Community Based Services Highlighted Changes

- Medicaid Billing Units for use by Medicaid providers. (MRO/MCO)
- MRO services may only be provided by CMHCs
- DCS encourages providers to become Medicaid providers to provide Medicaid clinic option services to Medicaid eligible clients.
- Non-Medicaid providers will continue to be used for clients without Medicaid coverage and for those services that are not eligible for reimbursement under Medicaid.

HOMEBUILDERS® Highlighted Changes

- Services will follow the HOMEBUILDERS® standards, unless otherwise addressed in the DCS Homebuilders service standard
- Teams are defined in the RFP- teams consist of 3-5 workers and one supervisor.
- Direct workers are full time and cannot have mixed caseloads.
- Must have one member who has completed the basic Homebuilder Fundamental training provided by the Institute for Family Development. In addition, the individual must have provided IFPS/IFRS services to families for at least one year.
- All inclusive rate
- Must submit a budget

Community Partners Highlighted Changes

- There will be new Regional Budget Allocations
- 2 budgets required: reflecting year 1 and separate budget for year 2
- Collaborative network of community resources within the Region
- Administer Resource Parent Appreciation funds for the Region and collect 7.5%
- 60% of budget is for CPCS services, 40% of budget is for Other Prevention Services
- Subcontracting



Youth Service Bureau Highlighted Changes

Juvenile Delinquency Prevention

- Mentoring
- Teen Court/Diversion
- Skills
- School
- Recreation
- Shelter
- Counseling/Guidance
- Parent Education
- Only Youth Service Bureaus are eligible to apply.
- Submit 1 rate for each service/component selected.



Safe Place Highlighted Changes

- Project Safe Place programs provide outreach, temporary shelter and counseling services for youth, ages ten to seventeen, in crisis situations through a network of Safe Place sites sustained by qualified agencies, trained volunteers and businesses. Sites may be youth friendly businesses, schools, fire stations, libraries, and other appropriate public buildings that display the distinctive yellow and black Safe Place sign.
- Project Safe Place programs must meet national standards and be licensed by National Safe Place.
- SP program 5 components:

Crisis Intervention
Community Education
Volunteer Recruitment and Maintenance
Site Recruitment and Maintenance
Program Evaluation

 - ✓ Application Pages signed in blue ink.
 - ✓ Budget (as stated in RFP)
- Step 2- Total Maximum Points
 - ✓ Provider Narrative Scoring (20 Points Total)
 - ✓ Service Narrative Scoring (80 points Total)
