Role of Task Force moving forward with upcoming implementation of HEA 1359	Nancy Wever, Judge Galvin and Julie Whitman are in discussions about how to move this Task Force forward with the pending work and legislation from HEA 1359. As of right now, they don't have an answer to this question due to now knowing exactly what the oversight body will look like. Julie states she believes Justice David will chair this body, although she is not 100% sure on that yet. Julie feels confident there will be workgroups formed to tackle different tasks laid out in statute. Julie will make recommendations to the chair of the oversight body for appointments to these workgroups. Julie notes there are multiple workgroups that align with committee already formed in this Task Force. Most of the members of this Task Force are in Julie's plan for workgroups on 1359, however she notes if any members have partiular interest in a specific workgroup, please reach out to her and she will add you to the list. Reminder that these "lists" are just recommendations to the chair of the oversight body. Julie reports the oversight body must meet by July 1 st . Her suggestion will be that all of the workgroups kickoff their work in July. Most work from the committees will be on a year timeline, however some tasks will have 6 month deadlines. Julie notes there a couple of subcommittees that are not named in 1359 (Violence sucommittee for example) that should keep going with their work until they have fulfilled their Children's Commission strategic plan task. Judge Galvin suggests moving forward with the July meeting. This Task Force will then have a better idea of how the 1359 oversight body will be structured. Judge Galvin notes if Justice David does in fact chair this process, he will push those workgroups for results, and that will create significant work for members of this Task Force and others on those workgroups.	 goals: 1. Executive Director Update	Julie gives update on last week's Commission meeting. In addition to Tracy and Megan's presentation, the Commission looked at how far they have gotten on their current strategic plan. They are currently engaged in an evaluation process in which they are thinking about what they are trying to impact, and evaluating what they are doing to get there. The Commission wants to systematize their process for what happens after recommendations are made to the Commission; what was implemented as a result of that presentation? Why was nothing implemented as a result of that presentation? Is that documented? Etc. Kate Shadle (sp?) from the Department of Health is scheduled to present the latest youth risk behavior survey data in June. This is an anonymous survey of high school kids. This will be the first time in several years that the response rate has been high enough to permit data to be used. The data around youth mental health is disturbing. Julie notes this is a topic in 1359 work.The Department of Health and DMHA are working on putting together an advisory group.

Dual Status Implementation Committee	Judge Mollo was not in attendance. Angela Reid-Brown reports she has not had an opportunity to reach out to Judge Mollo for updates.					
Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children Committee	Judge Harvey delivered the committee's update. Judge Harvey and Lisa Thompson will be presenting the screener tool at the upcoming Justice Services Conference. Judge Harvey reports they have recently updated the directions for administering the tool. There will be no more changes between now and when the tool is rolled out. They have created quick reference cards to give to law enforcement and healthcare officials.					
Alternatives to Detention Committee	Nancy reported the ATD subcommittee is currently inactive. Nancy did hear from Mike Gray, and he continues to be in contact with DCS about giving probation officers access to the SharePoint site. This is an agenda Item Mike continues to check-in on.					
Diversion Subcommittee	Tracy Fitz stated that the presentation to the Children's Commission went well. The group is just waiting for orders on where to go from here.					
Preventing Serious and Violent Delinquent Behavior Committee	Bob Bragg presented the committee's update. The Committee reviewed 22 programs for reducing youth violence. Bob notes that all of these programs have been reviewed by independent agencies and have been labeled effective or promising. The Committee's next meeting is in May, and they hope to bring together the research on all 22 programs that were evaluated. The Committee will then select one or multiple programs they feel would be a good fit for Indiana communities and present those recommendations to the Task Force. Bob anticipates being ready to present to the Commission in August, giving the Committee time to get feedback from this Task Force.
