## **IDHS Seeks Damage Information from Victims of Mid-March and Later Flooding**

INDIANAPOLIS – To help expedite information collection of damage caused by the severe weather and flooding in southern Indiana March 17 and later, the Indiana Department of Homeland Security is asking people who sustained losses to contact a toll free number.

The goal is to quantify losses from flooding and determine if federal assistance should be requested.

Beginning Monday, March 31, anyone affected by the flooding should provide information about damage by calling, toll-free, 866-210-1925, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday-Friday. Losses can include structural damage to homes and loss of personal property.

“Once again we need to conduct a thorough and comprehensive compilation of damage,” said Phil Brown, interim director of IDHS emergency response division. “This is a stressful time for flood victims, but, we’re asking anyone affected to take a few minutes to make this very important contact.”

Callers will be asked to provide their name, address, phone number, damage to property and type of damage the property sustained. Also, be ready to provide information about unemployment or business losses because a business was closed or damaged due to flooding. This can include employees and business owners.
