

JUDITH G. RIPLEY

On July 15th, 2005, Governor Mitch Daniels appointed Judith G. Ripley as the Director of the Indiana Department of Financial Institutions.

Prior to her appointment, Director Ripley served as a member of the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC). She was first appointed to the IURC by Governor Frank O'Bannon in August, 1998 and reappointed in April, 2002. Until her appointment to the IURC, she practiced law in Indianapolis.

Director Ripley is a member of the Conference of State Bank Supervisors (CSBS) where she serves as Chairman of District II. She is past Chairman of the CSBS Legislation Committee.

A lifelong Indiana resident, Director Ripley studied at Indiana University in Bloomington and IUPUI and also attended the University of Cincinnati. She received her law degree from Indiana University.

Director Ripley is a past member of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC). During her time at the IURC, she was appointed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) as a member of the Federal-State Joint Board of Jurisdictional Separations. She was also a past Chairman of the Advisory Council to the Center for Public Utilities, New Mexico State University.

Director Ripley previously served as a member of the Board of Governors of the Indianapolis Bar Association, an appointee to the Marion County Municipal Court Nominating Commission and as a Delegate to the Indiana State Bar Association.
