2020 ANNUAL REPORT

The 2020 Annual Report provides statistical information about the work of the Court of Appeals of Indiana from January through December 2020. Our hardworking team of judges, senior judges, law clerks, staff attorneys, and administrative staff work together every day to not only complete the Court's tasks, but also teach fellow Hoosiers about the Court's role in state government. This can be measured in statistics and through examples of the Court's commitment to serve all people by providing equal justice under law.

The Court did an impressive job adapting to change in 2020. The Court began remote operations on March 11 due to the coronavirus pandemic and quickly adjusted to new challenges as they arose, consistently providing all essential services at a very high level and continuing to operate under its usual rules and practices.

Despite the pandemic and a transition to remote operations, the Court held 20 oral arguments. We began conducting virtual oral arguments in May and held 13 oral arguments via the Zoom platform, enabling the Court to adhere to social-distancing requirements. The Court's average age of cases pending was an impressive 1.4 months, a 12.5% improvement from the previous year.

2020 was a year of productive change, new processes, and continued upgrades:

- Chief Judge Cale J. Bradford assumed the role of chief judge on January 1, 2020.
- Judge John G. Baker retired from the Court on July 31, 2020, as the longest-serving judge in the state of Indiana, and began service as a senior judge.
- Judge Leanna K. Weissmann was appointed to the Court by Governor Eric Holcomb and began her service on September 14, 2020.
- The Court utilized its Continuity of Operations Planning (COOP) team to monitor the statewide changes associated with the coronavirus pandemic and create processes to allow for efficient court operations while working remotely.
- The Court created a plan for staff to safely return to the office in phases and implemented safety protocols, including sanitation, PPE distribution, social-distancing guidelines, and arrival/departure protocol.
- The Court transitioned to new, user-friendly SharePoint sites for all staff members.
- The Carr L. Darden CLEO summer internship was held remotely for the first time, still giving interns invaluable experience.
- The Court updated its website template to prepare for the transition to a new web content management system, Squiz Matrix.
- A new Training Committee was formed to educate staff on a variety of topics.
- Conference Rooms A and B were upgraded to support audio and video conferencing.


As the second-highest court in the state, the Court of Appeals of Indiana will continue to take pride in its commitment to constitutional government and the rule of law.



Pending as of 12/31/2019


