their degree elsewhere. It also accounts for students' unexpected life events (living through a global pandemic, for example).

Completion, equity and talent

The Commission identifies three priority areas in *Reaching Higher in a State of Change*: completion, equity and talent. These priorities correlate and overlap and we again highlight this convergence in the 2020 College Completion Report.

An important discussion around equity and completion is how underrepresented populations complete college. The good news is on-time and extended-time completion rates overall for minority students are increasing, though gaps persist—particularly for Black and Hispanic college students in Indiana.

The on-time completion achievement gap between Hispanic students and the statewide average is smaller than the gap between Black students and the statewide average: 8.5 percentage points, compared to 20.6 percentage points, respectively. These gaps require targeted and comprehensive student supports.

The significant impact of Indiana's landmark early college promise program, 21st Century Scholars, is highlighted again in the Completion Report (as it was in the 2020 College Readiness Report and will be in the forthcoming 2020 College Equity Report).

Scholars' on-time completion rates continue to improve, almost doubling since 2015, likely due to the impact of credit completion requirements, the requirements for Scholars to complete the Scholar Success Program to earn their scholarship and general strengthening of the program over time.

The impact of the last strategic plan priority—talent—is part of the larger picture of completion.

To achieve economic security or success in today's economy, education beyond high school is vital and ongoing, as most new jobs created today require some form of higher learning. An important consideration is the program of study: Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) majors, for example, have higher on-time and extended-time graduation rates than students in other majors.

This report documents the importance of completion. When students pursue and complete postsecondary credentials, it ensures a stronger state economy and greater personal opportunity.

More Hoosier students are completing their degrees

Indiana is making gains when it comes to the number of students who graduate from its public colleges, with improvement in on-time and extended-time completion rates.

On-time completion:

The most recent data reveal 42.3% of all Hoosier college students graduate on time. This represents a one-year increase of 1.7 percentage points and a 13.3 point increase in five years.

Nearly half (48.4%) of all Hoosier students who attend a public four-year campus graduate on time, an improvement of 12.2 percentage points over the past five years and a 1.1 percentage point one-year increase.

On-time completion rates at Indiana's two-year campuses have more than doubled in a five year period, with 15.7% of students graduating on time in 2019—a nearly 2 percent increase since the prior year.


At the state's four-year campuses, Ball State University, Indiana University Bloomington and Purdue University West Lafayette achieved the overall highest on-time completion rates. Fouryear campuses with the most improved on-time completion rates (over five years) are: Indiana University East, Indiana University Northwest, Indiana University Purdue University - Indianapolis (IUPUI), Purdue University Fort Wayne and University of Southern Indiana.

Extended-time completion:

More Hoosiers than ever before—almost twothirds of all students (62 percent) complete a degree (bachelor's or associate) within six years of beginning the degree program. Nearly 37 percent of students at two-year campuses graduate within six years, a 1.6 percent one-year increase.

Gaps remain for minority students - but completion rates are improving

Completion rates for minority students have increased in both on-time and extended-time measurements, but the achievement gaps for Black and Hispanic students remain.

On-time and extended-time completion rates for Black and Hispanic and Latino graduates have increased in the past five years.

The on-time completion rates for Black students increased over 11 percentage points in five years.

In comparison to their Hispanic and Latino peers, Black students have a greater disparity in on-time completion rates and the statewide average (8.5 percentage points and 20.6 percentage points, respectively). The completion gap is smaller for Hispanic and Latino students, however, there was a decrease in extended-time completion rates over the previous year—and only a small increase in one-year extended rates.

21st Century Scholars continue to improve

Over the past five years, the on-time completion rate for 21st Century Scholars has improved by 16 percentage points, almost doubling since 2015 and increasing by more than 3 percentage points in one year.

The on-time completion rate for Scholars at four-year main campuses has also improved (2.4 percentage points over the previous year), and there is now almost no gap between Scholars and the overall on-time completion rate at four-year non-main campuses.

Scholars are also more likely to graduate on time at two-year campuses than the overall student population. Scholars are graduating at an ontime rate of 21.1%, a 15.3 percentage point increase over the last five years and a 2.5 percentage point increase in one year.




Programs of study and enrollment status make a difference

Students who study Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) fields are more likely to graduate than peers in other programs of study: 48 percent of STEM degree seekers graduated on-time in 2018 (compared to 42.3 percent for the statewide average). Almost 70 percent graduated within six years (compared to 62.0 percent statewide).

Additionally, the majority of students who start college part-time enroll at two-year institutions (89.4 percent). However, the extended completion rates for part-time students is about 14 percentage points lower than for those who begin full-time at two-year colleges.


The on-time completion rate for adult learners (age 25 and up) has increased over the past five years, from less than 8 percent to 17.5 percent. However, there were less students in the postsecondary pipeline last year than in the wake of the Great Recession.

Same campus and degree level



At public institutions, 42.3 percent of all Indiana college students graduate on time. Nearly two-thirds (62 percent) of all students complete college within six years.


