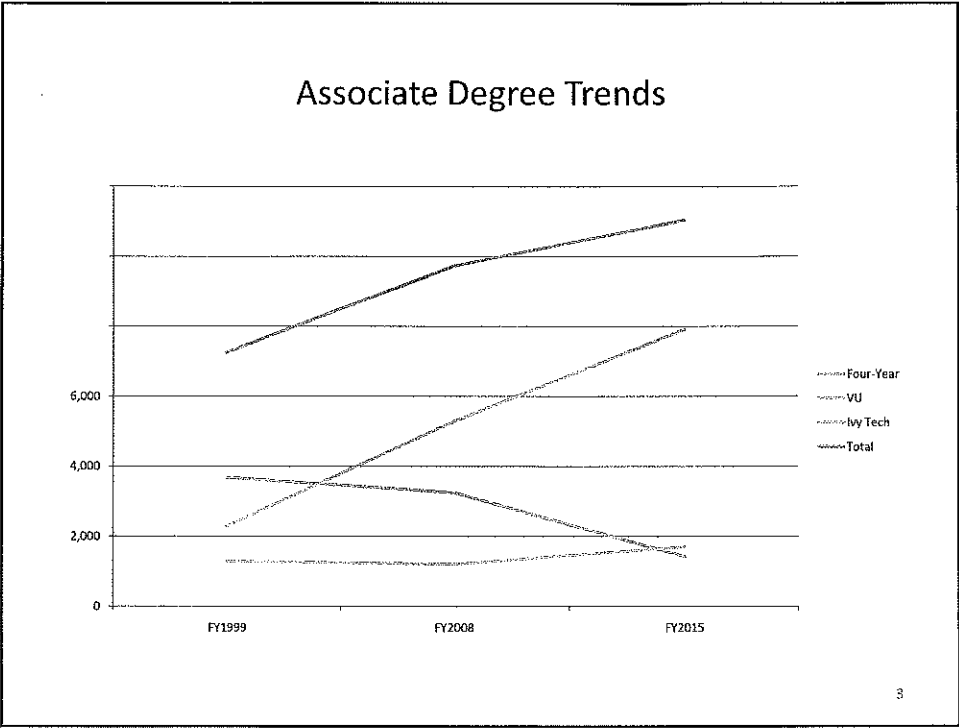


# Trends in Indiana Associate Degree Production

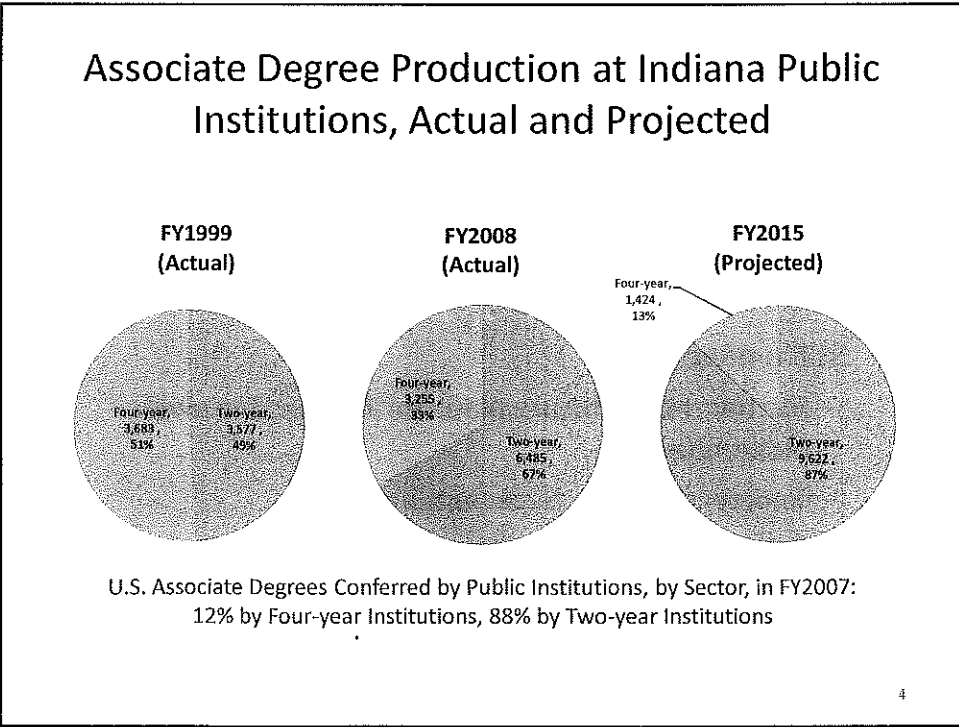

## Regarding Associate Degree Programs at University Campuses ...

- No changes to the status of programs as presented at the November CHE meeting
- Still a need to:
  - Further refine future plans for Purdue Statewide Technology
  - Review offerings to correctional sites
  - Talk with selected campuses, e.g. IPFW



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### Projected Changes between FY2008-FY2015

- Associate degree production is projected to:
  - Decrease in the four-year sector from 3,255 to 1,424 (-1,831 or -56%)
  - Increase at VU from 1,204 to 1,700 (+496 or +41%)
  - Increase at Ivy Tech from 5,281 to 7,922 (+2,641 or +50%)
  - Experience a net increase from 9,740 to 11,046 (+1,306 or +13%)

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### Cautionary Summary

- Based on FY2007 data, Indiana's public sector produced 22% fewer associate degrees per 10,000 population aged 25 years and older than the U.S. as a whole
- Assuming no changes other than a net increase of 1,306 associate degrees, Indiana's public sector would still be under-producing associate degrees relative to the nation by 10%

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
