#### CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Meeting called to order at 10:01am by Chairman Lee Turpen. Mrs. Candice Pope called roll and announced quorum.

#### ADOPTION OF MINUTES

a. Adoption of minutes from the January 18, 2017 session.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to accept the minutes as written. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zartman. The motion passed.

## Dr. Michael Kaufmann - approval as State Medical Director

Following the departure of State Emergency Medical Director Dr. Michael Olinger, the Indiana Department of Homeland Security conducted an open application process, preformed rounds of interviews and vetted the applications. As authorized by Indiana Code 10-19-7-5 (c), Executive Director Bryan Langley has appointed Dr. Michael A. Kaufmann as the new State Emergency Medical Services Director, having found that Dr. Kaufmann meets the minimum qualifications by statute and is the appropriate candidate for the position

Commissioner Hoggatt made the following motion:

Pursuant to Indiana Code 10-19-7-5 (d), I make a motion to the Emergency Medical Services Commission to affirm the appointment of the State Emergency Medical Director Dr. Michael A. Kaufmann by Indiana Department of Homeland Security Executive Director Bryan Langley. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Mackey. The motion was approved.

#### **HONORARY CERTIFICATION**

Mr. Jason Smith read into record the following honorary certification request:

Mrs. Katie Hokanson asked that the Commission approve Elkhart General Hospital to be "in the process" level III trauma

A motion was made by Commissioner Valentine to approve the request with the clarification that Elkhart General Hospital is "in the process". The motion was seconded by Commissioner Mackey. The motion was approved.

Mrs. Hokanson reported that the EMS Medical Directors conference is coming up on April 27th. There have been 106 rural first responders apply for the Naloxone kits. If there are any rural first responders that need Naloxone kits please contact Mrs. Hokanson at khokanson@isdh.in.gov .

#### **EMS FOR CHILDREN**

Ms. Margo Knefelkamp reported that a few days ago they received word that they were awarded grant money to continue IEMSC is working on identifying EMS agency based IEMSC coordinators. They are still taking the program. nominations for the 7th annual pediatrics awards.

## TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE (TAC)

Chairman of the TAC Leon Bell reported that the TAC did meet and discussed several topics. They will have a meeting next month.

## INDIANA EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ASSOCIATION (IEMSA)

Mr. Tom Fentress reported that at their last meeting they secured the location for their office. Their next meeting will be April 26th. Their annual meeting will be June 22nd and this will be a voting meeting. They are working on the conference for this year.

### INDIANA FIRE CHIEFS ASSOCIATION

Mr. Douglas Randall the co - chair of the EMS Section reported that the Fire Chiefs is wanting to get more involved in EMS in Indiana again. Mr. Randall stated that one of the objectives that they association wants to look at is patient safety. Mr. Randall is working with Dr. Kaufmann on this program. They are working towards a culture of safety "boot camp" tentatively set for October.

### **EMS EDUCATION WORKING GROUP**

Mr. Jeff Quinn reported that they set up work groups to look at instructor course for all three disciplines, the training manual, and mentoring low performing training institutions. Their next meeting is at FDIC on April 26th.

PERSONNEL WAIVER REQUESTS The following is a requesting a waiver of 836 IAC 4-4-2 Application for original certification or certification renewal Authority: IC 16-31-2-7 Affected: IC 16-31 Sec. 2. (a) Application for emergency medical technician certification shall be made on forms provided by the agency. Applicants shall complete the required forms and submit the forms to the agency. The application shall include the following: (1) the name and address of the applicant. (2) Criminal history declarations of the applicant. (3) The name of the training institution where training was completed. (4) Other information required by the agency. (b) All applicants for original certification shall provide evidence of compliance with the requirements for certification. (c) Certification as an emergency medical technician shall be valid for a period of two (2) years. (d) To renew a certification, a certified emergency medical technician shall submit a report of continuing education every two (2) years that meets or exceeds the minimum

requirement to take and report forty(40) hours of continuing education according to the following: (1) Participate in a minimum of thirty-four (34) hours of any combination of: (A) lectures; (B) critiques; (C) skills proficiency examinations; (D) continuing education courses; or (E) teaching sessions; that review subject matter presented in the Indiana basic emergency medical technician curriculum. (2) Participate in a minimum of six (6) hours of audit and review. (3) Participate in any update course as required by the commission. (4) Successfully complete a proficiency evaluation that tests the skills presented in the Indiana basic emergency medical technician curriculum. (e) If a properly completed renewal application is submitted within one hundred twenty (120) calendar days after the expiration of the certification, together with the required documentation to show that the applicant has completed all required continuing education within the two (2) years prior to the expiration of the certification, and a fifty dollar (\$50) reapplication fee, the certification will be reinstated on the date that the commission staff determines that the required application, documentation, and reapplication fee have been properly submitted. The expiration date will be two (2) years from the expiration of the previous, expired certification. (f) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, a person also certified as an emergency medical technician-basic advanced, emergency medical technicianintermediate, or paramedic under IC 16-31 may substitute the required continuing education credits for those of subsection (d). (g) An individual who fails to comply with the continuing education requirements described in this article shall not exercise any of the rights and privileges of an emergency medical technician and shall cease from providing the services authorized by an emergency medical technician certification as of the date of expiration of the current certificate. (h) An individual wanting to reacquire a certification shall: (1) complete an emergency medical technician recertification training course as approved by the commission; and (2) successfully complete the state written and practical skills examinations as set forth and approved by the commission. If the individual fails either certification examination, the person must retake an Indiana basic emergency medical technician training course. (a) To obtain certification based upon reciprocity, an individual shall be a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age and meet one (1) of the following requirements: (1) Be a person who: (A) possesses a valid certificate or license as an emergency medical technician from another state; and (B) successfully completes the written and practical skills certification examinations as prescribed by the commission. (2) Be a person who: (A) while serving in the military of the United States, successfully completed a course of training and study equivalent to the material contained in the Indiana basic emergency medical technician training course; and (B) successfully completes the written and practical skills certification examinations prescribed by the commission. (3) Be a person who: (A) holds a valid unlimited license to practice medicine in Indiana; and (B) successfully completes the written and practical skills certification examinations prescribed by the commission. (4) Be a person who: (A) successfully completed a course of training and study equivalent to the material contained in the Indiana basic emergency medical technician training course; and (B) successfully completes the written and practical skills certification examinations prescribed by the commission. (5) Be a person who: (A) holds a current emergency medical technician registration from the National Registry; and (B) has completed a course equivalent to the Indiana approved curriculum. (b) Any nonresident of Indiana who possesses a certificate or license as an emergency medical technician that is valid in another state, or a valid registration issued by the National Registry, upon affiliation with an Indiana certified provider organization may apply to the agency for temporary certification as an emergency medical technician. Upon receipt of a valid application and verification of valid status by the agency, the agency may issue temporary certification, which shall be valid for the duration of the applicant's current certificate or license or for a period not to exceed six (6) months from the date that the reciprocity request is approved by the agency, whichever period of time is shorter. A person receiving temporary certification may apply for full certification using the procedure required in section 1 of this rule. Mr. Smith is requesting a waiver to extend him temporary EMT certification. Mr. Smith currently has a temporary EMT certification based on his Virginia EMT certification. Indiana Temporary Eff 10-13-17 exp 4-13-18. Virginia EMT expiration date 4-30-2019. No attempt yet of Indiana practical or NR written. Staff recommends: Deny. He still has about a month to take the NREMT written exam and take the practical exam.

(2) Notify the commission in writing within thirty (30) days of assigning any individual to perform the duties and responsibilities required of a paramedic. Eaton EMTS are requesting a waiver of the 24/7 rule to give them time to become fully staffed with paramedics as they transition from a BLS service to an ALS service. Staff recommends: approve for 6 months then reevaluate their situation.

The following is requesting a waiver of 836 IAC 1-2-2 Application for certification; renewal Authority: IC 16-31-2-7; IC 16-31-3-14; IC 16-31-3-14.5; IC 16-31-3-20 Affected: IC 16-31-3-8 Sec. 2. (a) Application for ambulance service provider organization certification shall be made on forms as provided by the agency, and the applicant shall comply with the following requirements: (1) Applicants shall complete the required forms and submit the forms to the agency not less than sixty (60) days prior to the requested effective date of the certificate. (2) Each ambulance and its equipment shall be made available for inspection by the agency. (3) The premises on which: (A) ambulances are parked or garaged; and (B) ambulance supplies are stored; shall be open during business hours to the agency for inspection. (4) Each application shall include the following information: (A) A description of the service area. (B) Hours of operation. (C) Number and location of ambulances. (D) Organizational structure, including name, address, and phone number for the: (i) owner; (ii) chief executive officer; (iii) chief operations officer; (iv) training officer; and (v) medical director. (E) Current Federal Communications Commission license or letter of authorization. (F) Location of ambulance service provider organization's records. (c) The certificate: (1) expires on the date appearing in the expiration date section of the certificate; and (2) shall be prominently displayed at the place of business. (d) Application for ambulance service provider organization certification renewal shall be made not less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration date of the current certificate to assure continuity of certification. Application for renewal shall be made on forms as provided by the agency. Middletown Fall Creek Township EMS expired on 10/01/2017. We received their renewal application in our office on 02/06/2018. When their certification was updated it was set to be effective on 02/06/2018 and expire on 01/01/2020. Middletown Fall Creek Township EMS is requesting that their certification be back dated to be effective on 10/01/2017 so that they can bill runs for reimbursement during the time frame that they were expired.

Discussion followed the reading of the waiver. Chairman Turpen commented that this issue has been discussed previously in the past and the back dating has never been approved in the past. More discussion followed. A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to deny the waiver request. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bowman.

The following requested a waiver of Rule 2: General Requirements for paramedic provider organizations 836 IAC 2-2-1 (g) (1) (g) Each paramedic provider organization shall do the following: (1) Maintain an adequate number of trained personnel and emergency response vehicles to provide continuous, twenty-four (24) hour advanced life support services. (2) Notify the commission in writing within thirty (30) days of assigning any individual to perform the duties and responsibilities required of a paramedic.

## Southern Ripley County Emergency (Rescue 69)

A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to approve the waiver for a period of two (2) years with the 6 month reporting requirement. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bowman. The motion passed.

The following is requesting a waiver of 836 IAC 2-2-1 General requirements for paramedic provider organizations (g) Each paramedic provider organization shall do the following: (4) During transport of the patient, the following are the minimum staffing requirements: (A) If paramedic level advanced life support treatment techniques have been initiated or are needed: (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least a paramedic and an emergency medical technician; and (ii) a paramedic shall be in the patient compartment. Spencer County EMS INC is requesting a waiver of EMT/EMT-P staffing requirement. The waiver

request is for a non-primary response vehicle; primarily staffed vehicles meet the requirement of the rule. This application is for a 2<sup>nd</sup> renewal of an existing waiver. Staff recommends: Approval.

Spencer County EMS Inc.

A motion was made by Commissioner Valentine to approve staff recommendation. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Mackey. The motion passed.

The following is requesting a waiver of 836 IAC 2-2-1 General requirements for paramedic provider organizations (g) Each paramedic provider organization shall do the following: (1) Maintain an adequate number of trained personnel and emergency response vehicles to provide continuous, twenty-four (24) hour advanced life support services. Winchester FD is requesting a renewal waiver of the 24/7 rule to maintain an adequate number of trained personnel at the paramedic level. The department currently has 6 paramedics and are in the process of hiring 2 more. They currently do have enough to cover each shift but the waiver is in case and emergency came up. They have increased their paramedic's by 3 since the first waiver was requested two years ago. Staff recommends: approve for 6 months then reevaluate their situation.

#### Winchester Fire Department

A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to approve staff recommendation. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hoggatt. The motion passed.

Pike County EMS reported their usage of their waiver. Information submitted to the Commission for members review no action required. None taken.

#### OLD BUSINESS

- a. Tables Business and/or waivers none of this time
- b. Legislative update-

Mr. Kraig Kinney gave the update. Both House bill 1180 which will give EMT the ability to drawl up EPI in a syringe as well as using the auto injector. House bill 1119 added to the POST will give Physicians Assistance the ability to sign the POST form have passed and are waiting on the Governor's signature. There have been a few changes to the suicide prevention bill, there is a bill going through to set up a public safety memorial, and there is a bill going to study group regarding diabetes through the Health Department that EMS may get involved with.

- Current ongoing studies
  - a. Superior Ambulance reciprocity process pilot study
- i. Mr. George Schulp reported on the progress of the study. There is an extension request in the packet but will put it on hold until the discussion is held regarding the reciprocity process changes late in the meeting.
  - b. CPAP use at the BLS level
- i. Mr. Chris McFarland reported everything is still in the process. Will have a report next meeting.

#### SUB COMMITTEE REPORTS

- A. Suicide Prevention work group
- a. Mr. Mikel Fort reported that there is some information included in the Commission packet for the Commission member review. The group is working on an Indiana training program. Mr. Fort is working with Dr. Kaufmann to come up with a template for providers to use for protocols and training. Chairman Turpen thanked Mr. Fort and the rest of the district managers for their passion and work they have completed on the tasks they were given.
- B. Stroke work group

- a. Mr. Stan Frank reported that there has been a template for Medical Directors to use. More will be brought to the next meeting.
- C. Air Ambulance work group
  - a. No update for this meeting at this time.

#### **ASSIGNMENTS**

a. Past Assignments

Commissioner Zartman reported that the work group met and worked on the Commission Reciprocity process assignment. Commissioner Zartman gave the background information on the reason for creating a different reciprocity process. This process is for paramedics that are coming from another state but not from an accredited training institution or are otherwise ineligible to take the National Registry Paramedic written and practical exams.

A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to accept the following process for candidates that have not completed an accredited training program that wish to obtain Indiana Reciprocity (Paramedic) to become eligible for Indiana State Licensure. Indiana reciprocity candidates not eligible to obtain full National Registry testing requirements. Those candidates that wish to obtain Indiana licensure as a paramedic, not able to meet the full testing requirements of the National Registry of EMT's, must successfully complete the entry requirements listed below:

- Take, pass and submit results of the National Registry "Assessment Examination to IDHS
- Submit a certificate of successful completion from the employment agency on the following elements listed below verifying successful completion of:
  - Current (AHA) or equivalent ACLS validation within one year
  - O Current (AHA) CPR (Healthcare Provider) or equivalent within one year
  - Current PHTLS/ITLS course within one year
  - Current PALS/EPC or equivalent pediatric course within one year.
  - EMT-P Skills validation of Competency covering:
    - **BLS/ALS Airway Management**
    - Cardiac Rhythm's and treatment modalities

    - **Bandaging and Splinting** Medical Scenario (conducted by the employer) - Utilizing the NR (OOH) Out of Hospital evaluation form.
      - **Adult**
      - **Pediatric**
  - Validation Signature of Medical Director
  - Verification Signature of Supervising Hospital Official

All documents are to be submitted to IDHS for processing of licensure.

Discussion followed. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Valentine. The motion was approved. The question was asked how it would be determined what equivalent course is. Commissioner Zartman stated that Mr. Tony Pagano would determine if it is equivalent. Legal Counsel Michelle Allen after discussion stated that anyone entering this process will need to request a waiver since it is not currently in the rules.

After further discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to withdrawal the Superior Ambulance pilot study with the passing of the new reciprocity process. The people that are already in the process in the pilot program with be able to complete the process. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Mackey. The motion passed.

#### 2. Pa, NP Nurse Bridge program

Commissioner Bowman offered the following proposal: If you recall, at the January 18, 2018 meeting of the EMS Commission, a proposal was made by a PA to allow for PA's to challenge the paramedic exam(s) as an attempt to become a Paramedic licensed by the State of Indiana. Currently the Indiana administrative code (836 IAC 4-9-2) is summarized as below. Registered nurse can challenge the paramedic course if the meet the following: Indiana RN, Indiana EMT, Document 1 year experience in emergency department or flight nurse, Hold ACLS and CPR certification, The RN may then attempt to test out of paramedic modules completed prior to beginning of that module in a current paramedic training program. The proposal is to determine if a similar pathway could be attempted by a PA (physician assistant) or an advanced practice nurse/nurse practitioner (NP). My thoughts are below: Continue RN bridge but add an appropriate pediatric course and neonatal course (PALS, ENPC, NRP) and add an appropriate trauma course (ATLS, ITLS, PHTLS, TNCC) to the list of required certifications, Add PA bridge with the following caveats, Must be an Indiana EMT, Must be a PA with at least 1 year documented/current ED experience, PA with addition of Emergency Medicine Specialty Exam, Similar courses (ACLS, CPR, pediatric, neonatal, trauma) certifications, Add NP bridge with the following caveats, Must be an Indiana EMT, Must be an NP with at least 1 year documented/current ED experience, If ACNP (acute care) or AGACNP (adult geriatric acute care) no further advanced practice certification is required, If FNP (family Nurse Practitioner) must also obtain either ACNP/AGACNP or ENP to obtain critical care skills. Similar courses (ACLS, CPR, pediatric, neonatal, trauma) certifications.

Discussion followed the reading of Commissioner Bowman's proposal.

A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to table the proposal until the May meeting to have time to clarify the process. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hoggatt. The motion passed.

- 1. Notify training institution officials their courses are not meeting EMS Commission standards
- 2. Set up a mentor program with successful programs working alongside those who are not as successful. We already have 2 mentorships in place.
- 3. The High School and Career Center educators have already started planning a June workshop to continue the work they started last year.
- 4. In conjunction with the Indiana Primary Instructor Working Group, hold a PI workshop for the sole purpose of helping instructors raise their student's certification exam scores. This will take place at the IERC in September.
- 5. Start doing site visits to those programs that appear to be under performing to provide them with necessary help and ideas to improve their product. An evaluation tool in already in the works and training for site visitors will start soon.

We in no way intend our efforts to be punitive, we just want to improve Indiana EMS education. If the Commission has further guidance or suggestions please let us know.