EXTENDED TIME COMPLETION

Any campus or degree level within six years




STEM SUCCESS

Students who pursue a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math (STEM) program of study are more likely to graduate on-time than students pursuing other majors.




SCHOLARS ON TRACK

Adult learners, low-income and minority students are less likely to graduate on time than their peers across all campus types.




PART-TIME STUDENTS

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COHORT PROFILE* (% OF FIRST-TIME, FULL-TIME STUDENTS)





ABOUT THE DATA

General Notes and Sources:

Cohorts were created using data submitted by Indiana public institutions to the Indiana Commission for Higher Education (CHE) through the CHE Data Submission System (CHEDSS). Cohorts were tracked longitudinally using subsequent data submitted by public institutions through CHEDSS and further augmented by enrollment and completion data obtained from the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC). Financial aid and other disaggregations were developed using CHEDSS and the CHE ScholarTrack financial aid database.

College Campus Types:

Four-Year Main Campus: Ball State University, Indiana State University, Indiana University-Bloomington, Purdue University-West Lafayette, and University of Southern Indiana

Four-Year Non-Main Campus: Indiana University-East, Indiana University-Kokomo, Indiana University-Northwest, Indiana University-South Bend, Indiana University-Southeast, Indiana University-Purdue University-Indianapolis, Purdue University-Fort Wayne, Purdue University-Northwest, and Purdue University-Polytechnic Two-Year Campus: Ivy Tech Community College and Vincennes University

Data Element Definitions:

Student Cohorts (First-Time, Full-Time): Unless otherwise noted, cohorts throughout the report include students enrolling as first-time students in their entry year and who were degree-seeking students in the fall semester enrolled full-time (12 or more credit hours) as of institution census date. For purposes of data consistency across years, student enrollment status reported as of end of term instead of census date was used for Vincennes University.

Part-Time Student Cohorts: In some cases, data on part-time student cohorts are provided. These include students enrolling as first-time students in their entry year and who were degree-seeking students in the fall semester enrolled part-time (less than 12 credit hours) as of institution census date. For purposes of data consistency across years, student enrollment status reported as of end of term instead of census date was used for Vincennes University. For some campuses, part-time data are reported sparingly or not at all, and limitations are noted when necessary in the report.

Four-Year Institutions: available through fall 2015 starters
Two-Year Institutions: available through fall 2017 starters

Degree seeking status:

Four-Year Cohorts: represent students seeking a bachelor's degree in the fall semester

Two-Year Cohorts: represent students seeking a long-term certificate (1-2 years) or associate degree in the fall semester

Same Campus and Degree Level: Represents students in cohort who completed a credential at the same level initially sought at the same Indiana public college/university system in which they initially enrolled.

Different Campus or Degree Level: Represents students in cohort who completed a credential at a lower level than initially sought at the same college/university system in which they initially enrolled OR completed any degree at any other public institution in Indiana, or at a private or for-profit college/university in Indiana or elsewhere in the United States, provided the college or university participates in the National Student Clearinghouse.

Any Campus or Degree Level (Total Completion): Represents students in cohort who completed any credential at any public institution in Indiana, or at a private or for-profit college/university in Indiana or elsewhere in the United States, provided the college or university participates in the National Student Clearinghouse. This is a combination/sum of the "Same Campus and Degree Level" and "Different Campus or Degree Level" completion categories.

Still Enrolled Somewhere: Represents students in cohort who, at a particular point in time after initial enrollment, have not obtained a credential and are still enrolled at any public institution in Indiana, or at a private or for-profit college/university in Indiana or elsewhere in the United States, provided the college or university participates in the National Student Clearinghouse. This snapshot of student status at a discrete point in time differs from cumulative completion categories, which capture all completions occurring within a given window (within 100%, 150%, 200%, or 300% of normal/expected time to completion after initial college enrollment).

Not Enrolled, No Degree: Represents students in cohort who, at a particular point in time after initial enrollment, have not obtained a degree and are not enrolled at any public institution in Indiana, or at a private or for-profile college/university in Indiana or elsewhere in the United States, provided the college or university participates in the National Student Clearinghouse. This snapshot of student status at a discrete point in time differs from cumulative completion categories, which capture all completions occurring within a given window (within 100%, 150%, 200%, or 300% of normal/expected time to completion after initial college enrollment).

Disaggregations:

Note only cohorts having 10 or more students included are reported.

Other Low-Income (PDF Feedback Reports Only): Represents students who were identified as receiving a Pell grant during their first year of college, excluding 21st Century Scholars. Sources: CHEDSS, CHE ScholarTrack

No State Aid or Pell: Includes any students not falling into the financial aid status groups above.

Race/Ethnicity Categories: A student is assigned to a race/ethnicity category based on his/her race/ethnicity as reported in the first year in which the student enrolled. Source: CHEDSS

Age Categories: A student is assigned to an age group category based on his/ her date of birth as reported in the first year in which the student enrolled. Source: CHEDSS

Adults (Age 25+): Represent students ages 25 or older based on date of birth as reported in the first year in which the student enrolled. Source: CHEDSS.

Completion Rates:
